Key Findings

Section 1: Ciscomani Is Campaigning On Fixing The Economy, But He Has A Proven Track Record Of Bad Financial Decisions

▶ While Ciscomani Served As Ducey's Senior Advisor, Ducey Proposed "The Largest Tax Increase In Modern History" On Everyday Arizonans: Ciscomani claims to be a small government conservative who opposes steep taxes, but he was part of the team that tried to push through \$280 million in taxes under Governor Ducey.

Ciscomani worked as a senior advisor to Governor Doug Ducey from February 2015 through 2022, with Ducey calling him a "a key member of my senior leadership staff." Despite Ducey's claims that he supported fair taxes, he was criticized by his own party for signing a new \$100 million tax and for proposing a \$180 million tax increase. In 2018, Ducey signed a bill approving a new "public safety fee" that charged Arizonans \$32 per vehicle they owned. Ducey's administration attempted to say the \$32 was a fee rather than a tax, but its attempt to manipulate the truth was met with contempt. Republicans criticized the fee as a new tax that would eventually cost Arizonans \$107 million annually. Arizona Republic columnist Laurie Roberts criticized Ducey for attempting to mislead voters about the tax, saying, "Our leaders also, by the way, have no business insulting our intelligence by trying to pass off this \$32 tax as a fee." That same year, Ducey was slammed for proposing a tax overhaul that would have increased Arizonans' taxes by \$180 million. Republican House Speaker J.D. Mesnard said Ducey's tax proposal was "the largest [tax increase] in modern history."

▶ Ciscomani Promised To Balance The Budget In Congress, But His Home Was Put Up For Public Auction In 2014, Suggesting He Hasn't Been Able To Handle His Own Finances, Let Alone The Budget For The Whole Country: Ciscomani has copied typical Republican talking points on the economy, attacking Democrats for "out-of-control spending" while promising to secure a balanced budget if elected to Congress. Yet in reality, Ciscomani has faced significant financial trouble in the past, raising questions about his ability to handle the nation's finances.

In 2007, Ciscomani borrowed \$85,500 from DHI Mortgage Company, Ltd. in the purchase of property at 119 W. Palmdale, Tucson, using First American Title Co as the trustee. Yet by March 2014, new trustee Clear Recon Corp. had put the property up for sale at public auction. In July 2014, Ciscomani's property was sold to Nationstar Mortgage LLC for \$40,500 in a Trustee Sale. A Trustee's Sale functioned as Arizona's non-judicial foreclosure process and was typically only "possible because homeowners are in some financial crisis, such as a homeowner defaulting on their mortgage payments and the property going into foreclosure." Why should Arizonans trust Ciscomani to balance the national budget, if he can't even pay his mortgage on time?

▶ Ciscomani Opposed Legalizing Recreational Marijuana Despite Widespread Voter Support And Hundreds Of Millions Of Tax Dollars Raised For Education: In 2016, Ciscomani came out strongly opposed to Proposition 205, a ballot measure that would have legalized and taxed recreational marijuana. According to Ciscomani, "It's very important to know the truth about this terrible law and how it would negatively affect our state for generations, as is happening in Colorado. Debate generally focuses on speculating the impact of the law (positive or negative). However, there is no need to speculate about 205 because we can already see the failure it has been for Colorado (increase in accidents, young drug users, babies being born with marijuana in their system and sadly much more). We don't make the same mistake. Our children deserve a better future than one where the marijuana industry runs our community the way they want." Ciscomani later celebrated the ballot measure's defeat, writing, "Awesome victory for our community. Great work everyone!!! I do want to give a special shoutout to my three Super Women: Laura who took this and RAN with it maximizing every opportunity to speak out about the truth of #prop205." Crucially, excess tax revenue from Proposition 205 would have gone towards education and substance-abuse programs.

However, the will of the voters soon became clear after voters resoundingly approved of recreational marijuana in

the 2020 election. Proposition 207 passed in Arizona with 60 percent of the vote and once marijuana sales began at the start of 2021, the benefits of the measure became quite clear. In 2021, marijuana sales topped \$1.2 billion, raising a whopping \$196 million in tax revenue, "most of" which went to funding education in the state. First-year sales exceeded those of other states that had approved recreational marijuana. Contrary to Ciscomani's assertions and in spite of his stubborn opposition, Arizona's children will benefit from hundreds of millions of dollars in annual tax revenue for years to come.

