# Republican Incumbent in Wisconsin's 3<sup>rd</sup> Congressional District

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#### **Key Findings**

Van Orden Is A Danger To Wisconsinites' Agriculture, Health Care, Retirement, And Worker Safety, Supported Policies That Hurt Veterans, And Couldn't Deliver For Wisconsin

Van Orden prioritized wealthy and large corporations over Wisconsin dairy farmers. Van Orden prioritized the wealthy and big corporations over Wisconsin dairy farmers. He said "The wealthiest people I know are some of the hardest working people I know." Wisconsin Farmers Union President Darin Von Ruden said Van Orden "chooses big corporations over Wisconsin dairy farmers" and he "did not include amendments to support small farms in the Farm Bill or stand up to big corporations." Making matters worse, Van Orden failed to deliver a Farm Bill that worked for Wisconsin's farmers and families. House Republicans in 2023 and 2024 have failed to get a Farm Bill signed into law or even passed by the House, which has created uncertainty for farmers since the existing Farm Bill expired on September 30, 2023. Van Orden undermined Wisconsin farmers by comparing agriculture exports to China that Wisconsin farmers depended on to "feeding Nazi Germany in 1938," even though in 2023, Wisconsin exported \$324 million of agricultural products to China, the third most of any country. Van Orden's criticism of the Chinese Communist Party rings hollow, though, given that from March 2023 to February 2024, he took \$5,000 from Syngenta, a state-owned Chinese company.

Van Orden and his allies threatened Wisconsinites' access to health care. Van Orden wanted to remove "the last vestiges of the disastrous Obama Care," even though more than 290,000 non-elderly people in Wisconsin's Third District with preexisting conditions would be at risk of losing health coverage without the Affordable Care Act. Van Orden also opposed the American Rescue Plan Act, even though it helped 74,000 Wisconsinites, including 10,000 residents in the Third District, enroll in Affordable Care Act plans and spent \$400 million improving the health of people in Wisconsin. Van Orden also undermined health care by strongly supporting House Republicans' continuing resolution, which would have made 29.9% cuts nearly across the board, reducing 13,000 research grants for the National Institutes of Health, threatening efforts to find treatments and cures for cancer and Alzheimer's, and would have cut resources for the 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline by 38%, which helped people struggling with mental health and opioid use disorders. Finally, after the U.S. Supreme Court ruled on a question upholding a Trump Administration rule that would let employers "opt out of birth control coverage," Van Orden said, "We will work with [Trump] to protect our religious institutions from the gross government overreach forced on the American public by Obamacare."

Van Orden cast votes threatening Wisconsin's infrastructure and opposed the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, even though it provided billions of dollars for Wisconsin. After 13 House Republicans voted for the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Van Orden said they had "voted themselves out of a job" and there was "absolutely no excuse," opposing the bill. As of November 2023, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act had delivered \$5.6 billion to Wisconsin, investing in roads, bridges, broadband, water, infrastructure, and more, and secured more than \$49 million in Eau Claire County for construction and pavement replacement of the I-94/US 53 interchange to Mallard Road. The law delivered more than \$1 billion to Wisconsin to expand access to high-speed internet, including almost \$15 million for the Dairyland Power Cooperative to implement its Tri-State Fiber Deployment Project, and brought Wisconsin \$369 million to provide clean and safe water across the state and to improve water infrastructure. Van Orden undermined Wisconsin's transportation safety and infrastructure by voting for the Default on America Act, which would have cut rail inspections, air traffic control towers and transit and highway infrastructure projects.

Van Orden consistently voted against and opposed measures to help seniors, like the Inflation Reduction Act, which capped Insulin prices for tens of thousands of Wisconsinites on Medicare and let Medicare negotiate lower drug prices. Van Orden supported ending federal social welfare programs and replacing them with charity. He introduced a plan that experts said would threaten Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid. Van



Orden claimed that Democrats' arguments that the Default on America Act would hurt seniors were misinformation and that there was "nothing extreme in there at all," even though it would have worsened Social Security and Medicare assistance wait times for 1.4 million Wisconsin seniors and cut Social Security Administration employees by more than half. Van Orden also strongly backed House Republicans' continuing resolution which could have forced 240 Social Security field offices to close or shorten hours and would have robbed 1 million seniors of Meals on Wheels. The continuing resolution contained 29.9% cuts nearly across the board and Van Orden criticized the 21 Republicans who "voted with every Democrat in the House" against it after it did not pass. Van Orden also opposed the Inflation Reduction Act, even though it capped insulin prices for tens of thousands of Wisconsinites on Medicare and let Medicare negotiate lower drug prices with drug companies.

Van Orden backed policies that would have hurt veterans. Van Orden voted for the Default on America Act, even though the Department of Veterans Affairs and approximately two dozen veterans' groups raised concerns over the impacts it would have on veterans. Van Orden claimed the VA was "fearmongering," that Democrats' arguments that it would hurt veterans were misinformation, and that there was "nothing extreme" in the bill. He inaccurately said that House Republicans were not cutting funds for veterans, but under House Republicans' legislation, the VA said it would face a 22% cut for fiscal year 2024 and be forced to cut staff and offer fewer medical treatments and job training services. However, Van Orden said if the VA or Transportation Secretaries want to "prioritize the bureaucracy over the safety of the rails or the medical care for our veterans, that's on them, not me." Van Orden also opposed legislation to help military spouses. Rep. Chris Deluzio introduced a bill to provide military spouses with employment protections similar to those of activated guard and reserve troops returning to civilian jobs. Surveys showed that military spouses had an unemployment rate above 20% for more than 10 years, and the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States backed Deluzio's bill. However, Van Orden asked about potential waste, fraud, and abuse and said, "we have to balance fiscal responsibility with also making sure the civil liberties of individual companies are not violated." Van Orden backed Republicans' partisan Military Construction, Veterans Affairs funding bill, which made cuts to military construction by \$1.5 billion.

