SIGNIFICANT FINDINGS

Junge Is a Right-Wing Extremist

Junge Opposed Abortion Even In Cases of Rape and Incest

In 2022, Junge Said That He Personally Opposed Abortions Without Exceptions for Incest or Rape and Would Support Federal Legislation Prohibiting Federal Funding for Abortions. The Flint Journal reported in November 2022, “[Junge] campaigned on lowering government spending, fighting inflation, increasing energy independence and increasing security at the country’s southern border. Junge said he personally opposes abortion without exceptions for rape or incest, but that he would not support a federal ban, preferring it be left up to each state to shape abortion policy.” Junge said he was “opposed to abortion for any reason other than to protect the life of the pregnant person. But he [said] in the aftermath of the Supreme Court’s decision he does not believe Congress, even a Republican-controlled one, should try to pass federal law on the subject, instead leaving it to the states. ‘The only limit that I would directly go for (in federal law) is that we should not have taxpayer funding of abortions,’ Junge said.” [Flint Journal, 11/10/22; Detroit News, 11/9/22; Livingston County Press, 10/26/22]

In 2022, Junge Said He Did Not Support Exceptions for Rape and Incest, and Said the Legality of Abortions Should Be Left Up to the States. During his 2022 congressional campaign, Junge “said he does not support exceptions for rape or incest, but ‘there’s always an exception for the life of the mother,’ he said. If Roe is struck down, he favor[ed] leaving the issue to the states rather than enacting federal restrictions on abortion.” [Detroit News, 5/25/22]

In 2022, Junge Said Roe v. Wade “Made Up Rights.” During a 2022 debate in Howell, Michigan, Junge said about abortion rights, “And let me say one other thing, because of course our biggest obstacles is that federal court decision which makes the reelection of President Trump, so that he can continue to appoint federal judges that will adhere to the Constitution instead of made-up rights like we see in Roe versus Wade.” [Republican Accountability, YouTube, Paul Junge Howell MI Debate, 5/12/22] (VIDEO)

- **After the Overturning of Roe v. Wade, a Michigan 1931 Statute Outlawing All Abortions Except to Save the Life of the Woman Could Be Enforced if a Temporary Injunction Was Removed.** Following the U.S. Supreme Court’s decision overturning Roe v. Wade, the Detroit Free Press reported in June 2022, “Millions of Michiganders lost the national right to legal abortions Friday after the U.S. Supreme Court overruled Roe v. Wade, upending nearly 50 years of judicial precedent and changing the dynamics of reproductive health in the country for years to come. While abortions are still legal in Michigan, that could change at any moment if a temporary injunction blocking the enforcement of a state ban is lifted or otherwise removed. ... In theory, [the Supreme Court’s decision] would mean Michigan’s law criminalizing most abortions is again enforceable: A 1931 statute only allows abortions ‘necessary to preserve the life of such woman,’ a vague standard left untested by doctors and the courts for decades. The law on Michigan’s books does not allow exceptions for cases of rape or incest. However, a May ruling by a Michigan Court of Claims judge aims to temporarily block enforcement of that law. Although Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel already said she doesn’t plan to charge anyone under the law, it’s unclear whether law enforcement at the local level will test the court of claims’ injunction.” [Detroit Free Press, 6/25/22]
- **Many Medical Professionals in Michigan Feared How the State’s Vague Anti-Abortion Statute Could Be Applied in Cases Where Pregnant Women Faced Serious Health Complications.** The Detroit Free Press’ report continued, “[T]he subjective nature of what constitutes a procedure done to save a life leaves many medical professionals nervous and scared. ‘What does the risk of death have to be, and how imminent must it be? Might abortion be permissible in a patient with pulmonary hypertension, for whom we cite a 30 to 50% chance of dying with ongoing pregnancy? Or must it be 100%?’ wrote Dr. Lisa Harris, a gynecologist and abortion provider who works at the University of Michigan, in a recent article published by the New England Journal of Medicine. ‘When we diagnose a new cancer during pregnancy, some patients decide to end their pregnancy to permit immediate surgery, radiation, or chemotherapy, treatments that can cause significant fetal injury. Will abortion be permissible in these cases, or will patients have to delay treatment until after delivery? These patients’ increased risk of death may not

manifest for years, when they have a recurrence that would have been averted by immediate cancer treatment.’ Doctors working at Planned Parenthood are asking the same questions.” [[Detroit Free Press](#), 6/25/22]

In 2024, Junge Said Republicans Couldn’t Give “Up the Fight” Against Abortions, Said “We Suffered A Pretty Bad Setback With The Ballot Proposal [3] Last Time” and Advised the Party on Messaging Around the Issue.

