Kiggans Claimed She And Marjorie Taylor Greene, Who Wants A National Abortion Ban, "Want The Same Things"

- Kiggans said that she and Marjorie Taylor Greene "want the same things."
- Greene wanted to ban abortion nationally and embraced extreme rhetoric on abortion.
 - o Marjorie Taylor Greene said, "Reproductive freedom is baby murder, not a right," and called the overturning of Roe V. Wade a "miracle."

Kiggans Supported Mike Johnson, An Anti-Abortion Extremist, As Speaker Of The House

- Kiggans supported Mike Johnson in his race to become Speaker of the House.
- Kiggans received multiple political contributions from Mike Johnson totaling \$4,000.
 - o 2022: Kiggans received a political contribution from Mike Johnson of \$2,000 in her 2022 Congressional Campaign.
 - 2023: Kiggans received political contributions from Mike Johnson's Leadership PAC totaling \$2,000 in her 2023 Congressional Campaign.
- Mike Johnson was an anti-abortion extremist who wanted to ban abortion with no exceptions.

When Kiggans Was A State Senator, She Voted Against Abortion Access And Held Extreme Stances On Abortion

- Kiggans voted against allowing nurse practitioners to perform abortions and against repealing Virginia's ultrasound requirement and TRAP restriction on abortion clinics. Kiggans called her stance against Senate Bill 733 a fight for "people who can't speak for themselves."
- Kiggans voted against including abortion in Virginia insurance plans offered through the health benefits exchange.



- Kiggans called efforts to influence pregnant women, like an ultrasound requirement and 24-hour waiting period, educational components to advocate for the fetus and said they did not take away quality healthcare.
- 2020: Kiggans said, "I reaffirm my position against the harmful expansion of abortion access and stand by my statement that they are not in the best interest of women nor women's health."

Kiggans Had, On Numerous Occasions, Made Extreme Comments On Abortion

- Kiggans compared abortion to a nose job, saying, "If I wanted to get a Hollywood nose job in California, I do not expect the Navy to pay for my travel expenses to get there."
- Kiggans compared abortion to a "shiny object" in a radio interview.
- 2021: Kiggans: "I am proud to be an advocate for life at all stages from conception until natural death."
- As a Senator and Nurse Practitioner, Kiggans said that abortion was "not in the best interest of women nor women's health."

Kiggans Applauded The End Of Roe, Was "100%, Unapologetically Pro-Life", And Was Endorsed By The Anti-Choice Susan B. Anthony List

- Kiggans said she "applauds the decision to overturn Roe."
- Kiggans said, "100%, unapologetically pro-life." And had attended the National March For Life "on numerous occasions."
- Kiggans said she was "honored" to announce the Susan B. Anthony endorsement and reiterated, "The fight for life motivated me to run for the first time for state office in 2019."
 - Susan B Anthony Pro-Life America is an extreme anti-abortion group whose mission is to end abortion, supported criminal penalties for doctors who provide abortion, opposed contraception and argues that it "alters human behavior," and had a president who said exceptions for rape and incest are "just wrong."
- Kiggans received \$5,500 from pro-life groups in 2022.
 - o 2022: Kiggans received \$2,500 from Susan B. Anthony List Action PAC.
 - o 2022: Kiggans received \$2,000 from National Pro-Life Alliance PAC.

Kiggans Praised And Helped Fundraise For A Mobile Crisis Pregnancy Center That Used Misinformation To Prevent Women From Seeking Abortions

- July 2019: Kiggans attended a fundraiser for Hope 4 Life & stated the center did "a wonderful job supporting women in unexpected pregnancies."
- Hope 4 Life was a "mobile pregnancy resource center" that parked near Planned Parenthood clinics in Virginia Beach to "encourage [women] to carry their babies to term."
- Hope 4 Life Referred individuals to Crisis Pregnancy Center of Tidewater, which was criticized by NARAL for spreading medical falsehoods that put pregnant women at risk.



• Crisis Pregnancy Centers, like Hope 4 Life, aimed to keep women from having an abortion & were criticized for deceptive practices, racist assumptions, and misleading women with false medical information on sexual and reproductive health topics.

Kiggans Said She Was "Not Here To Make Abortion Illegal. I'm Not Here To Ban Abortion." "Kiggans said in an interview that the ads were a lie. She said she supports exceptions to abortion restrictions for rape, incest and the life of



the mother, and, regarding a nationwide ban, 'I'm not here to make abortion illegal. I'm not here to ban abortion.' She later went on a radio show and accused Democrats of using abortion as a 'shiny object' to distract voters from other issues such as the economy and inflation — prompting more attacks from Luria, who called the comment 'insulting to women everywhere.'" Kiggans Voted For The Military Construction-VA Appropriations Bill, Which Included A Prohibition Of Abortions At VA Medical Centers

Kiggans Voted For The Military Construction-VA Appropriations Bill, Which Included A Prohibition Of Abortions At VA Medical Centers. In July 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill that would, [...] also prohibit the use of the bill's funds to provide abortions, to implement a September 2022 VA rule that allows abortion counseling and establishes exceptions for the prohibition on abortions in the medical benefits package for veterans and civilian beneficiaries, to provide surgical procedures or hormone therapies for gender-affirming care, and to fly or display a flag over a VA facility or national cemetery that is not the U.S. flag, military-related or another government jurisdiction. As amended, the bill would prohibit the use of the bill's funds to interfere with a veteran's participation in a legal state medical cannabis program, to enforce COVID-19 mask mandates, and to implement the COVID-19 vaccination program for VA health care personnel." The Bill was passed by a vote of 219-211. [H.R 4366, Vote #380, 7/26/23; CQ, 7/27/23]

Kiggans Voted For The State-Foreign Operations Appropriations That Would Further Restrict Abortion By Prohibiting "Federal Funding For International Non-Governmental Organizations That Provide Abortion Services"