Section 2: Ciscomani Prioritized His Own Bottom Line While The Welfare Of Everyday Arizonans Suffered

▶ Ciscomani Benefited From Pay Hikes Under Governor Ducey, Even As Arizona's Teachers Suffered: As a Doug Ducey crony, Ciscomani benefitted from the insider perks of being an administration faithful. In fact, he enjoyed at least a 15 percent raise, seeing his salary increase by at least \$20,000 under Ducey – even as Arizona's teachers suffered.

In October 2017, Arizona Central reported that Governor Ducey had given 44 of his staff members raises of up to 20 percent in his first two-and-a-half years in office. At the same time, Ducey had offered Arizona teachers – some of the worst-paid teachers in the entire nation – raises of less than one percent due to the state's austerity budget. Ducey's administration defended the raises, with spokesman Daniel Scarpinato saying, "You have seen individuals who have really proven themselves and done good work" – after receiving his own \$20,000 raise. Unsurprisingly, Ciscomani enjoyed a raise of at least \$20,000 while working for Governor Ducey.

In contrast, Arizona's teachers – who had undoubtedly also "proven themselves and done good work" – earned an average of \$47,403 in the 2016-2017 school year. According to Arizona Education Association President Joe Thomas, "It is frustrating when you see people in other sectors of public work rewarded with gigantic raises... We would end our teacher crisis if we saw a 10-12 percent raise. But we are told that the state can't afford it." At the time, Arizona's elementary school teachers were the lowest paid in the nation, while its high school teachers ranked 48th in teacher pay. As of 2022, the National Education Association estimated that Arizona ranked 44th out of 50 states for average teacher pay – and were paid well below other college graduates in the state. In fact, Arizona public teachers made about \$0.68 for every dollar earned by other workers with comparable degrees, the second lowest rate of any state in the nation.

▶ While Ciscomani Served As Ducey's Senior Advisor, Arizona Fell To One Of The Worst Rates Of Uninsured Children In The Country As Ducey Slow Walked Supporting CHIP: Ciscomani has based his campaign platform off his six years working as a senior advisor to Governor Doug Ducey. In fact, Ducey publicly called Ciscomani a "a key member of my senior leadership staff." Yet during his tenure as governor, Ducey failed to prioritize children's health care, leaving 161,000 children uninsured by the end of his first term.

In 2017, when Congress was considering renewing the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Ducey "wasn't doing much outreach to the folks who could make a difference - at least not until reporters started asking about it." In September and October 2017, "the offices of Republican U.S. Representatives Martha McSally and David Schweikert contacted Ducey's staff... to find out what the funding lapse would mean... But there was no communication from Ducey to the congressional delegation on the program's future until Nov. 1, when he wrote a letter urging continuation of the Children's Health Insurance Program."

The Ducey administration's delay in advocating for CHIP had a clear effect on Arizona's children. A 2022 report from Georgetown University's Health Policy Institute found that from 2016 to 2019, there was a 22 percent increase in the number of uninsured children in Arizona, bringing the total to a whopping 161,000. By 2019, Arizona had jumped to the fourth highest rate of uninsured children of any state in the country. The Georgetown report explicitly cited delayed funding for the Children's Health Insurance Program and poor supervision of Medicaid programming as reasons behind the increase. Similarly, the director of health policy for Arizona's Children's Action Alliance noted that most people only heard about health insurance enrollment through word of

mouth due to cuts in outreach and advertising funding. Ciscomani may be running on Ducey's record, so he should own the whole thing, including the administration's failure on children's health care.

▶ Ciscomani Claims To Oppose Big Spending, But His Business Accepted Thousands Of Dollars In PPP Loans – And A Group He Helped Lead As A Director Accepted Over \$41,000 In PPP Loans: Ciscomani claims to oppose big spending, but organizations associated with him accepted over \$43,000 in Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) money during the COVID-19 crisis – including thousands of dollars to his own business.

In 2011, Ciscomani and his wife founded Two Worlds Branding, a Tucson-based consulting company that offered Spanish translation services "exclusively for marketing communications produced by both private and public entities in our region." In May 2020, Two Worlds Branding accepted \$2,117 in PPP loans to go towards payroll for its one employee – presumably Laura Ciscomani, who disclosed earning income from the company on Ciscomani's 2021 Personal Financial Disclosure. As Of August 2022, Two Worlds Branding's loan status was "Forgiven."