When asked during a Bay City community meeting at which he spoke in February 2024 about the issue of abortions, Junge said, “That’s gonna continue. I mean, we have seen nationally, that was a tough issue here in Michigan, we suffered a pretty bad setback with the ballot proposal last time, and we’ve seen that across the country as well. So we can’t give up that fight. You know, one thing I know we have to do is continue to just have a message of love and support. That isn’t - I think sometimes on other side, it gets seen as an attack or as something that’s trying to be restrictive, and it’s more about, this is a life. And we want to support that life and we want to support people bringing that life into the world. And we need to make sure, we can’t shy away from that message. Junge’s 2024 Campaign Named Defending “Our God-Given Rights in the Constitution,” Including the Second Amendment and the Right to “Life,” a Top Priority. Junge’s 2024 campaign website listed “defending our God-given rights” in the constitution a top priority, writing, “Paul Junge is a strong supporter of the Second Amendment and opposes efforts to infringe on lawful gun ownership. He believes in the culture of life and knows that a child is a precious gift from God. Paul will fight to protect and defend all of our constitutional rights.” [[Pauljunge.com](#), accessed 7/18/24]

During His 2020 Campaign, Junge Vowed to “Support Life at All Times” if Elected. During his 2020 congressional campaign, Junge said, “I am pro-life. I support life at all times. If I’m a federal legislator, I will support life.” [Griffon News, 10/28/22]

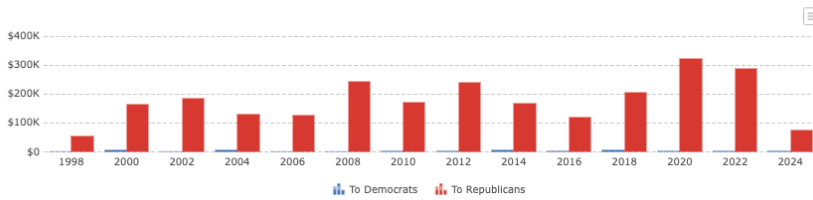
Junge Said “I Don’t Make Exceptions Other Than The Life Of The Mother” When Asked How He Feels About Exceptions To Abortion Bans. HOST: “Just one more question on this Mr. Junge, exceptions? Life of the mother, incest, rape? Junge Named “Defending the Right to Life” One of His Top Priorities in 2020. On his 2020 campaign website, Junge listed “defending the right to life” a top priority, writing, “I am pro-life. Life is a gift from God and there is no more vulnerable life than a baby in the womb. It’s truly horrific that statewide Democrat elected officials have supported allowing the decision of whether a baby lives to be made even after that little life is outside of the womb. Partial-birth abortions, taxpayer-funding of abortions, and no-reason abortion-on-demand needs to end. Junge Unsuccessfully Ran Against U.S. Rep. Dan Kildee in 2022 As a “Pro-Life, Pro-Second Amendment, Conservative Legislator” After Michigan’s 8th congressional district was redrawn following the 2020 census, Junge unsuccessfully ran against Democratic U.S. Rep. Dan Kildee in 2022. Junge won the Republican primary but lost to Kildee in the general election by ten percentage points. If elected, Junge vowed to be a “pro-life, pro-second amendment conservative legislator.” [Detroit Free Press, 7/15/24; Detroit Free Press, 11/18/23; Flint Journal, 8/3/22]

