Significant Findings

In 1996, Baugh Faced More Than 20 Criminal Charges, Including Four Felony Charges, For Violating Campaign Finance Laws And Perjury, Then Made Protecting Lawbreakers Like Himself A Legislative Priority In The California Assembly

- ✓ In 1995, then-Rep. Dana Rohrabacher recruited Baugh to run for State Assembly.
- ✓ Allegations surfaced that Laurie Campbell, a conservative Democrat, was a Republican plant to split the Democratic vote; Baugh initially denied he knew Campbell personally before admitting that he did.
- ✓ Baugh failed to disclose a \$1,000 campaign contribution from Campbell's husband, then illegally returned it in cash.
- ✓ In 1996, Baugh was charged with four felonies and 18 misdemeanors for violations of campaign finance laws and allegedly convincing his campaign treasurer to commit perjury.
- ✓ In June 1996, Baugh was investigated for fraud over allegations that he allowed Adel Zeidan, a convenience store owner, to charge his credit card without buying anything and then repay him.
- ✓ In September 1996, a judge dismissed 17 charges against Baugh due to prosecutorial misconduct; the case was later referred to California's Fair Political Practices Commission.
- ✓ In 1999, Baugh admitted that he committed nine violations of campaign finance law, including failing to report and improperly returning the \$1,000 contribution and accepting \$8,800 in cash from Zeidan.
 - ✓ Baugh was fined \$47,900 over the violations.
- ✓ In 1997 and 1999, Baugh sponsored bills to allow defendants of grand jury cases to testify with their lawyer present, which then-State Sen. Adam Schiff called a "bill of rights for white-collar defendants."
- ✓ In 1997, Baugh sponsored a bill to require prosecutors to disclose exculpatory evidence in grand jury cases, which "might have exonerated" him.

Baugh Managed And Invested In A Large Network Of Organizations, Including Three That Were Dissolved, That Took Nearly \$2 Million In Federal Pandemic Relief

- ✓ In April 2020, Scott Baugh & Associates, Inc accepted \$20,800 in Paycheck Protection Program loans; Baugh had filed to dissolve Scott Baugh & Associates, Inc in 2017.
- ✓ In April 2020, Outlook Lane LLC, which Baugh managed, accepted a \$1,000 Economic Injury Disaster Loan; in 2018, Baugh disclosed Outlook Lane LLC as a "single-asset LLC that owns a rental property."
 - ✓ Outlook Lane LLC transferred a Big Bear Lake, CA property to Baugh the same day that he sold it for \$1.7 million in August 2020. Baugh also filed to dissolve Outlook Lane LLC in August 2020.

- ✓ Baugh Family Partnership, which Baugh managed and disclosed held up to \$25 million in real estate in 2018, accepted a \$1,000 Economic Injury Disaster Loan in April 2020.
- ✓ A network of at least seven companies and organizations in which Baugh had substantial financial interests, many of which were managed by the same few people and at the building where Baugh registered his businesses, accepted more than \$1.9 million in federal COVID-19 relief.
- ✓ Golf View LLC, which Baugh reported as a single-asset LLC of which he owned up to \$1 million, accepted a \$7,000 Economic Injury Disaster Loan in April 2020 and filed to dissolve in July 2021.

While Baugh Was Chair Of The Orange County Republican Party, It Was Embroiled In A Voting Fraud Scandal That Resulted In 12 Arrests

- ✓ In March 2006, while Baugh was the Chair of the Orange County Republican Party, evidence surfaced that as many as 600 Orange County residents had their voter registration changed to Republican without their consent.
- ✓ Baugh blamed a group the Orange County Republican Party contracted to gather signatures and paid per registration.
- ✓ Twelve signature-gatherers were arrested on voter fraud charges in 2006, and at least three pleaded guilty to felony voter fraud charges.