Just one month later, the Torch of Freedom Foundation – a conservative leadership non-profit for which Ciscomani has served as a director since 2008 – accepted \$41,475 in PPP money. Ciscomani later distanced himself from the foundation, claiming he had not attended the May 2020 meeting where the board had voted to accept the funds. Given his own business's use of PPP funding – and the fact that he continued to serve on the board for at least another year and half – Ciscomani's argument rings hollow. Clearly, Ciscomani opposes big spending when it pays for crucial resources, but not when it benefits his own pockets.

Section 3: Ciscomani Is Too Extreme For His District

► Ciscomani Was A Longstanding Opponent Of A Woman's Right To Choose, Celebrating The Overturning Of Roe v. Wade And Vowing To Further Restrict Access To Reproductive Health Care If Elected: Ciscomani has opposed abortion rights since the beginning of his political career and has vowed to work to further restrict access to reproductive health care if elected to Congress. His positions are simply too extreme for Arizona voters.

In 2008, while running for the Arizona House of Representatives, Ciscomani went on the record saying, "I am a pro-life candidate." His campaign was endorsed by Right to Life, and he in turn promoted Arizona Right to Life's Tucson chapter. In fact, a link on his 2008 campaign website led to Arizona Right to Life's Tucson webpage, which stated, "Our goal is to support pro-life organization and causes and push for the over turn [sic] of Roe vs. Wade! Now with this Supreme Court, we finally have a chance to overturn Roe vs. Wade. We demand pro-life judges on the Supreme Court to over turn [sic] this horrible court decision." Furthermore, Ciscomani advocated for abstinence-only sex education on the campaign trail, reportedly contending that it was the only way to prevent teen pregnancy and prevent the spread of sexually transmitted diseases.

As a private citizen, Ciscomani has been outspoken about his belief that abortion is murder. In 2012, Ciscomani shared a graphic Texas Alliance for Life photo showing an "unborn baby boy... reaching out from the womb during surgery," writing, "Every life is beautiful and worth fighting for!" In 2016, Ciscomani shared a video of a 4D ultrasound from Pro-Life Wisconsin, adding, "Laura this is what our baby is doing right now! He/She is ALIVE...no question...and so is EVERY baby inside their mommy's womb."

Furthermore, Ciscomani has continued to financially support anti-choice institutions. As recently as August 2022, four of Ciscomani's children were enrolled at Pusch Ridge Christian Academy (PRCA), a Tucson-area private school. PRCA required parents to agree to its Statement of Christian Principles, which declared, "Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, including pre-born babies, the aged, the physically or mentally challenged, and every other stage or condition from conception through natural death. It is PRCA policy to defend, protect, and value all human life."

Additionally, PRCA was a ministry of the Catalina Foothills Church, where Ciscomani's children attended Sunday school. As recently as April 2022, Catalina Foothills Church partnered with Pro-Love Tucson – which offered "sidewalk counseling outside abortion clinics during the week" – to host its Prayer Walk For Life. The walk began "outside Planned Parenthood and Choices chemical abortion facility, praying that hearts and minds be changed and that women would feel empowered and supported choosing life for their preborn children."

In 2022, Ciscomani celebrated the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade and vowed to promote policies further restricting abortion access if elected to Congress. In a May 2022 radio talk show interview following the leak of the first draft of the Supreme Court majority decision overturning Roe v. Wade, Ciscomani declared, "Well I'm strongly pro-life. I've mentioned this many times before that you know that I'm proudly pro-life... I definitely want to support pro-life policies. [...] I definitely want to be... promoting these kind of policies on the pro-life issue." Following the release of the Supreme Court's official decision to overturn Roe, Ciscomani tweeted, "A historic day! I applaud the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v Wade. These policies should be set by our states and by We The People. I'm proudly Pro-Life and will always defend life as a member of Congress."

► Ciscomani Sat On The Board Of Directors Of The Torch Of Freedom Foundation, Which Ran "Biblical Citizenship" Classes And Trained Children As Young As 11 In How To Use Firearms: Juan Ciscomani has sat on the board of directors of the radical Torch of Freedom Foundation since 2008. The Torch of Freedom Foundation was best known for running the Patriot Academy, a "conservative leadership organization" that trained young people in "the basics of politicking for the right." As a three-time alum of the program and longtime Torch of Freedom board member, Ciscomani is much too extreme for Arizonans.