- **The Susan B. Anthony List Candidate Fund is an Anti-Abortion PAC Which Has Overwhelmingly Donated to Republican Candidates.** According to the Susan B. Anthony List Candidate Fund’s OpenSecrets PAC profile, it is an anti-abortion policy PAC which has donated overwhelmingly to Republican candidates since the 1990s. In 2022, in Anticipation of Roe v. Wade Being Overturned, Congressional Republicans Pushed for a “Strict Nationwide Ban.” The Washington Post reported in May 2022, “Leading anti-abortion groups and their allies in Congress have been meeting behind the scenes to plan a national strategy that would kick in if the Supreme Court rolls back abortion rights this summer, including a push for a strict nationwide ban on the procedure if Republicans retake power in Washington. The effort, activists say, is designed to bring a fight that has been playing out largely in the courts and state legislatures to the national political stage – rallying conservatives around the issue in the midterms and pressuring potential 2024 GOP presidential candidates to take a stand. The discussions reflect what activists describe as an emerging consensus in some corners of the anti-abortion movement to push for hardline measures that will truly end a practice they see as murder while rejecting any proposals seen as half-measures. ... While a number of states have recently approved laws to ban abortion after 15 weeks of pregnancy – the limit established in the Mississippi legislation at the heart of the case pending before the high court – some activists and Republican lawmakers now say those laws are not ambitious enough for the next phase of the antiabortion movement.” [[Washington Post](https://www.washingtonpost.com), 5/2/22]

Congressional Republicans Introduced the Life at Conception Act in 2022, Which Would Give All Fetuses the Legal Rights of Personhood Outlined in the 14th Amendment. In 2022, in anticipation of the U.S. Supreme Court overturning Roe v. Wade, congressional Republicans introduced “the Life at Conception Act, which would recognize a fetus as a person with equal protections under the 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.” As of May 2022, the legislation had been introduced in both chambers of Congress and was co-sponsored by 19 Republican senators and more than 100 Republicans in the House. Junge Opposed Universal Background Checks & Assault Weapons Ban

Junge’s 2020 Congressional Campaign Was Endorsed by the NRA Political Victory Fund, Which Praised His Opposition to Semi-Automatic Weapon Bans and Universal Background Checks. The National Rifle Association’s Political Victory Fund endorsed Junge in his 2020 congressional campaign, pointing to his support of concealed carry reciprocity legislation, opposition to “government bans and confiscation” of “lawfully-owned semi-automatic firearms, magazines and ammunition,” opposition to universal background checks and support for “expanding access for hunting and shooting, benefitting sportsmen throughout Michigan and the country.” [[NRAPVF.org](https://www.nrapvf.org), accessed 7/18/24]

In 2024, Junge Said He Supported the Second Amendment and Argued That the Most Gun Violence Occurred in “Areas with the Most Gun Control.” During his 2024 congressional campaign, the Midland Daily News asked Junge about his stance on gun control and community safety. Junge replied, “I support the right to bear arms. Communities are safer when law-abiding citizens are allowed to defend themselves. It’s not a coincidence that the most gun violence occurs in areas with the most gun control. Gun-free zones where a police officer isn’t present are targets. The people who don’t abide by the gun-free zone sign are usually the ones wreaking havoc; a sign doesn’t stop a criminal, only the law-abiding. We need to focus on enforcing existing laws and ensuring that dangerous individuals do not have access to firearms, while respecting the constitutional rights of responsible, law-abiding gun owners.” [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

Junge Touted His Endorsements from the NRA and His Support of the Second Amendment in 2024. When asked during a community meeting in February 2024 about his relationship with the NRA, Junge said, “Been endorsed by Gun Owners of America and the NRA when I’ve run before. Believe not just in the 2nd amendment but all the amendments. Believe [anyone] should be able to have his gun and go duck hunting. Not just about hunting, we gotta be able to have guns for self-defense, to have a firearm for whatever purpose, whatever legal purpose.” [Paul Junge, Bay County Republican Party Meeting, 2/1/24] (AUDIO)

In 2020, Junge Called Red-Flag Laws "Unconstitutional." On his 2020 campaign website, Junge named protecting the Second Amendment a top priority and wrote, "I am pro-Second Amendment and will fight efforts to attack lawful gun ownership, whether by unconstitutional red flag laws or any other means. The United States and Michigan Constitutions resolutely defend the right of law-abiding citizens to own firearms, and efforts to remove this fundamental right strikes at the core of our freedom as Americans." In 2020, Junge Received \$2,000 from the NRA and National Shooting Sports Foundation PAC. According to federal campaign finance records, during his 2020 congressional campaign, Junge's committee received \$1,000 from the National Shooting Sports Foundation PAC. The same year Junge's campaign committee also received \$1,000 from the NRA Political Victory Fund. [FEC.gov, accessed 7/22/24]