Van Orden supported massive cuts to programs children and their families relied upon. Van Orden voted for the Default on America Act, which was bad for Wisconsin families and would take away Head Start slots, access to childcare, and rental assistance. He also voted for a continuing resolution with nearly 30% cuts across the board and criticized 21 Republicans who "voted with every Democrat in the House" against it, even though it would have cut key programs that children and their families relied upon. Those cuts would have led to 290,000 children losing access to Head Start, less food for children, families, and seniors, increased food prices by threatening food safety and supply, 250,000 children losing access to childcare, 3.2 million women, infants, and children losing nutrition assistance through the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children and a 74% cut to the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program, which nearly 195,000 Wisconsinites used to heat their homes during the winter. Van Orden also agreed with someone who called the American Rescue Plan Act's child tax credit "bullshit," even though it cut child poverty almost in half; the bill also supported childcare for up to 289,000 Wisconsin children.

Van Orden cast votes that threatened public safety. Van Orden voted for the Default on America Act, which cut \$17 billion in funding for public safety, threatened nearly 30,000 law enforcement jobs and cut nearly \$1 billion in grants for state and local law enforcement. He also voted for a continuing resolution with 29.9% cuts nearly across the board and criticized 21 Republicans who "voted with every Democrat in the House" against Republicans' continuing resolution. However, the continuing resolution would have defunded the police by cutting nearly 1,000 ATF agents, 12,500 FBI personnel (including agents), 2,215 prosecutors, and 500 local law enforcement members.

In January 2024, Van Orden voted to shut down the government, which would have had devastating consequences for Wisconsinites. In January 2024, Van Orden voted against a continuing resolution to keep the government open, even though a government shutdown would have forced American troops and law enforcement officers to stay on the job without being paid and potentially curtail military recruiting and training. In September 2023, the Department of Homeland Security said 72% of its workforce would have to work without pay if the government shutdown, including 19,000 border patrol agents and 25,000 field operations officers.



Van Orden used the border as a political football and did nothing to improve the situation. Van Orden had a chance to help pass what would have been the strongest border legislation ever, but said that he would "have no part of it," even though passing the bipartisan Senate border bill would improve the asylum screening standard to "ensure that only migrants with legitimate asylum claims" are approved, give the Secretary of Homeland Security the right to determine eligibility of parole "on a case-by-case basis," create "a new removal authority" out of courts to remove illegal immigrants, close loopholes found in parole, and end "catch-and-release." Ultimately, Republicans backed out of the bipartisan border security bill at Trump's request. Van Orden voted for the Default on America Act, which cut billions from Customs and Border Protection and Immigration and Customs Enforcement.

**Van Orden was an anti-choice extremist.** In 2020, Van Orden opposed exceptions to abortion bans for victims of rape or incest. He backed the overturning of *Roe v. Wade* and said that life began at conception, a principle that was commonly understood to ban abortion with no exceptions. He voted for appropriations bills with anti-choice riders. Van Orden said, "My first job is to make sure I do everything I can to defund Planned Parenthood and other associated organizations," and "I'm 100% pro-life and if I get a 0% rating from Planned Parenthood and a 0% rating from NARAL I've run a successful political campaign."

Van Orden consistently opposed labor. In 2023, Van Orden had a 10% score on the AFL-CIO's key vote scorecard – some of those key votes included backing the CHOICE Arrangement Act, which would roll back basic health protections for workers, the REINS Act, which would cause delays in issuing crucial worker protections, and the "Separation of Powers Restoration Act Of 2023," which "could jeopardize public health, safety and financial security."

Van Orden opposed helping cities, towns, and small businesses throughout Wisconsin through the American Rescue Plan Act, even though a consulting firm he co-owned received hundreds of thousands of dollars in federal COVID-19 relief. Van Orden opposed the American Rescue Plan Act, which sent billions of dollars to Wisconsin, \$21 million to La Crosse, \$13 million to Eau Claire, and \$2 million to Onalaska. In 2020 and 2021, Van Orden listed himself as a co-owner of JIC Global, a New Mexico-based consulting firm that received COVID-19 relief dollars. JIC Global held two purchase order contracts with the Department of Health and Human Services worth nearly \$830,000, more than \$500,000 of which was obligated through federal COVID-19 relief spending. Van Orden was also previously criticized for attacking COVID-19 relief after a nonprofit organization he worked with received \$170,000 in aid.

Van Orden was a lacky for Kevin McCarthy, Mike Johnson, and House Republican leadership. From 2020 to 2023, Kevin McCarthy's leadership PAC gave Van Orden's campaign \$30,000 and McCarthy's campaign gave Van Orden's campaign \$2,000. From 2022 to 2024, Mike Johnson's American Revival PAC gave Van Orden for Congress \$10,000 and Mike Johnson for Louisiana gave Van Orden for Congress \$4,000. Van Orden frequently attacked Matt Gaetz over his opposition to Kevin McCarthy, calling Gaetz a "little bitch" and "tubby," as Van Orden angrily lashed out at Republicans who voted to oust Kevin McCarthy.