The Patriot Academy offered multiple courses designed to promote conversative values. Recently, it has achieved financial success with its "Biblical Citizenship" classes, which are designed "to instill the belief that America was founded on Christian values." The Patriot Academy has also advertised its new Constitutional Defense course, a "unique blend of Handgun Defense combined with Constitutional education so that you get both the physical and intellectual training." The Constitutional Defense course was marketed to children as young as 11, with the Patriot Academy website contending that "We have had multiple families join us with 11 year olds who did outstanding!" Furthermore, the Patriot Academy promised, "There is no course better that [sic] this one for preparing ladies for carrying a firearm." The Constitutional Defense course was designed to teach students how to "get comfortable with the idea of loaded firearms, keeping firearms by your bed, having a loaded firearm holstered on your body, etc" – and was hosted by the NRA.

Torch of Freedom and the Patriot Academy have rapidly expanded under Ciscomani's tutelage. In fact, since Ciscomani joined the board, Torch of Freedom's annual revenue skyrocketed from \$19,413 in 2008 to \$790,550 in 2019 – the most recent year the organization's 990s were available for review. Although Ciscomani may attempt to portray himself as a moderate in his 2022 congressional campaign, the facts speak for themselves: he plays a key leadership role in an organization that wants to arm young children.

► Ciscomani Opposed Gay Marriage, Calling It "A Signal Of The End Of Society," And Continues To Support Discrimination Against The LGBTQ+ Community: Ciscomani has been opposed to LGBTQ+ equality since the beginning of his political career and continues to support discriminatory institutions today.

In 2008, Ciscomani supported Arizona Proposition 102, a proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution to define marriage as between one man and one woman. In an interview with the Arizona Daily Star during his campaign for the Arizona State House, Ciscomani responded to the question, "Do you support the constitutional amendment on this year's ballot defining marriage as between one man and one woman?" by saying, "The traditional family is the building block of society. When the definition of marriage is changed to include relationships which cannot, by definition, serve to reproduce and replenish the population, it is the signal of the end

of the society." Proposition 102 passed in 2008 and was later struck down by the United States District Court for the District of Arizona in 2014.

Furthermore, Ciscomani has continued to support homophobic institutions in 2022. As recently as August 2022, four of Ciscomani's children were enrolled at Pusch Ridge Christian Academy (PRCA), a Tucson-area private school. PRCA required parents, students, and potential staff to agree to its Statement of Christian Principles in order to be considered for enrollment or employment. PRCA's Statement of Christian Principles included a "PRCA Statement on Marriage, Gender and Sexuality" declaring, "any form of sexual immorality (including adultery, fornication, homosexual behavior, bisexual conduct, bestiality, incest, and use of pornography) is sinful and offensive to God." The statement went on to state, "The term 'marriage' has only one meaning: the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union" and "God created mankind in his image: male (man) and female (woman)... we must affirm their biological sex and refrain from any and all attempts to physically change, alter, or disagree with their predominant biological sex."

Furthermore, Pusch Ridge Christian Academy was a ministry of the Catalina Foothills Church, where Ciscomani's children attended Sunday school. As recently as October 2020, Catalina Foothills Church's lead pastor gave an anti-LGBT sermon at the church, stating, "sex is only to take place in marriage between a man and a woman... Any other expression he (God) is saying of sexuality is sinful and it will ultimately destroy you... if you do these things you should be cut off from your people."

► Ciscomani Promised To Fight Against "Any Infringement" On Gun Rights – And Sat On The Board Of An Organization That Taught Firearm Skills To Students As Young As 11: Ciscomani is a gun rights enthusiast who is too extreme for Arizona's 6th District.

Furthermore, Ciscomani sat on the board of directors of the Torch of Freedom Foundation, a non-profit whose Patriot Academy ran a "constitutional defense" handgun training class for students as young as 11 years old at the NRA Whittington Center. According to the class description, "Whether you have never held a gun before or you consider yourself extremely proficient with firearms, you will LOVE taking this class as you learn the basics and the little known secrets of self-defense, and then practice until you've mastered them. By the end of this course, you will be able to spot a threat, present your sidearm from concealment and fire two controlled shots to the vital area on the threat in just 1.5 seconds!" The organization promised a family-friendly event, writing, "We have had multiple families join us with 11 year olds who did outstanding! We often get asked if ladies should get training with firearms for self-defense. Our opinion is a STRONG YES. There is no course better that [sic] this one for preparing ladies for carrying a firearm." If Ciscomani was willing to closely align himself with a radical group that encouraged literal children to fire guns, then how can voters trust him to keep them safe in Congress?