Baugh Worked As A Lobbyist And In Government Relations For More Than A Decade; He Was Accused Of Multiple Conflicts Of Interest And Acting Against His Own Political Beliefs

- ✓ After leaving the California Assembly in 2000, Baugh worked as a lobbyist for six years until 2007, then became the Vice President of Government Affairs for Strathspey Crown, where he worked as of 2022.
- ✓ As of February 2022, Baugh accepted \$16,300 from lobbyists in the DC area who worked with Strathspey Crown.
- ✓ In 2010, Baugh received a two-year no-bid lobbying contract from the all-Republican Orange County Board of Supervisors who relied on his endorsement as the Chair of the Orange County GOP.
- ✓ In 2002, Baugh lobbied the Orange County Board of Supervisors to choose his client for a \$23 million voting machine contract while retaining the Board as a client.
- ✓ In 2007, Baugh lobbied for sober living homes even after he opposed a California proposition to allow drug offenders to receive treatment at sober living homes instead of going to prison.

Baugh Was A Founding Chairman Of An Organization That Attempted To Disenfranchise Californians And Spread Election Misinformation

- ✓ Baugh touted his role as a “founding chairman” for the Institute for Fair Elections on his campaign website and was listed on its Board of Directors in 2017.

- ✓ The Institute for Fair Elections and another organization attempted to remove 3 million Californians from voter registration rolls as of 2018.
- ✓ The Los Angeles Times found that the Institute for Fair Elections attempted to disenfranchise many people who happened to have the same first and last names.
- ✓ In 2018, the Institute for Fair Elections sent more than 600,000 postcards to residents of zip codes where Republicans faced “challenges,” then urged registrars to purge voters whose letters could not be delivered.
 - ✓ San Luis Obispo county officials confirmed many of the voters whom the institute targeted for removal were military members, and said they could have been “permanently disenfranchised” if they had been inactivated.
- ✓ 2020: Tucker Carlson cited the Institute for Fair Elections’ false claims about the location of California voters’ registrations to “prove” that Orange County Republicans lost due to voter fraud.
- ✓ In June 2021, the Los Angeles Times found that Anne Hyde Dunsmore, a member of Institute for Fair Elections Leadership, was simultaneously registered to vote in California and Florida.

Baugh Praised Trump And Supported Key Items Of His Agenda, Including Repealing The Affordable Care Act And The Republican Tax Scam, To The Detriment Of Californians

- ✓ In June 2018, Baugh praised Trump’s “tremendous job” and was characterized by a reporter as a “stalwart handmaiden of the Republican agenda.”
- ✓ In 2018, Baugh supported Trump’s Tax Cuts and Jobs Act and pledged to make it permanent; the law raised taxes on the middle class while lowering them for the wealthy and corporations and cost Californians an additional \$33 billion in taxes.
- ✓ In 2017, Baugh supported the American Health Care Act, which was projected to cause 52,300 residents of CA-47 to lose their health insurance and weaken protections for people with pre-existing conditions in 2019.
- ✓ In 2014, Baugh supported repealing the Affordable Care Act, which was estimated to cost 83,000 CA-47 residents to lose their health insurance in 2019.

Baugh Owned More Than \$3.1 Million In Property As Of The 2021 Tax Year And Had A History Of Buying And Selling With His Political Connections

- ✓ As of the 2021 tax year, Baugh owned more than \$3.1 million in commercial and residential properties, including four rental properties.
- ✓ Between 2008 and 2014, Baugh bought and sold properties with his political connections.

- ✓ In 2013 and 2014, Baugh sold and bought back one of his rental properties from a bail bond lobbyist for whom he introduced a bill in 2000.
- ✓ In 2011, Baugh sold a La Quinta property to a Costa Mesa City Councilmember known for “cutting devious backroom deals” who later endorsed Baugh’s 2018 campaign during the Republican primary despite having previously chaired Rohrabacher’s campaign.
- ✓ In 2008, Baugh bought a Lenwood property with a failed State Senate candidate who was married to a former assemblymember-turned-lobbyist.

Baugh- Too Radical For Orange County

- ✓ Baugh perpetuated the big lie by refusing to acknowledge that Joe Biden won the 2020 election.
- ✓ Baugh refused to say if he’d protect same-sex marriage if elected to Congress.
- ✓ Baugh was a long-time opponent of abortion rights, saying he opposed “abortion in any form” and received a zero percent rating from Planned Parenthood.