# Van Orden Is An Extremist, Insurrectionist, And Demagogue Who Has Repeatedly Acted In A Manner Unbecoming Of A Member Of Congress

Van Orden used campaign funds to travel to Washington, DC, on the day of the January 6<sup>th</sup> Insurrection, where he was on Capitol grounds despite claiming he never did. Van Orden traveled to Washington, DC, for the "Stop The Steal Rally" and while he claimed to have never entered Capitol grounds, a photograph from January 6<sup>th</sup> showed Van Orden wearing earbuds and standing on a wall on Capitol grounds, which was inside of the restricted area. Michael Fanone, a retired Metropolitan Police officer who suffered life-threatening injuries when he protected the Capitol on January 6<sup>th</sup> said of Van Orden: "The fact that he's a member of the United States Congress is a personal affront to me, because of the fact that he was there on Jan. 6." Van Orden used campaigns funds to pay for roughly \$4,000 in transportation and hotel costs around January 6<sup>th</sup> for himself, his wife, and a campaign staffer,



even though he had not yet launched a 2022 campaign. An FEC complaint was filed over his use of campaign funds as FEC regulations stated that travel expenses must be "directly related to the campaign," and he was not a candidate at that time. Van Orden said that the Daily Beast's reporting of his use of campaign funds was "inaccurate" but refused to elaborate. After the January 6th insurrection, Van Orden penned an op-ed both condemning the violence and defending his actions that day. In 2023, Van Orden said he regretted attending the January 6th Stop the Steal rally, but doubled down on baseless claims about the 2020 election. Van Orden also dismissed the January 6th Committee to investigate the insurrection as "political theater" that "abused the committee process for political gain," even though the Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol was formed after Republican leaders rejected the chance to form a bipartisan commission. Van Orden continued to amplify election denialism about more than a year after Biden was elected. In December 2023, Van Orden told Scott Presler, who organized "Stop the Steal" rallies, was present on Capitol grounds during the insurrection, and dismissed the insurrection as a "civil rights protest," that "We need you here in WI!" After the January 6th Insurrection, Van Orden accused the media of lying about what caused officer Brian Sicknick's death. In October 2023, Van Orden voted twice to elect Jim Jordan to be Speaker of the House, even though he promoted the Big Lie in Congress and sought to overturn the results of the 2020 election. In 2021, Van Orden received \$500 from Robert Spindell, a fake elector in Wisconsin and later conceded that his actions were "part of an attempt to improperly overturn the 2020 Presidential election results." After previously spreading disinformation about the 2020 election, Van Orden admitted that early voting was secure. Van Orden supported the ACE Act, which would relax regulations on party committees, shield donor requirements, and try to push states to make voter ID laws. Lastly, Van Orden said that the Wisconsin Elections Commission "needs to go away."

Van Orden had a long history of ugly confrontations, including more than one involving young people. House Rule XXIII requires members to conduct themselves "at all times in a manner that shall reflect creditably on the House" and that they "adhere to the spirit and the letter of the rules of the House." As a Congressman, Van Orden swore at U.S. Senate pages who "were lying on their backs in the Capitol Rotunda taking pictures of the building's dome during their final week at work," for which he was rebuked by Mitch McConnell and Chuck Schumer in Senate floor speeches. Senate pages were typically teenagers nominated by their home state Senators deliver correspondence, among other tasks. Rep. Pocan said after screaming at Senate pages, Van Orden gave a celebratory bow to the group he was giving a tour to, "like he's singing an opera." Van Orden defended his behavior, claiming that they were "acting in a manner not commiserate with the space." Bottles of alcohol were photographed in Van Orden's office the same night he swore at the Senate pages, which he claimed were from a gathering with constituents. In July 2024, Van Orden said everyone "but Senate pages" loved his tours of the Capitol at night. In June 2021, when Van Orden was a candidate, he made library staff, including a 17-year-old, feel threatened when he "aggressively" questioned a display in the children's library section at the Prairie Du Chien Memorial Library celebrating Pride Month and then checked out all but one of the books displayed. The 17-year-old library staffer said she felt threatened and unsafe at work after Van Orden's outburst, which she described as "very uncomfortable, threatening" and "full on shouting." Staff said that Van Orden "demanded" to know who set up the displays so that he could "teach them a lesson."

Van Orden may have sexually harassed a colleague in the military. In his 2015 book, Van Orden bragged about "exposing a man's genitals to two female officers," behavior that was sexual harassment. Van Orden wrote that he spotted two young "cute girls," had them come over, then whipped back a curtain that was covering a lieutenant's enlarged scrotum, which made them gasp "in horror." Ellen Haring, a retired Army Colonel, West Point graduate, and professor who specialized in research on women and gender in the military, said Van Orden was immature, problematic, childish, demeaning, and ignorant, but she would not call it sexual harassment if they were medical staff, as Van Orden claimed. However, she said that if Van Orden did this to two random women who had just happened to be there, it would be sexual harassment and added that Van Orden referring to the female officers, who were his superiors, as "cute girls" was problematic and "ridiculously demeaning." Van Orden wrote that he would not entertain a discussion on how his book could "be construed as misogynistic" and noted he was raised by a single mother.