Kiggans Voted For Passing Fiscal 2024 State-Foreign Operations Appropriations That Would Further Restrict Abortion By Prohibiting "Federal Funding For International Non-Governmental Organizations That Provide Abortion Services." In September 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would provide \$53.3 billion in federal funding for fiscal 2024. The bill includes a \$12.9 billion offset, including \$11.1 billion from a rescission of funding from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund from the fiscal 2022 budget reconciliation bill (PL 117-169). The bill would provide \$4.4 billion to counter the Chinese Communist Party's influence and prohibit the use of funds to repay loans to the Chinese government or to support forced labor, crimes against humanity or genocide in China. The bill would provide \$3.1 billion for Israel, \$1.5 billion for Egypt and \$1.7 billion for Jordan. The bill would also require the executive branch, within 60 days of enactment, to report to Congress on a strategy to prioritize U.S. national security interests in responding to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, and create new monitoring and oversight mechanisms. Among other provisions, the bill would provide \$10 billion for global health programs, strike funding for the Green Climate Fund, and reimpose the prohibition on federal funding for international non-governmental organizations that provide abortion services. As amended, the bill would reduce the salary of Secretary of State Antony Blinken to \$1, prohibit the use of funds for the Office of Palestinian Affairs, and add language to expand eligibility for security upgrades to soft targets to include places of worship for U.S. embassy staff and their dependents." Kiggans Voted To Restrict Abortion Access For Military Personnel In The Annual Defense Bill. "Representative Jen Kiggans, a minivan-driving mom and Navy veteran, narrowly won election last year in her suburban Virginia swing district after a fiercely competitive race that focused on her opposition to abortion rights. The issue remains a top priority for voters in her district, and appearing too extreme on it could make her vulnerable again when she faces re-election in 2024. But Ms. Kiggans was one of dozens of Republicans from competitive districts who voted this week to support adding a bevy of deeply partisan restrictions to the annual defense policy bill, including one that would reverse a Pentagon policy aimed at preserving access to abortion services for military personnel, no matter where they are stationed." Kiggans Voted For An Amendment To Prohibit The Defense Department From Paying For Expenses Related To Abortion Services. In July 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Jackson, R-Texas, amendment no. 5 that would repeal a 2022 Defense Department memorandum regarding access to reproductive health care and prohibit the department from paying for or reimbursing expenses relating to abortion services." The amendment was adopted by a vote of 221-213. [H.R. 2670, Vote #300, 7/13/23; CQ, 7/13/23]

Kiggans Voted For Authorizing The Defense Budget For Fiscal Year 2024. In July 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would authorize \$874.2 billion in national defense spending, including \$841.5 billion for the Defense Department and \$32.2 billion for national security programs within the Energy Department. The bill would authorize approximately \$168.6 billion for weapons and other procurement and \$145.2 billion for military research and development. Within these totals, it would authorize \$32.3 billion for shipbuilding; \$13.2 billion for Air Force procurement of 83 new F-35 series tactical force aircraft; \$17.4 billion for 92 Navy aircraft; \$539 million for the Ground Based Strategic Deterrent ballistic missile system; and approximately \$30 billion for missile defense programs, including \$434 million for a hypersonic missile defense system, \$498 million for continued development of Guam missile defense systems, \$160 million for Israeli missile defense systems and \$2.6 billion for a Space Force defendable missile warning satellite system. Within Energy Department funding, it would authorize \$23.9 billion for the National Nuclear Security Administration, primarily for the maintenance of a nuclear weapons stockpile. It would authorize \$38.2 billion for the Defense Health Program and \$17.5 billion for military construction. It would authorize \$9.7 billion for the Pacific Deterrence Initiative and \$3.6 billion for the European Deterrence Initiative, primarily intended to counter aggression by China and Russia, respectively. For international assistance and cooperation, it would authorize \$4 billion to bolster U.S. and allied forces in Europe against Russian aggression, including \$300 million in security assistance to Ukraine; \$565 million for the U.S. Africa Command; \$398 million for forces in Syria and Iraq combating the Islamic State group; \$336 million for a cooperative threat reduction program assisting former Soviet Union countries; \$300 million for cooperative research and development programs with Israel; and \$210 million for the Baltic Security Initiative. The bill would authorize a 5.2 percent military pay increase and authorize the Defense Department to issue bonuses to junior enlisted servicemembers to counteract inflation. It would authorize \$1.1 billion for the Defense Department environmental restoration fund and require the department to undertake various environmental cleanup activities. It would eliminate the position of chief diversity officer within the Defense Department and include various provisions to restrict DOD programs that involve diversity, equity and inclusion and critical race theory. The bill would establish a special inspector general for Ukraine assistance and require the Defense Department to make plans to increase the energy resiliency of each main operating base in the U.S. European Command zone. It would repeal a 2022 Defense Department memorandum regarding access to reproductive health care and prohibit the department from paying for or reimbursing expenses relating to abortion services; eliminate all Defense Department and Armed Forces offices established to promote diversity, equity and inclusion as well as terminate all personnel within such offices; and prevent the Defense Department from purchasing data of U.S. individuals that would otherwise require a warrant, court order or subpoena." Kiggans Voted For A Bill To Punish Doctors Who Provide Reproductive Care

Kiggans Voted For The Born Alive-Survivors Protection Act To Require Health Care Practitioners To Provide Medical Care To Children "Born Alive" After An Abortion Or Attempted Abortion. In January 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill that would require health care practitioners to provide the same care to a child that is 'born alive'



after an abortion or attempted abortion as they would for a child born at the same gestational age and to ensure the child is immediately transported and admitted to a hospital; require hospital and clinic practitioners and employees to report any knowledge of failures to provide such care; and impose criminal fines and penalties for failures to meet these requirements. It would state that a child born alive under these conditions is a legal person under U.S. law, entitled to the protections of U.S. law, and it would specifically make any act that kills or attempts to kill such a child punishable as murder or attempted murder. The bill would also prohibit the prosecution of the mother of a child born alive after an abortion or attempted abortion and permit such mothers to seek relief through civil action against any person who violates the bill's requirements, including monetary and punitive damages." The bill passed by a vote of 220-210. [H.R. 26, Vote #29, 1/11/23]

The Born Alive Bill Would Punish Doctors For Providing Care To Patients. "The offensively named 'born-alive' legislation is another cruel and misguided attempt to interfere with evidence-based medical decision making between patients and their physicians...Laws that ban or criminalize evidence-based care and rely on medically unsupported theories and misinformation are dangerous to families and their clinicians. Johnson Cosponsored A Bill to Prohibit The Defense Department From Paying For Abortion Services. Specifically, the bill prohibits DOD from paying or reimbursing any fees or expenses for a health care professional (who provides health care at a military medical treatment facility) to gain a license in a state if the purpose of gaining the license is to provide

In July 2022 Johnson voted against: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would prohibit individuals from interfering with patients' ability to access to abortion services in another state where the services are legal. Specifically, it would prohibit any person acting under color of state law from preventing, restricting or retaliating against health care providers' ability to provide abortion services that are legal in the provider's state to patients who do not reside in that state; a person's ability to assist in providing such services; or a person's ability to travel or assist another person traveling across state lines to obtain an abortion. It would also prohibit individuals from preventing, restricting or retaliating against the interstate movement of any drug approved by the Food and Drug Administration for the termination of a pregnancy. It would allow the U.S. attorney general or a harmed individual to bring a civil action in U.S. district court for declaratory and injunctive relief against an individual who violates the prohibitions." The bill passed by a vote of 223-205. [H.R. 8297, Vote #362, 7/15/22]