► Ciscomani – Whose Children Attended A Private Religious School – Was A Proponent Of School Vouchers, Dismissing Concerns That They Would Gut Public School Founding: Ciscomani was a longstanding supporter of school choice, advocating for educational vouchers over funding public schools. Since his first political campaign in 2008, Ciscomani has advocated for school vouchers as a way to give parents more control over their children's education. In fact, Ciscomani dismissed concerns that school vouchers could gut public education funding, saying, "It's not about the schools, it's about the students." Ciscomani has continued to support school choice efforts in his 2022 congressional campaign.

In July 2022, Governor Ducey signed legislation implementing universal school vouchers into law. This legislation gave each Arizona child up to \$6,400 to be used towards a non-public school education, regardless of financial means. This legislation must surely have been a financial boon for Ciscomani, who – despite earning a six-figure salary – was slated to receive a combined total of \$38,400 towards his six children's private religious school education under the new law.

Public school advocates have decried Ducey's legislation, rightfully pointing out that it risks benefitting the affluent while draining money from the schools actually used by low-income families. According to Rebecca Gau, the executive director of Stand for Children, "There's a real concern about the fact the money goes to families that don't need it... It just seems counter-intuitive for the state's goals to have a constitutionally required educational system and the goal is to create strong a strong economy and strong schools and yet we're going to throw hundreds of millions of dollars to completely unaccountable organizations." Critics complained that private schools would not be held to any academic standards under the legislation, with Arizona Education Association Executive Director Randy Parraz noting the bill would "subsidize the affluent who can already afford a private school education" while leaving lower-income public schools "still starved for resources."






However, the will of the voters soon became clear after voters resoundingly approved of recreational marijuana in the 2020 election. Proposition 207 passed in Arizona with 60 percent of the vote and once marijuana sales began at the start of 2021, the benefits of the measure became quite clear. In 2021, marijuana sales topped \$1.2 billion, raising a whopping \$196 million in tax revenue, "most of" which went to funding education in the state. First-year sales exceeded those of other states that had approved recreational marijuana. 



As a Doug Ducey crony, Ciscomani benefitted from the insider perks of being an administration faithful. In fact, he enjoyed at least a 15 percent raise, seeing his salary increase by at least \$20,000 under Ducey – even as Arizona's teachers suffered.

In October 2017, Arizona Central reported that Governor Ducey had given 44 of his staff members raises of up to 20 percent in his first two-and-a-half years in office. At the same time, Ducey had offered Arizona teachers – some of the worst-paid teachers in the entire nation – raises of less than one percent due to the state's austerity budget. Ducey's administration defended the raises, with spokesman Daniel Scarpinato saying, "You have seen individuals who have really proven themselves and done good work" – after receiving his own \$20,000 raise. Unsurprisingly, Ciscomani enjoyed a raise of at least \$20,000 while working for Governor Ducey. In 2017, Ciscomani earned a reported \$130,000 for his work as a senior advisor to Ducey. By 2021, Ciscomani had reported a \$150,000 salary.

In contrast, Arizona's teachers – who had undoubtedly also "proven themselves and done good work" – earned an average of \$47,403 in the 2016-2017 school year. According to Arizona Education Association President Joe Thomas, "It is frustrating when you see people in other sectors of public work rewarded with gigantic raises... We would end our teacher crisis if we saw a 10-12 percent raise. But we are told that the state can't afford it." At the time, Arizona's elementary school teachers were the lowest paid in the nation, while its high school teachers ranked 48th in teacher pay. As of 2022, the National Education Association estimated that Arizona ranked 44th out of 50 states for average teacher pay – and were paid well below other college graduates in the state. Ciscomani has based his campaign platform off his six years working as a senior advisor to Governor Doug Ducey. In fact, Ducey publicly called Ciscomani a "a key member of my senior leadership staff." Yet during his tenure as governor, Ducey failed to prioritize children's health care, leaving 161,000 children uninsured by the end of his first term.