Van Orden had antiquated views on gender roles. Van Orden said that the "different gender role models that have been erased throughout our nations" starting in the 70s and late 60s had "been a disservice." He also indicated



that he would prefer to have a society in which women stayed at home with their children, criticized opening SEAL training to women as a "political decision based on a crappy study," and said women having children would cause them to need two-year breaks from their service in the military.

Van Orden repeatedly engaged in offensive behavior. Van Orden made multiple insensitive comments about the Holocaust. He tweeted a Nazi reference to a Jewish political figure and compared Democrats to "the most oppressive and criminal regimes in world history." Van Orden made other offensive comments about the Holocaust, including calling a job posting to "pull 'stunts" in his congressional race to "Nazi Brown Shirts and Chinese Communist Party members." Van Orden also called Jen Psaki "Madam Goebbels," and doubled down when someone said it was "horrendous" of him to do so, saying "I know exactly what I am talking about." Van Orden has also fearmongered over Afghan refugees who risked their lives to support American troops when he claimed the State Department did not give information on resettling refugees in Eau Claire and said he would not support their resettlement if he did not get the information. Van Orden even introduced a bill to let state and local governments reject federal refugee resettlements. Van Orden cozied up to Scott Presler, when he said "We need you here in WI!" However, Presler was a lead strategist for an anti-Muslim "extreme hate group," which was the largest anti-Muslim organization in the United States and made at least 50 QAnon related social media posts.

Van Orden's behavior made it difficult for him to represent all Wisconsinites in his district and deliver for his constituents. On one occasion, Van Orden personally attacked, asked for his home address, and threatened to publish the public information of someone who criticized him unless he stopped his "Stalinist practices." A Republican lawmaker said Van Orden's behavior "was threatening everyone" when other House Republicans considered ousting Speaker Mike Johnson. Another time, Van Orden suggested that former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Mark Milley be tried for treason. After Trump was convicted on 34 counts in his New York trial and became a convicted felon, Van Orden posted an edited image of the American flag with a hammer and sickle and said "the Democratic Party has just put the United States on the same level as Soviet Russia." Van Orden behaved in an unbecoming matter other times, like when he refused to apologize for shouting "Lies!" at President Biden during his State of the Union address and joked about shaking "Adam Schiff like a bobblehead." Van Orden personally attacked Rep. Ken Buck after Buck announced he would not run for another term in Congress, calling him a "self-righteous... slipknot" and said, "Don't let the door hit you in the ass."

Van Orden was fined for bringing a gun through an airport security checkpoint. Van Orden was cited for having a loaded 9mm Sig Sauer handgun in his bag at an airport security screening checkpoint. As a consequence, he was required to take a firearms safety course and pay a \$360 fine, while he was also fined an unknown amount by the Transportation Security Administration.

Van Orden was close with Marjorie Taylor Greene. Van Orden said that he and Marjorie Taylor Greene were "friends," and he posted a video with Greene, joking about a Democratic member of Congress. They also appeared to have similar voting records; as of July 2023, Van Orden voted with Greene 91.4% of the time, and as of July 2024, he had voted with her 80% of the time, despite Greene's continued troubling behavior. Greene spread theories that the Democratic Party was involved in a child sex ring, human trafficking, and organ harvesting. She supported conspiracy theories that the Democratic Party and its allies were involved in satanism and witchcraft and backed conspiracy theories that the Democratic Party, the Clintons, and President Obama arranged murders of political adversaries. Greene agreed with claims that the 2012 Sandy Hook shooting, the 2017 Las Vegas shooting, and the 2018 Parkland shooting were staged, and made repeated antisemitic statements. She also embraced Replacement Theory as well as the Camp Fire Laser Beam Conspiracy, which seemingly accused Rothschild Inc. and Gov. Jerry Brown of burning down the forest to clear the way for high-speed rail or beaming power back to earth from solar stations in space. On top of that, she posted a YouTube video in which she questioned whether a plane really flew into the Pentagon on September 11th, 2001.

April 2023: Van Orden Voted For The Default On America Act [DOA] – Suspending The Debt Limit Through March 2024 Or Until \$1.5 Trillion Has Been Reached And Capping Federal Spending For FY 2024 At 2022 Levels With A Capped 1% Per Year Growth. In April 2023, Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would suspend the statutory limit on federal debt through March 31, 2024, or until an additional \$1.5 trillion has been borrowed — whichever occurs first. It would also include a range of provisions to limit federal spending, as well as the text of a previously passed energy and permitting policy package. The bill would set base discretionary spending limits through fiscal 2033, capping spending for fiscal 2024 at the fiscal 2022 level of \$1.47 trillion — a reduction from current spending levels — and raising the cap by 1 percent annually through fiscal 2033. It would also include similar annual cap adjustments for specified programs, including for wildfire suppression, disability reviews and redeterminations, health care fraud and abuse control, and disaster reemployment services and eligibility assessments. The bill would rescind unobligated amounts from various funds provided by the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package (PL 117-169) for COVID-19 relief, IRS enforcement, and certain climate- and infrastructure-focused initiatives, as well as all unobligated funding from the March 2021 coronavirus relief reconciliation package (PL 117-2) and earlier coronavirus response laws. The bill would expand or establish work requirements for Medicaid beneficiaries aged 19 to 55 and raise from 49 to 55 the oldest age at which existing work requirements would apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify



pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." It would also provide \$293 million for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Security Investment Program, intended to counter Russian and Chinese military activities. Among other provisions, it would prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to close or realign Naval Station Guantanamo Bay and provide \$189 million for Arlington National Cemetery, including funding for its southern expansion. The bill would allow the use of funding for the Veterans Affairs Department Medical Services to reimburse veterans and their spouses for assisted reproductive technology treatments or adoption expenses. It would also prohibit the use of the bill's funds to provide abortions, to implement a September 2022 VA rule that allows abortion counseling and establishes exceptions for the prohibition on abortions in the medical benefits package for veterans and civilian beneficiaries, to provide surgical procedures or hormone therapies for gender-affirming care, and to fly or display a flag over a VA facility or national cemetery that is not the U.S. flag, military-related or



another government jurisdiction. As amended, the bill would prohibit the use of the bill's funds to interfere with a veteran's participation in a legal state medical cannabis program, to enforce COVID-19 mask mandates, and to implement the COVID-19 vaccination program for VA health care personnel." April 2023: Van Orden Voted For The Default On America Act [DOA] – Suspending The Debt Limit Through March 2024 Or Until \$1.5 Trillion Has Been Reached And Capping Federal Spending For FY 2024 At 2022 Levels With A Capped 1% Per Year Growth. In April 2023, Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would suspend the statutory limit on federal debt through March 31, 2024, or until an additional \$1.5 trillion has been borrowed — whichever occurs first. It would also include a range of provisions to limit federal spending, as well as the text of a previously passed energy and permitting policy package. The bill would set base discretionary spending limits through fiscal 2033, capping spending for fiscal 2024 at the fiscal 2022 level of \$1.47 trillion — a reduction from current spending levels — and raising the cap by 1 percent annually through fiscal 2033. It would also include similar annual cap adjustments for specified programs, including for wildfire suppression, disability reviews and redeterminations, health care fraud and abuse control, and disaster reemployment services and eligibility assessments. The bill would rescind unobligated amounts from various funds provided by the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package (PL 117-169) for COVID-19 relief, IRS enforcement, and certain climate- and infrastructure-focused initiatives, as well as all unobligated funding from the March 2021 coronavirus relief reconciliation package (PL 117-2) and earlier coronavirus response laws. The bill would expand or establish work requirements for Medicaid beneficiaries aged 19 to 55 and raise from 49 to 55 the oldest age at which existing work requirements would apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify



pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." The bill passed by a vote of 217-215. [H.R. 2811, Vote #199, 4/26/23]

It would fund veterans' programs, the Department of Homeland Security, national security programs and disaster assistance at full fiscal 2023 levels. It would also implement nearly all provisions of House Republicans' border security and immigration bill (HR 2), which the House passed in May 2023. It would provide an increase in funding for the Defense Department at rates set forth in House Republicans' fiscal 2024 defense appropriations bill (HR 4365), which would provide for a 3.6 percent funding increase over fiscal 2023. It would also provide funding increases for the Agriculture Department and provide an additional \$220 million above fiscal 2023 levels for Energy Department nuclear programs. Among its border security and immigration provisions, it would require DHS, within seven days of enactment, to resume all activities related to "border wall" construction on the U.S.-Mexico border that were underway or planned prior to Jan. 20, 2021; require DHS to reopen or restore, no later than Sept. 30, 2023, the use of all Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention facilities that were in operation on Jan. 20, 2021; and require DHS to return all unaccompanied children to their country of origin, regardless of whether they are from a contiguous country to the U.S. In addition to provisions of HR 2, it would place limitations on the use of DHS funding provided by the bill, including prohibitions on removing existing U.S.-Mexico border barriers, transporting inadmissible adults into the U.S., and the use of Customs and Border Protection's "CBP One"



app to facilitate the parole of an individual into the U.S. It also would prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to initiate or resume any project or activity not funded during fiscal 2023 and would establish a congressional fiscal commission tasked with identifying policies to "improve the fiscal situation." It would also include similar annual cap adjustments for specified programs, including for wildfire suppression, disability reviews and redeterminations, health care fraud and abuse control, and disaster reemployment services and eligibility assessments. The bill would rescind unobligated amounts from various funds provided by the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package (PL 117-169) for COVID-19 relief, IRS enforcement, and certain climate- and infrastructure-focused initiatives, as well as all unobligated funding from the March 2021 coronavirus relief reconciliation package (PL 117-2) and earlier coronavirus response laws. The bill would expand or establish work requirements for Medicaid beneficiaries aged 19 to 55 and raise from 49 to 55 the oldest age at which existing work requirements would apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax



credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." It would also provide funding increases for the Agriculture Department and provide an additional \$220 million above fiscal 2023 levels for Energy Department nuclear programs. Among its border security and immigration provisions, it would require DHS, within seven days of enactment, to resume all activities related to "border wall" construction on the U.S.-Mexico border that were underway or planned prior to Jan. 20, 2021; require DHS to reopen or restore, no later



than Sept. 30, 2023, the use of all Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention facilities that were in operation on Jan. 20, 2021; and require DHS to return all unaccompanied children to their country of origin, regardless of whether they are from a contiguous country to the U.S. In addition to provisions of HR 2, it would place limitations on the use of DHS funding provided by the bill, including prohibitions on removing existing U.S.-Mexico border barriers, transporting inadmissible adults into the U.S., and the use of Customs and Border Protection's "CBP One" app to facilitate the parole of an individual into the U.S. It also would prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to initiate or resume any project or activity not funded during fiscal 2023 and would establish a congressional fiscal commission tasked with identifying policies to "improve the fiscal situation." 