The Ensuring Access To Abortion Act Protected People Who Assist Others In Receiving Out Of State Abortions And Shielded Transportation Of Abortion Drugs Between States. "The legislation protects women who travel to another state to receive an abortion if their home state prohibits the medical procedure. And in states where abortion is lawful, the bill seeks to make it illegal for facilities to limit access to the medical procedure for individuals who arrived from out of state. Additionally, the measure includes a provision to protect people who assist others in receiving an abortion in a state where they do not reside. It also shields the state-to-state transportation of abortion drugs that have received approval from the Food and Drug Administration." [The Hill, 7/15/22]

Johnson Voted Against The Right To Contraception Act To Establish A Statutory Right For Individuals To Obtain And Health Care Providers To Provide Contraceptives. In July 2022 Johnson voted against "Passage of the bill that would establish that individuals have a statutory right to obtain contraceptives and health care providers have a right to provide contraceptives, contraception and related information. It would prohibit any limitation or infringement of these rights that impedes access to or singles out the provision or providers of contraceptives, contraception or related information. It would supersede any federal and state law that conflicts with its provisions. It would allow the U.S. attorney general or a harmed individual to bring a civil action in U.S. district court for equitable relief against an individual who violates these provisions. It would allow health care providers to bring action on behalf of themselves, their staff or their patients." The bill passed by a vote of 228-195. [H.R. 8373, Vote #385, 7/21/22; CQ, 7/21/22]


Johnson Voted For The Born Alive-Survivors Protection Act. In January 2023 Johnson voted for: "Passage of the bill that would require health care practitioners to provide the same care to a child that is 'born alive' after an abortion or attempted abortion as they would for a child born at the same gestational age and to ensure the child is immediately transported and admitted to a hospital; require hospital and clinic practitioners and employees to report any knowledge of failures to provide such care; and impose criminal fines and penalties for failures to meet these requirements. It would state that a child born alive under these conditions is a legal person under U.S. law, entitled to the protections of U.S. law, and it would specifically make any act that kills or attempts to kill such a child punishable as murder or attempted murder. The bill would also prohibit the prosecution of the mother of a child born alive after an abortion or attempted abortion and permit such mothers to seek relief through civil action against any person who violates the bill's requirements, including monetary and punitive damages." The bill passed by a vote of 220-210. [H.R. 26, Vote #29, 1/11/23; CQ, 1/11/23]

Specifically, it requires a provider who dispenses or prescribes medication for a chemical abortion to physically examine the patient, be physically present at the location of the chemical abortion, and schedule a follow-up visit for the patient. The bill provides an exception for a chemical abortion that is necessary to save the life of a mother whose life is endangered by a physical disorder, illness, injury, or condition. The bill establishes criminal penalties—a fine, a prison term of up to two years, or both—for a provider who does not comply with the requirements. Hope 4 Life, A Self-Described "Mobile Pregnancy Resource Center" Aimed To Meet "Abortion-Bound Young Women ... As They Are Walking Into The Abortion Facility" To "Encourage Them To Carry Their Babies To Term." According to Hope 4 Life, "Hope 4 Life (H4L) is a mobile pregnancy resource center that parks near the Virginia Beach/Norfolk abortion clinics to meet abortion-bound young women where they are, as they are walking into the abortion facility. H4L offers pregnancy tests, ultrasound services, and counseling. These free services will enable mothers and fathers to encounter the humanity of their developing child, and will encourage them to carry their babies to term." [Hope4Life, accessed 12/15/21]

Hope 4 Life RV – A "Pro-Life Mobile Pregnancy Care Center" – Would Regularly Park Near A Planned Parenthood In Virginia Beach, Aiming To Intercept Women Seeking Abortions. The Catholic Virginian reported, "The students are helping a homeless, jobless woman and a mother who planned to abort her baby because she already had two children whom she could barely support. The babies were saved from abortion when individuals, mainly Catholic, praying outside of Planned Parenthood in Virginia Beach intercepted them on separate occasions. The sidewalk counselor invited each woman to the nearby Hope 4 Life RV, a pro-life mobile pregnancy care center. Its services are free and include pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, donations of baby items, and referrals for medical care and other services, explained Cheri Britt who co-founded the Catholic organization Hope 4 Life Ministry with Louantha Kerr." [...] As Peter Barker, a parishioner at St. Matthew Parish, Virginia Beach, prayed outside of Planned Parenthood in Virginia Beach just over a year ago, a woman and her granddaughter pulled into the parking lot of the facility. [...] The protesters pray, hand out the Divine Mercy prayer and attempt to converse with individuals as they pass by or enter and leave the facility parking lot. They encourage pregnant women to get a free ultrasound from Hope 4 Life which is parked nearby. "Sometimes called crisis pregnancy centers, the facilities' 'primary mission is to dissuade women from choosing abortion,' Katrina Kimport, an associate professor at Advancing New Standards in Reproductive Health (ANSIRH), a group at the University of California San Francisco, writes in a new study of patients at the centers, published on Friday in the journal Perspectives on Sexual and Reproductive Health. The centers, most of which are religiously affiliated, typically offer services like pregnancy tests and sometimes resources like diapers or baby clothes, alongside counseling with an anti-abortion message." Crisis Pregnancy Centers Used False And Misleading Language On Ads That That Indicated They Offered Medical Services Like Abortion. "According to an analysis by NARAL, 79 percent of the crisis pregnancy centers that advertised on Google indicated that they provided medical services such as abortions, when, in fact, they are focused on counseling services and on providing information about alternatives to abortion [...] the crisis pregnancy centers intentionally used false and misleading language on ads that appeared when users searched for 'abortion clinic.'" NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia Foundation Found That 71 Percent Of CPCs In Virginia "Shared Some Degree Of Medically Erroneous Information." According to NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia, "The investigation, conducted by NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia Foundation staff and volunteers, included 77 phone calls and 10 in-person visits to 56 of the 58 CPCs in the Commonwealth. The study's findings demonstrate that the vast majority of Virginia CPCs continue to relay medically inaccurate information to potential and current clientele about infertility, fetal development, sexually transmitted infections, contraception, pregnancy, and abortion. Of the 56 centers identified and investigated in Virginia, 71 percent (40) shared some degree of medically erroneous information." [NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia Foundation, June 2013]

• NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia Foundation's Investigation Found CPCs Shared Medically Incorrect Information Like Abortion Caused Breast Cancer, And That Women Who Received Abortions Would "Get Eating Disorders, Become Alcoholic, Or Become Drug Dealers." According to NARAL Pro-Choice Virginia, "Investigation Findings of Misleading and Medically Inaccurate Information: 40 CPCs shared medically erroneous information that abortion causes long-term psychological damage, including suggesting that women who have abortions can 'get eating disorders, become alcoholic, or become drug addicts, '3 and that 'the sound of a vacuum would always bring back flashbacks of the abortion.' 4 18 CPCs shared medically inaccurate information that abortion causes breast cancer, including several that issued the following warning on their respective websites: 'A number of



reliable studies have demonstrated a connection between abortion and later development of breast cancer.'567 25 CPCs falsely reported a link between abortion, infertility, and later pregnancy complications. One in-person investigator reported: 'The counselor said that if I was a certain blood type, an abortion could cause my body to create antibodies that would attack my baby the next time I got pregnant." Black Women Faced Racist Remarks And Assumptions At Pregnancy Crisis Centers. "Black people who have visited pregnancy resource centers have told her they faced racist assumptions about things like their income or whether their fathers are in their lives, Flint said." [Vox, 3/20/20]

- Kiggans voted to cut security assistance to Israel by 30%, or nearly \$1 billion.
- Despite saying that it was "imperative" that America did not waver in its commitment to strengthen Israel's ability to defend itself, Kiggans wanted to tie new aid for Israel and Ukraine to border security.