In 2017, when Congress was considering renewing the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Ducey "wasn't doing much outreach to the folks who could make a difference - at least not until reporters started asking about it." In September and October 2017, "the offices of Republican U.S. Representatives Martha McSally and David Schweikert contacted Ducey's staff... to find out what the funding lapse would mean... But there was no communication from Ducey to the congressional delegation on the program's future until Nov. 1, when he wrote a letter urging continuation of the Children's Health Insurance Program."

The Ducey administration's delay in advocating for CHIP had a clear effect on Arizona's children. A 2022 report from Georgetown University's Health Policy Institute found that from 2016 to 2019, there was a 22 percent increase in the number of uninsured children in Arizona, bringing the total to a whopping 161,000. By 2019, Arizona had jumped to the fourth highest rate of uninsured children of any state in the country. The Georgetown report explicitly cited delayed funding for the Children's Health Insurance Program and poor supervision of Medicaid programming as reasons behind the increase. Similarly, the director of health policy for Arizona's Children's Action Alliance noted that most people only heard about health insurance enrollment through word of mouth due to cuts in outreach and advertising funding. Ciscomani may be running on Ducey's record, so he should own the whole thing, including the administration's failure on children's health care.

Ciscomani Claims To Oppose Big Spending, But His Business Accepted Thousands Of Dollars In PPP Loans – And A Group He Helped Lead As A Director Accepted Over \$41,000 In PPP Loans

Ciscomani claims to oppose big spending, but organizations associated with him accepted over \$43,000 in Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) money during the COVID-19 crisis – including thousands of dollars to his own business.

In 2011, Ciscomani and his wife founded Two Worlds Branding, a Tucson-based consulting company that offered Spanish translation services "exclusively for marketing communications produced by both private and public entities in our region." In May 2020, Two Worlds Branding accepted \$2,117 in PPP loans to go towards payroll for its one employee – presumably Laura Ciscomani, who disclosed earning income from the company on Ciscomani's 2021 Personal Financial Disclosure. As Of August 2022, Two Worlds Branding's loan status was "Forgiven."

Just one month later, the Torch of Freedom Foundation – a conservative leadership non-profit for which Ciscomani has served as a director since 2008 – accepted \$41,475 in PPP money. Ciscomani later distanced himself from the foundation, claiming he had not attended the May 2020 meeting where the board had voted to accept the funds. Given his own business's use of PPP funding – and the fact that he continued to serve on the board for at least another year and half – Ciscomani's argument rings hollow. Clearly, Ciscomani opposes big spending when it pays for crucial resources, but not when it benefits his own pockets.

Section 3: Ciscomani Is Too Extreme For His District

Ciscomani Was A Longstanding Opponent Of A Woman's Right To Choose, Celebrating The Overturning Of Roe v. Wade And Vowing To Further Restrict Access To Reproductive Health Care If Elected

Ciscomani has opposed abortion rights since the beginning of his political career and has vowed to work to further restrict access to reproductive health care if elected to Congress. His positions are simply too extreme for Arizona voters.

In 2008, while running for the Arizona House of Representatives, Ciscomani went on the record saying, "I am a pro-life candidate." His campaign was endorsed by Right to Life, and he in turn promoted Arizona Right to Life's Tucson chapter. In fact, a link on his 2008 campaign website led to Arizona Right to Life's Tucson webpage, which stated, "Our goal is to support pro-life organization and causes and push for the over turn [sic] of Roe vs. Wade! Now with this Supreme Court, we finally have a chance to overturn Roe vs. Wade. We demand pro-life judges on the Supreme Court to over turn [sic] this horrible court decision." Furthermore, Ciscomani advocated for abstinence-only sex education on the campaign trail, reportedly contending that it was the only way to prevent teen pregnancy and prevent the spread of sexually transmitted diseases.

As a private citizen, Ciscomani has been outspoken about his belief that abortion is murder. In 2012, Ciscomani shared a graphic Texas Alliance for Life photo showing an "unborn baby boy... reaching out from the womb during surgery," writing, "Every life is beautiful and worth fighting for!" In 2016, Ciscomani shared a video of a 4D ultrasound from Pro-Life Wisconsin, adding, "Laura this is what our baby is doing right now! He/She is ALIVE...no question...and so is EVERY baby inside their mommy's womb."