Rep. Dana Rohrabacher Recruited Scott Baugh To Run For State Assembly In 1995. “Heightening the drama is the fact that Rohrabacher, Baugh, Ackerman, Fleischman and Schroeder are all longtime friends and allies. It was Rohrabacher who recruited Baugh to run for the state Assembly, where Baugh served from 1995 to 2000, Schroeder said.” [Orange County Register, [4/16/16](#)]

1995: Allegations Surfaced That Laurie Campbell, A “Conservative Democrat,” Was Actually A Republican Plant; Baugh Claimed He Did Not Know Campbell Before Admitting He Did

1995: Laurie Campbell Said She Was Running For Assembly To Represent Conservative Democrats. “In the most pivotal Assembly race in recent California history, at least one of the candidates is not necessarily competing to win. Laurie Campbell, a Democrat, says she got into the 67th Assembly District race because it appeared that four Republican candidates might split the vote, allowing the lone Democrat, Linda Moulton Patterson, to capture the conservative district in northwest Orange County. [...] Campbell said that she knows Baugh, whom she described as conservative, and that ‘we share similar viewpoints’ on most things. ‘There is one conservative Republican,’ she said, ‘and I am a conservative Democrat.’” [Los Angeles Times, [10/19/95](#)]

October 1995: The Los Angeles Times Reported “Rampant” Speculation That “Campbell Is A Republican Plant” To Split The Democratic Vote. “Talk has been rampant since the nomination period closed on Sept. 21 that Campbell is a Republican plant. Assemblyman Bill Morrow (R-Oceanside) told table mates at an Orange County Bar Assn. luncheon last week that Campbell ‘is our candidate,’ according to one lawyer there. Morrow, who backs the recall and has endorsed Republican Scott Baugh in the race, confirmed the remark but said it ‘was based on rumor. I have no firsthand knowledge of it. . . . Obviously, as you gleaned, it would certainly benefit the Republicans to have more Democrats in the race.’” [Los Angeles Times, [10/19/95](#)]

1995: Baugh Illegally Failed To Disclose, And Then Improperly Returned, A \$1,000 Contribution From Campbell’s Husband

Baugh Failed To Disclose A \$1,000 Campaign Contribution From Campbell’s Husband Until The Morning Of The Election. “Baugh, a Huntington Beach attorney who was chosen Tuesday to replace recalled Assemblywoman Doris Allen, acknowledged in campaign documents filed Tuesday that he failed for several months to report a \$1,000 contribution from Campbell’s husband. Baugh did not disclose the contribution from Rick Campbell in three previous state-required campaign finance reports filed between the time he received the money and Tuesday, when he wrote that it had been ‘inadvertently omitted.’” [Los Angeles Times, [12/1/95](#)]

Baugh Then Illegally Returned The \$1,000 Contribution In Cash. “Newly elected Republican Assemblyman Scott Baugh acknowledged through his lawyer Wednesday that he personally returned in cash a \$1,000 contribution from the husband of onetime Democratic challenger Laurie Campbell. [...] It is illegal in California for a campaign to receive or make any payments in excess of \$100 in cash, according to a spokesman for the Fair Political Practices Commission. ‘Baugh does not know what’s in (the envelope),’ Brower said. ‘He does not think, ask or know, or pay any attention to the contents of the envelope.’” [Los Angeles Times, [12/7/95](#)]

November 1995: Baugh Refused To Speak With The Orange County DA About His Campaign Finances

Ten Days Before The 1995 Election, Baugh Would Only Speak To Orange District Attorney Investigators For 15 Minutes, And Refused To Say Whether Campbell Supported His Candidacy Before Entering The Race. “Baugh’s first brush with district attorney’s investigators was tense when they appeared at his door at 7:40 a.m. on a Saturday 10 days before the November election. After first inviting investigators into his Huntington Beach home, Baugh changed his mind when they brought up the subject of Campbell. ‘Baugh said he had guests in the house and wanted to take a shower before being interviewed,’ the investigators wrote. ‘He asked us to wait outside so we waited on his front porch.’ Twenty minutes later, Baugh came back outside, dressed in the same clothes as before, with no sign he had taken a shower. He said he had a debate scheduled for later in the day and didn’t have time for an interview. After investigators persisted, he agreed to talk for 15 minutes standing outside the front door while people and cars passed by. [...] When Baugh was asked if Campbell supported him before she announced her own candidacy, Baugh cut the interview off, saying the 15 minutes were up. After calling him throughout the weekend and Monday, without success, investigators finally heard back from Baugh a week before the special election.” [Los Angeles Times, [3/24/96](#)]