Kiggans Complained About The Conditions Of Military Housing, But Voted To Cut Military Construction

- Kiggans complained about military barracks and wanted to fix housing conditions.

 housing issues into the Military Construction-VA Appropriations bill because Kiggans said she was trying to

April 2020: Kiggans Voted Against The Virginia Fairness In Lending Act, Which Fought Predatory Lending

Kiggans Voted Against Virginia Fairness In Lending Act. In April of 20202, Kiggans voted against SB 421, which "Replaces references to payday loans with the term 'short-term loans.' The measure caps the interest and fees that may be charged under a short-term loan at an annual rate of 36 percent, plus a maintenance fee; increases the maximum amount of such loans from \$500 to \$2,500; and sets the duration of such loans at a minimum of four months, subject to exceptions, and a maximum of 24 months. Short-term loan licensees are required to make a reasonable attempt to verify a borrower's income and may not collect fees and charges that exceed 50 percent of the original loan amount if such amount is equal to or less than \$1,500 and 60 percent of the original loan amount if such amount is greater than \$1,500 [...] A violation of these provisions is made a prohibited practice under the Virginia Consumer Protection Act. The measure amends provisions of the Consumer Finance Act to, among other things, allow licensed lenders to use the services of access partners and establish requirements that loans be between \$300 and \$35,000; be repayable in substantially equal installment payments; have a term of no fewer than six and no more than 120 months; charge not more than 36 percent annual interest and a loan processing fee; and require licensees to post a bond. The measure prohibits credit service businesses from advertising, offering, or performing other services in connection with an extension of credit that has an annual interest rate exceeding 36 percent, is for less than \$5,000, has a term of less than one year, or is provided under an open-end credit plan." The bill passed 22-18 and became law on April 4th, 2020. [Virginia General Assembly, SB 421, 4/22/201

Virginia's evidence-based approach builds on successful reforms previously enacted in Colorado and Ohio that maintained widespread access to credit and measurably improved consumer outcomes by closing loopholes, modernizing outdated statutes, and prohibiting balloon payments [...] Pew's analysis of the act confirmed that, under the legislation, lenders can profitably offer affordable installment loans with structural safeguards, saving the typical borrower hundreds of dollars in fees and interest with estimated total consumer savings exceeding \$100 million annually." These so-called predatory lenders, which pop up around military bases, try to entice or deceive young soldiers into taking out loans that impose abusive or unfair terms. 'Predatory lenders like to prey on young military members because they're often inexperienced with money, have little to no credit and are usually very excited to spend that first paycheck,' said certified financial planner Tara Falcone, founder of the financial education company ReisUP. She is also a former hedge fund analyst and is married to an officer in the U.S. Navy. The end result is a loan that carries a hefty price tag, with sky-high interest rates and hidden fees. For example, if a soldier is convinced to take out a payday loan, which requires a check dated for the next payday, he could ultimately wind up with an interest rate near 400%. Kiggans Voted Against Virginia Fairness In Lending Act. In April of 20202, Kiggans voted against SB 421, which "Replaces references to payday loans with the term 'short-term loans.' The measure caps the interest and fees that may be charged under a short-term loan at an annual rate of 36 percent, plus a maintenance fee; increases the maximum amount of such loans from \$500 to \$2,500; and sets the duration of such loans at a minimum of four months, subject to exceptions, and a maximum of 24 months. Short-term loan licensees are required to make a reasonable attempt to verify a borrower's income and may not collect fees and charges that exceed 50 percent of the original loan amount if such amount is equal to or less than \$1,500 and 60 percent of the original loan amount if such amount is greater than \$1,500 [...] A violation of these provisions is made a prohibited practice under the Virginia Consumer Protection Act. The measure amends provisions of the Consumer Finance Act to, among other things, allow licensed lenders to use the services of access partners and establish requirements that loans be between \$300 and \$35,000; be repayable in substantially equal installment payments; have a term of no fewer than six and no more than 120 months; charge not more than 36 percent annual interest and a loan processing fee; and require licensees to post a bond. The measure prohibits credit service businesses from advertising, offering, or performing other services in connection with an extension of credit that has an annual interest rate exceeding 36 percent, is for less than \$5,000, has a term of less than one year, or is provided under an open-end credit plan." Kiggans Voted On The Republican-Led Debt Ceiling Plan

Kiggans Voted On H.R. 2811 Which Would Have Suspended The Debt Limit Through March 2024

Kiggans Voted For Suspending The Debt Limit Through March 2024 Or Until \$1.5 Trillion Has Been Reached And Capping Federal Spending For FY 2024 At 2022 Levels With A Capped 1% Per Year Growth. In April 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would suspend the statutory limit on federal debt through March 31, 2024, or until an additional \$1.5 trillion has been borrowed — whichever occurs first. It would also include a range of provisions to limit federal spending, as well as the text of a previously passed energy and permitting policy package. The bill would set base discretionary spending limits through fiscal 2033, capping spending for fiscal 2024 at the fiscal 2022 level of \$1.47 trillion — a reduction from current spending levels — and raising the cap by 1 percent annually through fiscal 2033. It would also include similar annual cap adjustments for specified programs, including for wildfire suppression, disability reviews and redeterminations, health care fraud and abuse control, and disaster reemployment services and eligibility assessments. The bill would rescind unobligated amounts from various funds provided by the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package (PL 117-169) for COVID-19 relief, IRS enforcement, and certain climate- and infrastructurefocused initiatives, as well as all unobligated funding from the March 2021 coronavirus relief reconciliation package (PL 117-2) and earlier coronavirus response laws. The bill would expand or establish work requirements for Medicaid beneficiaries aged 19 to 55 and raise from 49 to 55 the oldest age at which existing work requirements would apply for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program beneficiaries. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." The bill passed by a vote of 217-215. [H.R. 2811, Vote #199, 4/26/23; CQ, 4/26/23]



The bill would authorize approximately \$168.6 billion for weapons and other procurement and \$145.2 billion for military research and development. 