Furthermore, Ciscomani has continued to financially support anti-choice institutions. As recently as August 2022, four of Ciscomani's children were enrolled at Pusch Ridge Christian Academy (PRCA), a Tucson-area private school. PRCA required parents to agree to its Statement of Christian Principles, which declared, "Human life is of inestimable worth in all its dimensions, including pre-born babies, the aged, the physically or mentally challenged, and every other stage or condition from conception through natural death. It is PRCA policy to defend, protect, and value all human life."

Additionally, PRCA was a ministry of the Catalina Foothills Church, where Ciscomani's children attended Sunday school. As recently as April 2022, Catalina Foothills Church partnered with Pro-Love Tucson – which offered "sidewalk counseling outside abortion clinics during the week" – to host its Prayer Walk For Life. The walk began "outside Planned Parenthood and Choices chemical abortion facility, praying that hearts and minds be changed and that women would feel empowered and supported choosing life for their preborn children."

In 2022, Ciscomani celebrated the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade and vowed to promote policies further restricting abortion access if elected to Congress. In a May 2022 radio talk show interview following the leak of the first draft of the Supreme Court majority decision overturning Roe v. Wade, Ciscomani declared, "Well I'm strongly pro-life. I've mentioned this many times before that you know that I'm proudly pro-life... I definitely want to support pro-life policies. [...] I definitely want to be... promoting these kind of policies on the pro-life issue." Following the release of the Supreme Court's official decision to overturn Roe, Ciscomani tweeted, "A historic day! I applaud the Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v Wade. These policies should be set by our states and by We The People. I'm proudly Pro-Life and will always defend life as a member of Congress."





Ciscomani Sat On The Board Of Directors Of The Torch Of Freedom Foundation, Which Ran "Biblical Citizenship" Classes And Trained Children As Young As 11 In How To Use Firearms

Juan Ciscomani has sat on the board of directors of the radical Torch of Freedom Foundation since 2008. The Torch of Freedom Foundation was best known for running the Patriot Academy, a "conservative leadership organization" that trained young people in "the basics of politicking for the right." As a three-time alum of the program and longtime Torch of Freedom board member, Ciscomani is much too extreme for Arizonans.

The Patriot Academy offered multiple courses designed to promote conversative values. Recently, it has achieved financial success with its "Biblical Citizenship" classes, which are designed "to instill the belief that America was founded on Christian values." The Patriot Academy has also advertised its new Constitutional Defense course, a "unique blend of Handgun Defense combined with Constitutional education so that you get both the physical and intellectual training." The Constitutional Defense course was marketed to children as young as 11, with the Patriot Academy website contending that "We have had multiple families join us with 11 year olds who did outstanding!" Furthermore, the Patriot Academy promised, "There is no course better that [sic] this one for preparing ladies for carrying a firearm." The Constitutional Defense course was designed to teach students how to "get comfortable with the idea of loaded firearms, keeping firearms by your bed, having a loaded firearm holstered on your body, etc" — and was hosted by the NRA.

Torch of Freedom and the Patriot Academy have rapidly expanded under Ciscomani's tutelage. In fact, since Ciscomani joined the board, Torch of Freedom's annual revenue skyrocketed from \$19,413 in 2008 to \$790,550 in 2019 – the most recent year the organization's 990s were available for review. Although Ciscomani may attempt to portray himself as a moderate in his 2022 congressional campaign, the facts speak for themselves: he plays a key leadership role in an organization that wants to arm young children.



Ciscomani Opposed Gay Marriage, Calling It "A Signal Of The End Of Society," And Continues To Support Discrimination Against The LGBTQ+ Community

Ciscomani has been opposed to LGBTQ+ equality since the beginning of his political career and continues to support discriminatory institutions today.

In 2008, Ciscomani supported Arizona Proposition 102, a proposed amendment to the Arizona Constitution to define marriage as between one man and one woman. In an interview with the Arizona Daily Star during his campaign for the Arizona State House, Ciscomani responded to the question, "Do you support the constitutional amendment on this year's ballot defining marriage as between one man and one woman?" by saying, "The traditional family is the building block of society. When the definition of marriage is changed to include relationships which cannot, by definition, serve to reproduce and replenish the population, it is the signal of the end of the society." Proposition 102 passed in 2008 and was later struck down by the United States District Court for the District of Arizona in 2014.