1996: Baugh Was Charged With Four Felonies And 18 Misdemeanors After Investigators Discovered The Plot To Recruit A Democratic Spoiler Candidate To Swing The Election

Laurie Campbell, The Democratic Spoiler Candidate, Testified That Baugh Was Also A Part Of The Scheme To Recruit A Democratic Spoiler Candidate To Swing The Election. “Baugh (R-Huntington Beach) also was instrumental in recruiting a longtime friend to run as a Democrat last year in the hope of siphoning support from a Democratic rival of Baugh’s in a Nov. 28 special election, according to an investigator’s affidavit filed in support of a search warrant. Prosecutors back up this claim with pages of testimony from the former decoy Democratic candidate, Laurie Campbell, who contends that Baugh was involved in the plan from the very beginning. Campbell said Baugh had conversations with her about ‘diluting the Democratic vote’ and about paying her legal bills when the plot went sour, according to a district attorney’s investigator.” [Los Angeles Times, [3/22/96](#)]

1996: Baugh Was Charged With Four Felonies, Including Filing False Campaign Finance Reports And Convincing His Treasurer To Commit Perjury, And 18 Misdemeanors After The 1995 Special Election.

“Investigators later discovered that Republican aides for Rohrabacher and Pringle had hurriedly arranged for Campbell, a legal secretary who once worked with Baugh at a Sacramento law firm, to file nomination papers. Three of the aides involved recently pleaded guilty to election fraud. Last Thursday, Baugh, Carmony and Baugh's chief of staff were indicted by the Orange County Grand Jury. Baugh was charged with four felonies for allegedly filing false campaign reports and convincing his former treasurer to commit perjury. He also was charged with 18 misdemeanors. He faces up to seven years in state prison if convicted.” [Los Angeles Times, [3/27/96](#)]

- **In Addition To Charges Related To The Plot Involving Campbell, Baugh Was Charged With Misreporting Or Attempting To Conceal Tens Of Thousands In Campaign Contributions And Loans.** “Baugh already faces trial Aug. 26 on four felony and 18 misdemeanor counts for allegedly concealing or misreporting tens of thousands of dollars in campaign contributions and loans, and persuading his campaign treasurer to lie under oath about the source of some campaign funds. One of the misdemeanor counts involves a cash contribution from Zeidan.” [Los Angeles Times, [6/19/96](#)]
- **Among The Allegedly Illegal Contributions Was An \$8,800 Cash Contribution From Baugh’s Friend, Adel Zeidan, Who Operated A Convenience Store.** “Assemblyman Scott Baugh charged \$15,010 on his credit cards last year in an allegedly fraudulent scheme with a close friend who owns a convenience market near Baugh’s home, according to court papers filed by the Orange County district attorney’s office Tuesday. 1997: Rep. Rohrabacher’s Wife, Rhonda, Who Was Also Implicated In The Crime, Pleaded Guilty To Two Felonies In The Spoiler Plot To Win Baugh’s Election

Rhonda Rohrabacher, Wife Of Dana Rohrabacher, Pleaded Guilty To Two Felony Charges For Recruiting And Placing A Decoy Candidate On A Ballot To Split The Democratic Vote And Ensure Baugh’s Victory. “Rather than face retrial for her part in an alleged scheme to help state Assemblyman Scott R. Baugh win election two years ago, GOP activist Rhonda Carmony pleaded guilty Thursday to two felony charges, which were immediately reduced to misdemeanors. Carmony, 27, the wife of Rep. Dana Rohrabacher (R-Huntington Beach), was sentenced to three years of probation and 300 hours of community service and was fined \$2,800. Carmony, who is her husband’s campaign manager, also pledged not to contact voters or engage in other electoral activities unless it is on behalf of Rohrabacher. Carmony helped recruit and place on the ballot a decoy candidate to split the Democratic vote and ensure the election of Baugh, a Rohrabacher protégé, to the Assembly in 1995, according to testimony in her June trial. June 1996: Orange County Prosecutors Investigated Whether Baugh’s Illegal Campaign Contributions Were Connected To Credit Card Fraud; Baugh Accused Them Of Political Harassment