Kiggans Voted For The Strategic Production Response Act To Prohibit Oil Drawdowns From The Strategic Petroleum Reserve Until The Department Of Energy Develops A Plan To Expand Energy Leasing For Oil Equal To The Amount Drawn From The Reserve. In January 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would prohibit the Department of Energy, after the bill's enactment, from executing a first drawdown of petroleum products from the U.S. Strategic Petroleum Reserve for sale, exchange or loan until the DOE first develops a plan — in consultation with the Agriculture, Interior and Defense departments — to increase the percentage of federal lands leased for oil and gas production by an amount equal to the percentage of petroleum in the Reserve that would be drawn down, up to a maximum of 15 percent. It would also modify various work standards for the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families program, including to update the baseline for calculating certain state workforce participation standards and require states to collect certain data related to work outcomes for TANF participants. To limit regulatory spending, the bill would nullify pending executive actions suspending student loan payments and prohibit the Education Department from implementing any substantially similar actions without congressional approval. It would also establish a process to require congressional approval of all "major" federal rules that would have an annual impact of at least \$100 million, cause a major increase in prices, or cause significant adverse effects to economic competitiveness. Among energy- and climate-focused provisions, the bill would repeal, phase out or narrow a variety of climate-focused tax credits under the fiscal 2022 reconciliation package, including repealing new credits for solar and wind projects, sustainable aviation fuel and clean fuel production. It would also include the full text of the House-passed energy and permitting package (HR 1) that would require a number of actions to boost the domestic production of fossil fuels and certain critical minerals and accelerate the construction of natural gas pipelines and other energy infrastructure, while reversing or repealing certain presidential actions taken and laws enacted during the Biden administration related to energy policy and climate change." In November 2023, Kiggans voted for: "Passage of the bill, as amended, that would provide \$37.7 billion in discretionary spending, including \$25.4 billion subject to the measure's discretionary cap and \$9.4 billion offset by rescissions. It would provide \$14.6 billion for the Interior Department, including \$3 billion for the National Park Service; \$1.5 billion for the Fish and Wildlife Service; \$1.3 billion for the U.S. Geological Survey; and \$1.3 billion for the Bureau of Land Management. It would provide approximately \$11.2 billion for Native American programs in fiscal 2024, including \$2.6 billion for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, \$1.4 billion for the Bureau of Indian Education and \$7.1 billion for the Health and Human Services Department's Indian Health Service (an IHS total that includes \$5.1 billion in advance appropriations enacted in the fiscal 2023 spending measure). The bill would provide an additional \$5.9 billion in fiscal 2025 advance appropriations for IHS. The bill would provide \$6.2 billion for the EPA, which includes \$2.4 billion for environmental programs and management and \$561 million for science and technology. It would provide \$8 billion for the Forest Service, including \$4.4 billion for wildfire management and response. Between the Forest Service and Interior Department, it would provide \$619 million for wildfire preparedness and \$1.4 billion for fire suppression activities. The bill would also provide \$960 million for the Smithsonian Institution; \$178 million for the National Gallery of Art; and \$373 million combined for the National Endowment for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Humanities. Among its policy provisions, it would prohibit the use of funds to promote "critical race theory"; block a January 2023 EPA and Army Corps of Engineers rule on the definition of "Waters of the United States"; prohibit the EPA from issuing a waiver to allow California to issue its own emissions standards for small off-road vehicle engines; require the Interior Department to conduct quarterly onshore oil and gas lease sales; and prohibit the use of funds to implement certain regulations under the Endangered Species Act, including protections for the lesser prairie-chicken and the northern long-eared bat. It would rescind \$9.4 billion in funding for the EPA, Interior Department and Council on Environmental Quality provided under the fiscal 2022 budget reconciliation bill (PL 117-169), including \$7.8 billion for renewable energy projects and \$1.4 billion for environmental and climate justice projects. As amended, the bill would bar the use of funds provided by the bill for the American Climate Corps; prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to enforce any COVID-19 mask mandates; bar the use of funds provided by the bill to implement, administer, apply, enforce or carry out any plastic straw prohibitions; prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill for the cancellation or suspension of oil and gas leases in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge or the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska; and prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to reduce the number of oil and gas leases issued by the Interior Department, among other provisions." The measure (i) requires the State Corporation Commission to establish by regulation a shared solar program that allows multifamily customers of investor-owned utilities, other than American Electric Power, to purchase electric power through a subscription in a shared solar facility; (ii) raises the cap on the total amount of renewable energy that can be net metered in a utility's service territory from one percent to six percent, five percent of which is available to all customers and one percent of which is available only to low-income utility customers; (iii) raises the cap for net-metered nonresidential generation facilities from one megawatt to three megawatts; (iv) allows certain localities to install solar or wind facilities of up to five megawatts on government-owned property and use the electricity for government-owned buildings; (v) increases the cap on the capacity of generation from facilities from the customer's expected annual energy consumption to 150 percent of such amount for customers in Dominion Energy Virginia's service territory; (vi) prohibits standby charges for any residential customer-generator or agricultural customer-generator of an investor-owned utility other than Dominion Energy Virginia; and (vii) increases the cap on third party power purchase agreements to 500 megawatts for jurisdictional customers and 500 megawatts for nonjurisdictional customers of Dominion Energy Virginia and to 40 megawatts for customers of American Electric Power." In April of 2020, Kiggans voted against SB 35, which "Authorizes any locality by ordinance to prohibit the possession or carrying of firearms, ammunition, or components or any combination thereof in (i) any building, or part thereof, owned or used by such locality for governmental purposes; (ii) any public park owned or operated by the locality; (iii) any recreation or community center facility; or (iv) any public street, road, alley, sidewalk or public right-of-way or any other place of whatever nature that is open to the public and is being used by or is adjacent to a permitted event or an event that would otherwise require a permit. Provisions limiting the authority of localities and state governmental entities to bring lawsuits against certain firearms manufacturers and others are also repealed. The bill also provides that any firearm received by the locality pursuant to a gun buy-back program shall be destroyed by the locality unless the person surrendering such firearm requests in writing that such surrendered firearm be sold." HR 976: TCJA Permanency Act Would Make Provisions Enacted In 2017 By The Tax Cuts And Jobs Act **Permanent.** "This bill makes permanent provisions affecting individual and business taxpayers that were enacted in 2017 by the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act and are scheduled to expire at the end of 2025. The bill makes permanent reductions in individual and capital gain tax rates. The bill increases the standard tax deduction for individual taxpayers. It also increases and modifies the child tax credit and raises the contribution base for the tax deduction for charitable contributions. The bill allows additional contributions to ABLE accounts (tax-exempt accounts designed to enable individuals with disabilities to save and pay for disability-related expenses). It exempts from taxation combat zone benefits of members of the Armed Forces serving in the Sinai Peninsula of Egypt and limits the deduction for moving expenses to active duty members of the Armed Forces. Among its border security and immigration provisions, it would require DHS, within seven days of enactment, to resume all activities related to "border wall" construction on the U.S.-Mexico border that were underway or planned prior to Jan. 20, 2021; require DHS to reopen or restore, no later than Sept. 30, 2023, the use of all Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention facilities that were in operation on Jan. 20, 2021; and require DHS to return all unaccompanied children to their country of origin, regardless of whether they are from a contiguous country to the U.S. In addition to provisions of HR 2, it would place limitations on the use of DHS funding provided by the bill, including prohibitions on removing existing U.S.-Mexico border barriers, transporting inadmissible adults into the U.S., and the use of Customs and Border Protection's "CBP One" app to facilitate the parole of an individual into the U.S. It also would prohibit the use of funds provided by the bill to initiate or resume any project or activity not funded during fiscal 2023 and would establish a congressional fiscal commission tasked with identifying policies to "improve the fiscal situation." The bill would allow groups of employers to establish and maintain group health plans for employees. It would require such groups to provide coverage to at least 51 employees and to have been in existence for at least two years prior to establishing the health plan. It would allow self-employed individuals to establish a group for the purpose of maintaining a group health plan. The bill would also allow employerfinanced health reimbursement arrangements (HRA) to be used by employees to purchase insurance plans on state exchanges. It would also deem such HRAs compliant with requirements under current law for employers to provide health insurance coverage. To be eligible, it would require employers to offer the same HRA plan to all employees of a certain class, as defined by the bill, including full- and part-time employees, employees under the same collective bargaining agreement, and non-resident alien employees. It would also require employers to give eligible employees 90 days' written notice prior to the beginning of the plan year of their rights and obligations. Among other provisions, the bill would rescind \$245 million in fiscal 2024 from the Health and Human Services Department's Prevention and Public Health Fund, specify that stop-loss policies obtained by a self-insured group health plan or plan sponsor do not qualify as health insurance coverage under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act, and require the Treasury Department, within one year of enactment, to notify employers of the availability of tax-advantaged flexible health insurance benefits, with an initial focus on small businesses, HR 3799 also contains the text of the Small Business Flexibility Act (HR 3798), the Association Health Plans Act (HR 2868) and the Self-Insurance Protection Act (HR 2813). The bill defines essential health benefits as those general categories and those items and services within such categories that are covered in accordance with regulations issued pursuant to the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act in effect as of January 1, 2019.' Kiggans Voted Against Limiting The Use Of Short-Term Junk Insurance Plans For Long-Term Health Care Coverage. In March 2020, Kiggans voted against S.B. 404, which 'Prohibits carriers from issuing in the Commonwealth, on or after July 1, 2021, any short-term limited-duration medical plan with a duration that exceeds three months or that can be renewed or extended beyond six months, or if the plan's issuance would result in a covered person being covered by a short-term limited-duration medical plan for more than six months in any 12-month period. The bill prohibits a carrier from issuing a short-term limited-duration medical plan during an annual open enrollment period.' The bill passed, 21-19. [Virginia State Assembly, SB 404, 3/7/20]