The Default On America Act, Which Van Orden Supported, Cut Billions In Funding From Border Security

### Van Orden Voted For The Default On America Act

April 2023: Van Orden Voted For The Default On America Act [DOA] – Suspending The Debt Limit Through March 2024 Or Until \$1.5 Trillion Has Been Reached And Capping Federal Spending For FY 2024 At 2022 Levels With A Capped 1% Per Year Growth. In April 2023, Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would suspend the statutory limit on federal debt through March 31, 2024, or until an additional \$1.5 trillion has been borrowed — whichever occurs first. It would also include a range of provisions to limit federal spending, as well as the text of a previously passed energy and permitting policy package. The bill would set base discretionary spending limits through fiscal 2033, capping spending for fiscal 2024 at the fiscal 2022 level of \$1.47 trillion — a reduction from current spending levels — and raising the cap by 1 percent annually through fiscal 2033. It would also include similar annual cap adjustments for specified programs, including for wildfire suppression, disability reviews and redeterminations, health care fraud and abuse control, and disaster reemployment services and eligibility assessments. The bill would rescind unobligated amounts from various funds provided by the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package (PL 117-169) for COVID-19 relief, IRS enforcement, and certain climate- and infrastructure-focused initiatives, as well as all unobligated funding from the March 2021 coronavirus relief reconciliation package (PL 117-2) and earlier coronavirus response laws. The bill would expand or establish work requirements for Medicaid beneficiaries aged 19 to 55 and raise from 49 to 55 the oldest age at which existing work requirements would apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to



require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." The Default On American Act Cut Billions From Customs And Border Protection And Immigration And Customs Enforcement

### Van Orden Voted For Appropriations Bills With Anti-Choice Riders

Van Orden Voted For Passing Fiscal 2024 State-Foreign Operations Appropriations Including Republican Riders To Prohibit "Funding For International Non-Governmental Organizations That Provide Abortion Services." In September 2023, Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would provide \$53.3 billion in federal funding for fiscal 2024. The bill includes a \$12.9 billion offset, including \$11.1 billion from a rescission of funding from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund from the fiscal 2022 budget reconciliation bill (PL 117-169). The bill would provide \$4.4 billion to counter the Chinese Communist Party's influence and prohibit the use of funds to repay loans to the Chinese government or to support forced labor, crimes against humanity or genocide in China. The bill would provide \$3.1 billion for Israel, \$1.5 billion for Egypt and \$1.7 billion for Jordan. The bill would also require the executive branch, within 60 days of enactment, to report to Congress on a strategy to prioritize U.S. national security interests in responding to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and create new



monitoring and oversight mechanisms. Among other provisions, the bill would provide \$10 billion for global health programs, strike funding for the Green Climate Fund, and reimpose the prohibition on federal funding for international non-governmental organizations that provide abortion services. As amended, the bill would reduce the salary of Secretary of State Antony Blinken to \$1, prohibit the use of funds for the Office of Palestinian Affairs, and add language to expand eligibility for security upgrades to soft targets to include places of worship for U.S. embassy staff and their dependents." The bill passed by a vote of 216-212. [H.R. 4665, Vote #500, 9/28/23; CQ, 9/28/23]

Van Orden Voted For A Bill That Would Provide Appropriations Funding For Veterans Affairs And Military Construction But Prohibit The Use Of Funds For Abortion. In July 2023, Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill that would provide \$317.4 billion in mandatory and discretionary funding for the VA, including \$121 billion for VA medical care programs, \$166 billion for veteran disability compensation and other benefits, \$151.4 billion for veteran pensions, \$17.5 billion for military construction projects and \$2 billion for military personnel housing. It would also provide \$293 million for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization Security Investment Program, intended to counter Russian and Chinese military activities. Among other provisions, it would prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to close or realign Naval Station Guantanamo Bay and provide \$189 million for Arlington National Cemetery, including funding for its southern expansion. The bill would allow the use of funding for the Veterans Affairs Department Medical Services to reimburse veterans and their spouses for assisted reproductive technology treatments or adoption expenses. It would also prohibit the use of the bill's funds to provide abortions, to implement a September 2022 VA rule that allows abortion counseling and establishes exceptions for the prohibition on abortions in the medical benefits package for veterans and civilian beneficiaries, to provide surgical procedures or hormone therapies for gender-affirming care, and to fly or display a flag over a VA facility or national cemetery that is not the U.S. flag, military-related or another government jurisdiction. As amended, the bill would prohibit the use of the bill's funds to interfere with a veteran's participation in a legal state medical cannabis program, to enforce COVID-19 mask mandates, and to implement the COVID-19 vaccination program for VA health care personnel." The bill passed by a vote of 219-211. [H.R. 4366, Vote #380, 7/27/23; CQ, 7/27/23]