June 1996: Orange County Prosecutors Reportedly Began Investigating Whether Baugh’s Illegal Campaign Contributions Were Connected To A Credit Card Fraud Scheme. “Orange County prosecutors are looking into possible credit card fraud in connection with their investigation into Assemblyman Scott Baugh, it was reported today. But a prosecutor said his office's probe is still in the information- gathering stage, and actions being investigated are puzzling.” [City News Service, 6/19/96]

- **Search Warrant Affidavits Alleged Baugh Allowed Adel Zeidan, A Convenience Store Owner, To Process \$12,510 In Charges On Baugh's Credit Card As If He Purchased Merchandise, Then Repaid Him Personally.** “According to search warrant affidavits, the District Attorney's Office is looking at whether Baugh, R-Huntington Beach, allowed Adel Zeidan to draw money from Baugh's credit cards in June 1995, the Orange County Register reported. Zeidan, the owner of Ocean Pacific Market near Baugh's home, is a contributor whose loan to Baugh's campaign during the Doris Allen recall forms the basis of a misdemeanor charge the freshman assemblyman already faces. According to the affidavit, Zeidan processed six credit card charges totalling \$12,510, then paid the bills within two months.” [City News Service, 6/19/96]
- **Affidavits Alleged Zeidan And Baugh Illegally Processed Credit Card Charges Without Providing Goods Or Services And Conspired To Break The Law, Which Was A Felony.** “The affidavit signed by investigator Randy Sorley alleges the credit- card transactions violated a civil law that prohibits retailer credit-card cash advances without proof of goods and services exchanged. It also alleges that Zeidan and Baugh conspired to break the law, a felony, according to the Register.” [City News Service, 6/19/96]
- **Baugh Claimed The Investigation Was Part Of A “Systematic And Insidious Effort” To Harass Him.** “Baugh called the investigation another example of harassment against him. He told the Los Angeles Times that the probe into the transactions is a systematic and insidious effort” to harass him and his supporters. The assemblyman, who was in Sacramento, said prosecutors are trying to strong-arm Zeidan in hopes of persuading him to testify against Baugh in the campaign finance case in which he has been indicted on four felonies and 18 misdemeanors alleging campaign misreporting in the November election. No charges have been filed in connection with the latest probe.” [City News Service, 6/19/96]

June 1996: Zeidan Had Already Admitted In Grand Jury Testimony That He Illegally Contributed \$8,800 In Cash To Baugh's Assembly Campaign. “Assemblyman Scott Baugh charged \$15,010 on his credit cards last year in an allegedly fraudulent scheme with a close friend who owns a convenience market near Baugh's home, according to court papers filed by the Orange County district attorney's office Tuesday. Baugh Sponsored Two Bills That Would Allow The Target Of A Grand Jury To Have Their Lawyer Present, To Protect Them While Having “His Side Of The Story Heard”

1997: Baugh Sponsored A Bill That Would Allow Grand Jury Witnesses Or Defendants To Have Lawyers Present During Their Testimony. “Call it a case of legislation imitating life, or personal motivation being the best there is, but Assemblyman Scott Baugh (R-Huntington Beach) hopes to create a new law that grew out of his own experience of being indicted. Baugh’s bill would allow potential defendants or witnesses to be accompanied by lawyers when they go before a grand jury. Under California law, no such privilege exists, and Baugh says the deck is stacked. Baugh submitted the bill to the Assembly’s legislative council Thursday. Within a few months, it could become law while its author continues his own struggle against Orange County Dist. Atty. Michael Capizzi, who accuses Baugh of campaign fraud. [...] Legislative sources said Thursday the bill could make strange bedfellows of Baugh and some of his fiercest adversaries--liberal Democrats. They will no doubt support a bill that seeks to protect and uphold defendants’ rights. Arnold Schwarzenegger considers whether to sign a bill that could save the county’s only public-broadcast television station, attention has centered on behind-the-scenes lobbying to derail legislation that would keep the station as a PBS affiliate. The lobbying raised some questions because it was led by county GOP chief Scott Baugh on behalf of Texas-based televangelist network Daystar Television. [...] Baugh declined to comment. 