In February of 2020, Kiggans voted against S.B. 732, which 'creates the Virginia Health Benefit Exchange, which will be established and operated by a new division within the State Corporation Commission (SCC). The Exchange shall facilitate the purchase and sale of qualified health plans and qualified dental plans to qualified individuals and qualified employers. The Exchange shall make qualified plans available to qualified individuals and qualified employers by July 1, 2023, unless the SCC postpones this date. The measure authorizes the SCC to review and approve accident and sickness insurance premium rates applicable to health benefit plans in the individual and small group markets and health benefit plans providing health insurance coverage in the individual market through certain non-employer group plans. The Exchange will be funded by an assessment on health insurers, which is limited to three percent of total monthly premiums, except the SCC may, after a public hearing, adjust the rate as necessary to ensure the Exchange is fully funded. A health plan will not be required to cover any statemandated health benefit if federal law does not require it to be covered as part of the essential benefits package. The essential health benefits are items and services included in the benchmark health insurance plan, which is the largest plan in the largest product in the Commonwealth's small group market as supplemented in order to provide coverage for the items and services within the statutory essential health benefits categories.' In this bill, House Republicans are cutting the BIA by 30 percent, slashing resources for education programs, school repairs, and facility construction projects. Abigail Spanberger, D-Prince William, Jennifer Wexton, D-Loudoun, and Jen Kiggans, R-Virginia Beach, seeks to secure federal recognition for the tribe, which would extend sovereignty rights to the Patawomeck while also allowing them to access federal benefits, services and protections. Among those is the right to federal consultation, or the requirement that federal agencies seek input from tribal officials in developing regulations or policies that might impact Indigenous nations. Exclusion In Virginia's Minimum Wage Act

Kiggans Voted Against Setting A Fair Minimum Wage For Domestic Workers And Providing Remedies For Work Related Injuries, Workplace Harassment, And Discrimination. In February of 2020, Kiggans Voted Against S.B. 804, which eliminated "the exclusion in the Virginia Minimum Wage Act for persons employed in domestic service. The bill requires the Secretary of Commerce and Trade to convene a work group consisting of representatives from the Department of Labor and Industry, the Virginia Employment Commission, the Workers' Compensation Commission, organizations representing domestic workers, and such other stakeholders as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade deems appropriate to make recommendations, including any necessary statutory and regulatory changes, with regard to protecting domestic service employees from workplace harassment and discrimination, providing remedies for such employees for the nonpayment of wages, ensuring the safety and health of such employees in the workplace, and protecting such employees from loss of income as a result of unemployment or employment-related injury by including coverage of such employees in the Virginia Unemployment Compensation Act and the Virginia Workers' Compensation Act." Kiggans Voted Against Paying A Fair Wage To Workers On Public Works Contracts And Transportation Projects

Kiggans Voted Against Paying A Fair Wage To Worker On Publics Works Contracts And Transportation Infrastructure Projects. In April of 2021, Kiggans voted against H.B. 2327, which "clarifies, for purposes of the requirement under certain circumstances to pay the prevailing wage rate for work performed on public works contracts, that public works includes transportation infrastructure projects." - Language experts noted it was infinitesimally unlikely that Kiggans' word choice was accidental and not plagiarized.
- Kiggans' effort to misrepresent Luria's position on China while lifting key phrases from her op-ed placed her in "an entirely different universe of hypocrisy."

Kiggans Was Closely Tied To Scandal-Ridden Ex-Congressman Scott Taylor And Took Campaign Cash From A Taylor Consultant Charged With Election Fraud

- Kiggans' campaign received \$250 from Rob Catron, one of Scott Taylor's campaign consultants charged with election fraud.

- Kiggans continued to receive support from PRA Group in her race for Congress in 2022.

Kiggans Accepted Campaign Contribution From GEO Group, Which Ran Virginia's Only Private Prison, A Month Before She Helped Kill Bill To Abolish For-Profit Prison Management In Virginia

- Kiggans was on the Senate Rehabilitation and Social Services Committee and accepted a campaign contribution from GEO Group.