In June 2023, Derrick Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would create additional flexibilities for employers providing health insurance. The bill would allow groups of employers to establish and maintain group health plans for employees. It would require such groups to provide coverage to at least 51 employees and to have been in existence for at least two years prior to establishing the health plan. It would allow self-employed individuals to establish a group for the purpose of maintaining a group health plan. The bill would also allow employer-financed health reimbursement arrangements (HRA) to be used by employees to purchase insurance plans on state exchanges. It would also deem such HRAs compliant with requirements under current law for employers to provide health insurance coverage. To be eligible, it would require employers to offer the same HRA plan to all employees of a certain class, as defined by the bill, including full- and part-time employees, employees under the same collective bargaining agreement, and non-resident alien employees. It would also require employers to give eligible employees 90 days' written notice prior to the beginning of the plan year of their rights and obligations. Among other provisions, the bill would rescind \$245 million in fiscal 2024 from the Health and Human Services Department's Prevention and Public Health Fund, specify that stop-loss policies obtained by a self-insured group health plan or plan sponsor do not qualify as health insurance coverage under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act, and require the Treasury Department, within one year of enactment, to notify employers of the availability of tax-advantaged flexible health insurance benefits, with an initial focus on small businesses. HR 3799 also contains the text of the Small Business Flexibility Act (HR 3798), the Association Health Plans Act (HR 2868) and the Self-Insurance Protection Act (HR 2813)." The bill passed 220 to 209. [H.R. 3799, Vote #282, 6/21/23; CQ, 6/21/23]

• The CHOICE Arrangement Act Would Roll Back Basic Health Protections For Workers. "House Republicans have advanced a package of bills that could reduce health insurance cost for certain businesses and consumers, partly by rolling back some consumer protections. Rather than outright repeal, however, the subtler effort could allow more employers to bypass the landmark health insurance overhaul's basic benefits requirements and most state standards. At the same time, the Biden administration seeks to undo some of the previous administration's health insurance rules, proposing to retighten regulations for short-term plans. [...] The plans don't have to cover all the benefits required of ACA plans, for example, and can bar coverage for preexisting medical conditions, can set annual or lifetime limits, and often don't include maternity care or prescription drugs. Despite notices warning of a plan's limitations, consumers may not realize what isn't covered until they try to use it." [NPR, 7/24/23]

**AFL-CIO:** The CHOICE Arrangement Act Would Subject "Workers To Financial Risk." "H.R. 3799 will loosen the definition of association health plans (AHPs), opening the door for more employers to establish plans that evade Affordable Care Act (ACA) requirements to cover essential health benefits and participate in marketwide risk pools. [...] Too often, these plans misjudged the risks involved and have gone insolvent, leaving enrollees in the lurch. In other cases, enrollees have been defrauded by scammers who exploited the AHP regulatory



loopholes. Second, under the guise of 'protecting' stop-loss insurance for self-funded group health plans, H.R. 3799 would allow employer health plans to avoid the ACA requirement that insured plans cover essential health benefits. The policy is intended to allow plans that are unable to actually self-fund with adequate reserves to instead purchase a high level of stop-loss insurance. Lack of adequate reserves leave many of these plans, and their enrollees, at risk since stop-loss insurers often retain the right to drop the insurance if medical costs for the group begin to climb. This is not a stable form of coverage. [...] We urge you to protect working people by opposing this legislation that undermines comprehensive coverage and subjects workers to financial risk." June 2023: Van Orden Voted For The REINS Act To Require Congressional Approval For Executive Actions Deemed A "Major Rule." In June 2023, Derrick Van Orden voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would require congressional approval of a joint resolution to implement any 'major rule' that has or is likely to result in an annual economic effect of at least \$100 million; a major increase in costs or prices; or significant adverse effects on U.S. competition, employment, productivity or international competitiveness. It would exempt from the bill's requirements any rule issued by the Federal Reserve Board of Governors or the Federal Open Market Committee. The bill would allow a major rule to go into effect without congressional approval for a 90-day period if the president determines by executive order that such rule is necessary because of an imminent threat or emergency, necessary for national security or the enforcement of criminal laws, or if the rule has been issued to implement an international trade agreement. If a joint resolution of approval for a major rule is not enacted within 70 legislative days, it would prohibit consideration of a joint resolution of approval for the same rule for the duration of the Congress." The bill passed 221 to 210. [H.R. 277, Vote #265, 6/14/23; CQ, 6/14/23]

The AFL-CIO Opposed The REINS Act, Citing How It Would "Cripple A Regulatory Process That Already Causes Excessive Delays In The Issuance Of Crucial Worker And Public Protections." "On behalf of the AFL-CIO, I urge you to oppose H.R. 277, Regulations from the Executive in Need of Scrutiny Act of 2023 (REINS Act), which is scheduled for floor action this week. - ✓ Van Orden traveled to Washington, DC, for the "Stop The Steal Rally" and while he claimed he never was on Capitol grounds, photos showed him inside the restricted area on Capitol grounds.
  - ✓ A photograph from January 6 showed Van Orden wearing earbuds and standing on a wall on Capitol grounds, which was inside of the restricted area.
- ✓ An officer who helped protect the Capitol on January 6 and suffered life-threatening injuries said that Van Orden being in Congress was a "personal affront."
  - ✓ Retired Metropolitan Police officer Michael Fanone suffered life-threatening injuries when he protected the Capitol on January 6.
  - ✓ Fanone: "The fact that he's a member of the United States congress is a personal affront to me, because of the fact that he was there on Jan. 6."
- ✓ Van Orden used campaign funds to pay for roughly \$4,000 in transportation and hotel costs around January 6 for himself, his wife, and a campaign staffer, even though he had not launched a 2022 campaign yet.
  - ✓ FEC regulations stated that travel expenses must be "directly related to the campaign," and he was not a candidate then.
    - ✓ Wisconsin Democrats filed an FEC complaint against Van Orden over his use of campaign funds to travel to the insurrection.
    - ✓ The FEC dismissed a complaint filed against Van Orden for his use of campaign funds.
  - ✓ Van Orden said that the Daily Beast's reporting of his use of campaign funds was "inaccurate" but refused to elaborate.
- ✓ Van Orden penned an op-ed both condemning the violence and defending his actions on January 6.
- ✓ 2023: Van Orden said he regretted attending the January 6 rally but doubled down on baseless claims about the 2020 election.
- ✓ Van Orden dismissed the January 6 Committee to learn the truth about what happened as "political theater" that "abused the committee process for political gain."