Furthermore, Ciscomani has continued to support homophobic institutions in 2022. As recently as August 2022, four of Ciscomani's children were enrolled at Pusch Ridge Christian Academy (PRCA), a Tucson-area private school. PRCA required parents, students, and potential staff to agree to its Statement of Christian Principles in order to be considered for enrollment or employment. PRCA's Statement of Christian Principles included a "PRCA Statement on Marriage, Gender and Sexuality" declaring, "any form of sexual immorality (including adultery, fornication, homosexual behavior, bisexual conduct, bestiality, incest, and use of pornography) is sinful and offensive to God." The statement went on to state, "The term 'marriage' has only one meaning: the uniting of one man and one woman in a single, exclusive union" and "God created mankind in his image: male (man) and female (woman)... we must affirm their biological sex and refrain from any and all attempts to physically change, alter, or disagree with their predominant biological sex."

Furthermore, Pusch Ridge Christian Academy was a ministry of the Catalina Foothills Church, where Ciscomani's children attended Sunday school. As recently as October 2020, Catalina Foothills Church's lead pastor gave an anti-LGBT sermon at the church, stating, "sex is only to take place in marriage between a man and a woman... Any other expression he (God) is saying of sexuality is sinful and it will ultimately destroy you... if you do these things you should be cut off from your people."

Ciscomani – Whose Children Attended A Private Religious School – Was A Proponent Of School Vouchers, Dismissing Concerns That They Would Gut Public School Founding

Ciscomani was a longstanding supporter of school choice, advocating for educational vouchers over funding public schools. Since his first political campaign in 2008, Ciscomani has advocated for school vouchers as a way to give parents more control over their children's education. In fact, Ciscomani dismissed concerns that school vouchers could gut public education funding, saying, "It's not about the schools, it's about the students." Ciscomani has continued to support school choice efforts in his 2022 congressional campaign.

In July 2022, Governor Ducey signed legislation implementing universal school vouchers into law. This legislation gave each Arizona child up to \$6,400 to be used towards a non-public school education, regardless of financial means. This legislation must surely have been a financial boon for Ciscomani, who – despite earning a six-figure salary – was slated to receive a combined total of \$38,400 towards his six children's private religious school education under the new law.

Public school advocates have decried Ducey's legislation, rightfully pointing out that it risks benefitting the affluent while draining money from the schools actually used by low-income families. According to Rebecca Gau, the executive director of Stand for Children, "There's a real concern about the fact the money goes to families that don't need it... It just seems counter-intuitive for the state's goals to have a constitutionally required educational system and the goal is to create strong a strong economy and strong schools and yet we're going to throw hundreds of millions of dollars to completely unaccountable organizations." Critics complained that private schools would not be held to any academic standards under the legislation, with Arizona Education Association Executive Director Randy Parraz noting the bill would "subsidize the affluent who can already afford a private school education" while leaving lower-income public schools "still starved for resources."

2022: The Congressional Leadership Fund Spent Over \$1 Million To Support Ciscomani In The Final Days Before The GOP Primary. The Daily Kos reported, "Until recently, the Republican primary looked like it would be an easy win for Juan Ciscomani, a former senior advisor to Gov. It didn't happen in 2016. It still hasn't happened. After the 2015 study was released - just months after Ducey became governor - his office responded to a question about the plan by saying he had not been briefed on the details. A May 5, 2015 editorial in The Arizona Republic urged Ducey to support the idea and push the Department of Homeland Security to make an administrative change to expand the zone. Congress could also make the change. Now, Juan Ciscomani, Ducey's Tucson-based point man on Mexico, says the administration is supportive of the 'concept,' but 'we haven't yet' endorsed it." 
March 2022: Ciscomani Referred To SR-189 As An 'International Game Changer,' And 'An Engineering Marvel.' Nogales International reported, "Juan Ciscomani, a senior advisor for Gov. Doug Ducey, presented a commendation to Brinton, whose family attended the event. Brinton, Ciscomani pointed out, had been 'ensuring the safety of those working on this project.' Traffic flow. On Friday, speaker after speaker heaped praise onto the project, expressing optimism on its local and regional impact. Ciscomani referred to the new route as an 'international game changer,' and 'an engineering marvel.' As leaders recapped the challenges of the SR-189 project Friday, trucks passed every few minutes through one of the nearby overhead ramps.