H.R. 2811 Contained Spending Cuts To HUD's Vital Affordable Housing And Homelessness Programs. "The U.S. House of Representatives passed the 'Limit, Save, and Grow Act' (H.R.2811) on April 26 by a party-line vote of 217-215. If enacted, the bill would lift the federal debt ceiling in exchange for massive spending cuts to federal domestic programs in fiscal year (FY) 2024, including HUD's vital affordable housing and homelessness programs. Unveiled in the chamber last week by House Speaker Kevin McCarthy (R-CA) and officially introduced by House Committee on the Budget Chair Jodey Arrington (R-TX), the bill proposes cutting federal domestic spending for fiscal year (FY) 2024 to FY22 levels, resulting in at least a 23% reduction in funding for key programs, depending on how cuts are designed. [...] If enacted, the proposal – which some Democrats are calling the 'Default on America Act' – would make it impossible for HUD to stave off mass evictions, according to a letter sent by HUD Secretary Marcia L. Fudge to House Appropriations Ranking Member Rosa DeLauro (D-CT). In the letter, the Secretary suggests that the bill's drastic cuts to HUD's programs would cause nearly 1 million households currently being served by the department's rental assistance programs to lose their housing assistance, putting them at risk of housing instability and evictions, and nearly 120,000 fewer people experiencing homelessness to receive services." These increases are statutory and reflect increased costs, and HUD cannot avoid them within the contracts. As a result, any cuts to the 2023 level would force HUD to short fund or cancel existing contracts between the federal government and private property owners. The termination of contracts with rental owners will likely lead the owners to convert their housing to market-rate, leaving currently supported tenants in units that are now unaffordable to them, likely resulting in evictions. "Families Living in Public Housing Would be Exposed to Unsafe Living Conditions The needs of public housing portfolio continue to grow, so major cuts to this program threaten to remove important affordable housing assets from the inventory. If there is a 22 percent cut, HUD calculates an expected 78% proration for the Operating Fund. At this level, there would be significant impacts to PHA operations. All PHAs would need to drastically cut operations, including regular property maintenance, services to families, and likely staff layoffs to right-size operations to expected revenues. Deferred maintenance would decrease housing quality, potentially exposing families to unsafe living conditions such as mold and lead-based paint. Finally, there would be the likelihood of PHA insolvency or other program failures. The projected \$700 million cut from the capital grants would leave no funding to address backlog needs and \$2 billion in unfunded accrual needs. Unmet capital needs mean the further deterioration of the inventory and contribute to lower occupancy rates, higher costs for utilities, less resilience to climate change, and increased health and safety risks for residents." Urban and rural municipalities and counties rely on the funding for basic housing-related infrastructure such as rehabilitation of existing affordable housing, water and sewer connections, sidewalks, as well as direct assistance for small businesses, economic development, and essential services. The estimated impact of the funding cut of 22 percent will reduce the average grant by approximately \$440,000. HOME: As with CDBG, the vital HOME Program received zero increase in 2023. Funding cuts to HOME would result in fewer new affordable rental and homeownership opportunities for low-income families, fewer grants for repair and rehabilitation of existing affordable housing, and less tenant-based rental assistance available, resulting in increased risk of homelessness. This will directly exacerbate the existing national affordable housing crisis. The estimated impact of the funding cut of 22 percent from 2023 to the average HOME formula grant of \$1.5 million will reduce the average grant by \$330,000 and will result in more than 6,700 fewer units of affordable housing produced." 2023: Kiggans' Vote Would Have Cut 22% To Fair Housing Programs. "Efforts to Combat Housing Discrimination Would be Severely Impacted A 22 percent cut to Fair Housing Programs would severely impact the ability of the Fair Housing Assistance Program (FHAP) to support state and local agency enforcement of the Fair Housing Act nationwide. FHAP agencies currently investigate about 75 percent of all fair housing complaints filed under the Fair Housing Act, and this level of funding would jeopardize the FHAP agencies' ability to conduct investigations, litigate complaints, retain staff, and keep up with inflation. This level of funding would also hinder the Department's ability to admit new FHAP agencies into the program. A 22 percent cut to the Fair Housing Initiatives Program (FHIP) would significantly impact the geographical representation of and activities performed by fair housing organizations nationally. Last year, as usual, HUD was unable to fund all Education and Outreach Initiative (EOI) qualified applicants. A reduction would further limit HUD's ability to fund organizations in underserved and unserved communities. This also could prevent HUD from maintaining the current maximum level of funding under the Private Enforcement Initiative (PEI), which funds fair



housing organizations to conduct testing, 5 investigations, and public education and outreach on the rights and responsibilities under the Fair Housing Act. Lastly, the Fair Housing Accessibility FIRST program would be severely limited in maintaining a broad scope of services, especially focused on addressing accessibility compliance in federally-assisted affordable housing programs." 2023: Kiggans' Vote Would Have Increased The Number Of Americans Sleeping On The Streets. "Thousands More Americans Would be Sleeping on the Streets HUD received a targeted increase in funding for Homeless Assistance Grants in 2023, which would sustain existing resources for emergency shelter, increase availability of permanent supportive housing, and continue to provide other homeless assistance to the most vulnerable Americans. Undoing this increase will severely curtail the services that communities across the country would be able to provide to those experiencing homelessness. Cuts to the Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) program from the 2023 baseline would result in less emergency shelter, homelessness prevention, and rapid rehousing. A funding cut of 22 percent would result in over 24,000 fewer people receiving assistance, likely leading to large increases in the number of people sleeping on the streets. In the Continuum of Care and Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program, funding provides permanent supportive housing for people with severe disabilities and illnesses, and rapid rehousing and transitional housing for youth and adults to help them achieve housing stability and self-sufficiency. In recent years, HUD has significantly expanded assistance to people fleeing domestic violence. Providing funding at the 2022 level for CoC renewals would result in at least 54,000 fewer homeless people and domestic violence survivors receiving assistance than in 2023, and a 22 percent cut from 2023 levels would result in nearly 95,000 fewer people receiving assistance. These cuts would eliminate new funding for the Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program, an effort that has helped reduce the number of homeless unaccompanied youth by more than 25 percent since 2017." Funding for the formula block grant component would be reduced by \$173 million with a 22-percent cut, which would reduce funding for Native American Housing Block Grants to its lowest level since it was implemented in 1996 (adjusting for inflation)." Kiggans Voted Against Helping Tenants Hold Landlords Accountable For Unsafe Housing Conditions When She Was A State Senator