- ✓ The Select Committee to Investigate the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol was formed after Republican leaders rejected the chance to form a bipartisan commission.
- ✓ December 2021: Van Orden continued to amplify election denialism about Biden's vote total more than a year after Biden was elected.
- ✓ Ahead of the third anniversary of the January 6 Insurrection, Van Orden cozied up to Scott Presler, who organized "stop the steal" rallies and was on Capitol grounds on January 6.
  - ✓ December 27, 2023: Van Orden told Presler, "We need you here in WI!"
  - ✓ Presler organized "stop the steal" rallies, was present on Capitol grounds during the insurrection and dismissed the insurrection as a "civil rights protest."
- ✓ Van Orden accused Democrats of fundraising off of and the media of lying about what caused officer Brian Sicknick's death.
  - ✓ Van Orden shared an article with a headline accusing the media of lying about officer Brian Sicknick's death and said that Wisconsin Democrats had fundraised off of it.
  - ✓ Sicknick was sprayed with a chemical substance during the January 6 riots and died shortly afterwards but was ruled to have died of natural causes.
  - ✓ Sicknick's mother said that he "died because of the insurrectionists who stormed the Capitol building on January 6."
- ✓ October 2023: Van Orden voted twice to elect Jim Jordan, who promoted the big lie in Congress and sought to overturn the results of the 2020 election, to be Speaker of the House.
- ✓ 2021: Van Orden received \$500 from 2020 Wisconsin fake elector Robert Spindell, who bragged about efforts to depress Black and Hispanic voter turnout in Milwaukee.
  - ✓ 2021: Robert Spindell donated \$500 to Van Orden for Congress.
  - ✓ Spindell was a fake GOP elector in Wisconsin after the 2020 election and later conceded that his actions were "part of an attempt to improperly overturn the 2020 Presidential election results."
  - ✓ Spindell said that Republicans in Milwaukee and its suburbs should be "proud" that there was decreased Black and Latino voter turnout in 2022 and then after facing pushback for his comments claimed he had done more for Black people than any white Republican ever.
- ✓ November 2020: Van Orden repeatedly spread disinformation about the election.
- ✓ After spreading disinformation over the 2020 election, Van Orden admitted that early voting was secure.
  - ✓ April 2020: Van Orden claimed that "stay-at-home voting" increased the probability of voter fraud occurring.
  - ✓ 2023: Van Orden said, "The Republican Party has to embrace early voting" and that, "it's accepted, and it works."



- ✓ Van Orden supported the ACE Act, which would relax regulations on party committees, shield donor requirements and try to push states to make voter ID laws.
  - ✓ The ACE Act would relax regulations on party committees, shield groups from donor disclosure requirements, and remove certain contribution limits.
  - ✓ The ACE Act would encourage state voter ID laws and discourage non-citizen voting.
- ✓ Van Orden said that the Wisconsin Elections Commission "needs to go away," made false allegations against it and claimed he just wanted to improve confidence in the system.

# Van Orden Had A Long History Of Ugly Confrontations, Including More Than One Involving Young People

- ✓ House Rule XXIII required that members conduct themselves "at all times in a manner that shall reflect creditably on the House" and that they "adhere to the spirit and the letter of the rules of the House."
- ✓ Van Orden refused to apologize after he screamed and swore at teenage Senate pages in the United States Capitol, for which he was condemned by leaders on both sides of the aisle.
  - ✓ As a Congressman, Van Orden swore at Senate pages in the Capitol Rotunda who "were lying on their backs in the Capitol Rotunda taking pictures of the building's dome during their final week at work," for which he was rebuked by Mitch McConnell and Chuck Schumer in Senate floor speeches.
  - ✓ U.S. Senate pages were typically teenagers nominated by their home state Senators to help on the Senate Side by delivering correspondence, among other tasks.
  - ✓ Rep. Pocan: Van Orden gave a celebratory bow to the group he was giving a tour for after screaming at Senate pages, "like he's singing an opera."
  - ✓ Van Orden defended his behavior, claiming that they were "acting in a manner not commiserate with the space" and blaming the media.

  - ✓ A 17-year-old library staffer said she felt threatened and unsafe at work after Van Orden's outburst, which she described as "very uncomfortable, threatening" and "full on shouting."



- ✓ Staff described the incident as "very uncomfortable, threatening" and said that Van Orden "demanded" to know who set up the displays so that he could "teach them a lesson."
- ✓ The teen staffer said that Van Orden was "full on shouting" and that "he kept aggressively shoving the books around."
- ✓ The teen staffer said that after the incident, she went home angry and crying, told her parents that she did not "feel safe at work anymore" and worried that people would be outside waiting for her.





One is headlined: 'MUST READ — Democratic Party Involved With Child Sex, Satanism, and The Occult.' A January 2018 post extolled Q for possessing 'obvious intelligence beyond the normal person.' [...] Greene also embraced bogus claims about the 9/11 terrorist attacks, and she has posited that laser beams from space may have started California wildfires, another baseless QAnon theory. 