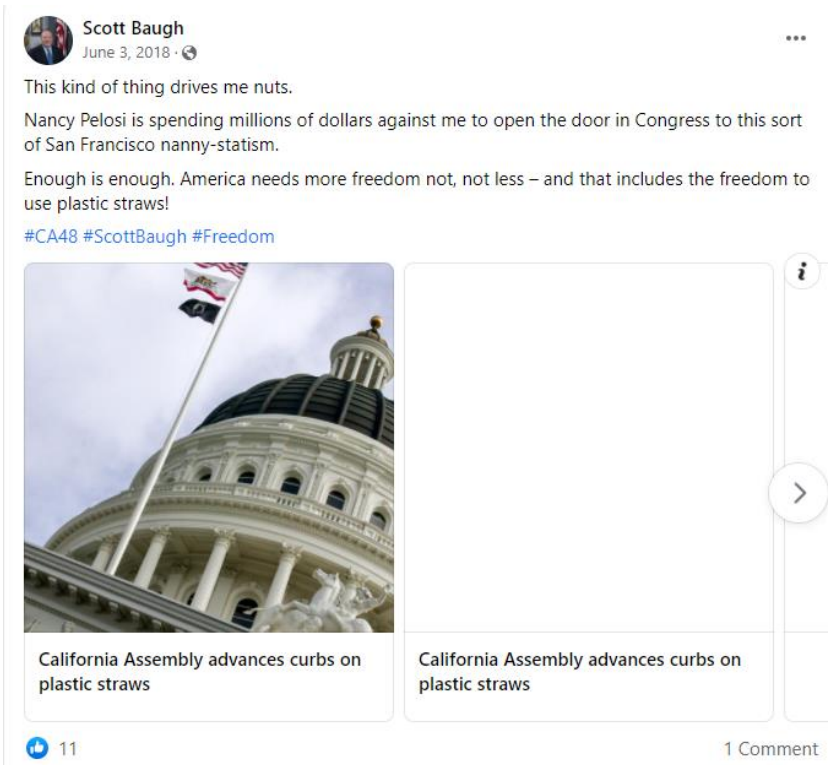

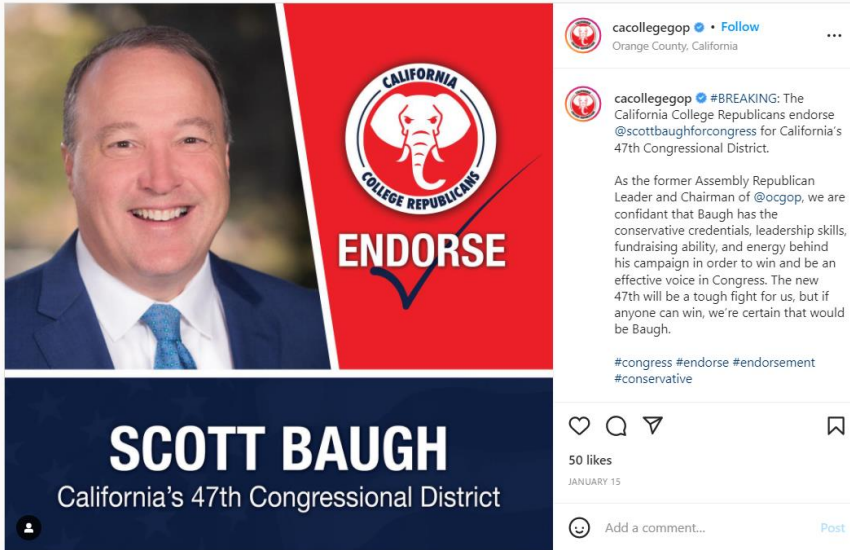