2021: Kiggans Voted Against Helping Tenants Hold Landlords Accountable For Unsafe Housing Conditions. In March of 2021, Kiggans voted against HB 1900 which "Provides that a general district court shall enter an order upon petition by a tenant that his landlord has (i) removed or excluded the tenant from the dwelling unit unlawfully, (ii) interrupted or caused the interruption of an essential service to the tenant, or (iii) taken action to make the premises unsafe for habitation. The bill allows entry of a preliminary order ex parte to require the landlord to allow the tenant to recover possession of the dwelling unit, resume any such interrupted essential service, or fix any willful actions taken by the landlord or his agent to make the premises unsafe for habitation if there is good cause to do so and the tenant made reasonable efforts to notify the landlord of the hearing. The bill requires that any ex parte order entered shall further indicate a date for a full hearing on the petition that is no later than 10 days from the initial hearing date. Finally, the bill provides that, at a full hearing on such petition and upon proper evidence presented, the tenant shall recover actual damages, the greater of \$5,000 or four months' rent, and reasonable attorney fees." The bill passed State Senate 20-19 and became law on March 30th, 2021. [Virginia General Assembly, HB 1900, 2/27/21]



Kiggans Voted Against Allowing Renters To Keep Apartments If The Tenant Can Pay All Costs Of Eviction Prior To Writ Of Eviction When She Was A State Senator

2021: Kiggans Voted Against Allowing Allowed Renters To Keep Apartments If The Tenant Can Pay All Costs Of Eviction Judgments Prior To Writ Of Eviction. In February of 2021, Kiggans voted against HB 2014 which "Prohibits a landlord from accepting full payment of rent, as well as any damages, money judgment, award of attorney fees, and court costs, from a tenant and receiving an order of possession pursuant to an unlawful detainer action and proceeding with eviction, unless there are bases for the entry of an order of possession other than nonpayment of rent stated in the unlawful detainer action filed by the landlord. Under current law, a landlord may accept full or partial payment of all rent and receive an order of possession pursuant to an unlawful detainer action and proceed with eviction, provided that he has stated in a written notice to the tenant that any and all amounts owed to the landlord by the tenant, including payment of any rent, damages, money judgment, award of attorney fees, and court costs, would be accepted with reservation and would not constitute a waiver of the landlord's right to evict the tenant from the dwelling unit. The bill provides specific language that must be included within such notice, and requires a landlord who elects to seek possession of the dwelling unit to provide a copy of the notice to the court for service to the tenant along with the summons for unlawful detainer."

• HB 2014 Also Eliminated Cap On Times A Renters Can Invoke Their "Right Of Redemption." "Another bill Price is carrying, HB 2014, would eliminate a cap on the number of times a tenant can invoke their 'right of redemption.' The rule allows a renter to keep their apartment if they can pay all costs associated with an eviction judgment in advance of the sheriff's office executing a writ of eviction. Kiggans Voted Against Banning Housing Discrimination Based On Renters' Source Of Funds, Such As Housing Vouchers When She Was A State Senator

2020: Kiggans Voted Against Banning Housing Discrimination Based On A Person's Source Of Funds. In March of 2020, Kiggans voted against H.B. 6, which, "adds discrimination on the basis of a person's source of funds to the list of unlawful discriminatory housing practices. The bill creates an exemption for an owner or owner's managing agent, provided that such owner does not own more than four rental dwelling units or more than a 10 percent interest in more than four rental dwelling units in the Commonwealth at the time of the alleged discriminatory housing practice. The bill allows an owner or owner's managing agent to deny or limit a person's rental or occupancy of a rental dwelling unit based on the person's source of funds for that unit if such source is not approved within 15 days of the person's submission of the request for tenancy approval. The bill defines 'source of funds' as any source that lawfully provides funds to or on behalf of a renter or buyer of housing, including any assistance, benefit, or subsidy program, whether such program is administered by a governmental or nongovernmental entity" the bill passed 25-15 and became law on March 27th, 2020 [Virginia General Assembly, HB 6, 3/3/20]

• H.B. 6 Was Meant To Prevent Discrimination For Renters Who Use Housing Choice Vouchers. "The Virginia House of Delegates passed House Bill 6 (HB 6) on March 4, advancing fair housing protections for renters who use Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV). The bill would add discrimination on the basis of a person's source of funds to the list of unlawful discriminatory housing practices. Although HB 6 covers all sources of income, the impetus for introducing the bill was to prevent landlords from rejecting applicants who use housing vouchers. In September 2020, Kiggans voted against HB 5106, which 'Provides that a landlord who owns more than four rental dwelling units or more than a 10 percent interest in more than four rental dwelling units in the Commonwealth shall not take any adverse action against an applicant for tenancy based solely on payment history or an eviction for nonpayment of rent that occurred during the period beginning on March 12, 2020, and ending 30 days after the expiration or revocation of any state of emergency declared by the Governor related to the COVID-19 pandemic.' Kiggans Voted Against Extending Eviction Protections For Renters Experiencing Financial Hardship Due To COVID For Landlords With 5 Or More Units. "Extends the sunset date from July 1, 2021, to July 1, 2022, of certain provisions enacted during the 2020 Special Session related to the Virginia Residential Landlord and Tenant Act. Such provisions (i) changed from five to 14 days the amount of time that a landlord who owns four or fewer rental dwelling units must wait after serving written notice on a tenant notifying the tenant of his nonpayment of rent and of the landlord's intention to terminate the rental agreement if rent is not paid before the landlord may pursue remedies for termination of the rental agreement; (ii) required a landlord who owns more than four rental dwelling units, or more than a 10 percent interest in more than four rental dwelling units, before terminating a rental agreement due to nonpayment of rent, to serve upon such tenant a written notice informing the tenant of the total amount due and owed and offer the tenant a payment plan under which the tenant must pay the total amount due and owed in equal monthly installments over a period of the lesser of six months or the time remaining under the rental agreement; (iii) outlined the remedies a landlord has if a tenant fails to pay the total amount due and owed or enter into a payment arrangement within 14 days of receiving notice or if the tenant enters into a payment arrangement but fails to pay within 14 days of the due date any rent that becomes due under the payment plan or arrangement after such plan or arrangement becomes effective" The bill passed 21-18 and became law March 30th 2021. The Navy wants to retire 15 ships, including seven guided-missile cruisers and four littoral combat ships, while procuring only two surface combatant ships and two submarines. (Congress' budget draft would buy another destroyer and limit the retirements.) Naval aviation procurement dropped 15.6% over 2021 even as the Navy speeds up F/A-18 retirements. The USS Ronald Reagan, based in Japan to counter a threat from China, is overseeing the Afghanistan withdrawal in the Middle East because no other aircraft carrier is available. China in recent years has focused on procuring advanced aircraft and has the world's third-largest air force. In addition, China has an extensive ground-based conventional missile force, including the DF-26, known as the "carrier killer" which is capable of striking Guam.

Elaine Luria (D-VA)—actually agrees with her, and appears to have stolen language directly from a Wall Street Journal op-ed Luria published four days prior to the email blast." The bill does not affect the Director's authority pursuant to the Act, renamed by the bill as the Corrections Private Services Act, to enter into private contracts for other correctional services, including those related to food service, medical care, transportation, sanitation, information systems, education and training programs, recreational or religious activities, financing, construction, or maintenance."