In 2022, Junge Received \$5,950 from the National Rifle Association and the National Shooting Sports Foundation. According to federal campaign finance records, Junge's 2022 congressional campaign received a \$4,950 donation from the National Rifle Association of America Political Victory Fund and a \$1,000 donation from the National Shooting Sports Foundation, Inc. Junge Spread COVID-19 and Vaccine Disinformation

In 2020, Junge Said That Some Vaccines Needed to Be "Carefully Looked At" and Questioned the Need for Immunizations to Prevent Cervical Cancer. While speaking in March 2020, Junge said on the topic of vaccines, "I think you look at what modern medicine was able to do for eradicating polio ... there is a matter of public health with some exceptions for conscience, for medical reasons but some problems that are occurring with other types of immunizations I think do deserve some careful looking. I mean I don't have children of my own so I'm not as personally involved with this, but I understand that for a cervical cancer that they are requiring immunizations and I'm like, 'wait a minute, that's not a communicable disease that we need to necessarily have immunization for everyone.'" - **Medical Professionals Recommend Getting Vaccinated Against HPV, a Communicable Disease Which Can Cause Cervical Cancer.** The Mayo Clinic wrote about the HPV vaccine, "Human papillomavirus, also called HPV, is spread by sexual activity. Some strains of HPV cause genital warts. Other HPV strains can cause cancers. Most of the time, the body can find and clear out HPV. Junge Opposed Common-Sense Environmental Policies That Protect Michigan's Waterways And Has Been Backed By DC Insiders And Special Interests Who Oppose Efforts To Preserve And Restore Those Waterways

In 2024, Junge Said He Supported All Energy Sources, Including Gas, Nuclear, Renewable, and "Pipelines Like Line 5." Junge's 2024 campaign website stated, "Paul Junge will fight for programs designed to protect the Great Lakes. Nationally, Paul supports an 'all of the above' energy approach that includes more exploration, natural gas, nuclear, renewables, and safe pipelines like Line 5. Paul encourages private sector innovation toward renewable energy sources rather than government mandates resulting in higher taxes and job-killing regulations." [Pauljunge.com, accessed 7/18/24]

- **Line 5 Is an Oil and Gas Pipeline Across Michigan Owned and Operated by Enbridge Energy.** According to the state of Michigan, "Enbridge Energy's Line 5 pipeline was built in 1953 and extends for 645 miles across the state of Michigan. Line 5, which is part of Enbridge's Lakehead System, begins in Superior, Wisconsin, and ends in Sarnia, Canada. ... Line 5 transports up to 540,000 barrels – or 22.68 million gallons – per day of light crude oil and natural

gas liquids, according to Enbridge. Some of the natural gas liquids are refined into propane and used in the Upper Peninsula, while other products are routed for processing at oil refineries in Detroit and Toledo, Ohio. ... Some Michigan drilling companies use Line 5 to transport the oil they produce.” [[Michigan.gov](https://www.michigan.gov), accessed 7/19/24]

- **The Energy Company That Owned Line 5 Was Responsible for One of the Largest Inland Oil Spills in U.S. History in Michigan in 2010; The Spill Led to Increased Concern About the Safety of Line 5.** “In 2010, about 21,000 barrels of heavy crude oil spilled into a tributary of the Kalamazoo River near Marshall from a line owned by Enbridge. As a result of the Kalamazoo River spill – one of the largest inland spills in U.S. history – the State and Enbridge in May 2015 entered into a \$75 million Consent Judgement. That was followed in July 2016 with a Consent Decree between Enbridge and the federal government to resolve claims related to the Marshall spill. Enbridge agreed to pay \$110 million on spill prevention and pipeline operations in the Great Lakes region and a \$161 million fine. Cleanup efforts are ongoing and are estimated at more than \$1 billion. The spill prompted increased attention and focus on the potential ecological and economic damage that could occur if the Line 5 pipeline running beneath the Strait of Mackinac failed. The Marshall pipeline spill led to the creation of the Michigan Petroleum Pipeline Task Force with the mandate to take a closer look at pipelines transporting petroleum products around the state, and specifically Line 5.” [[Michigan.gov](https://www.michigan.gov), accessed 7/19/24]

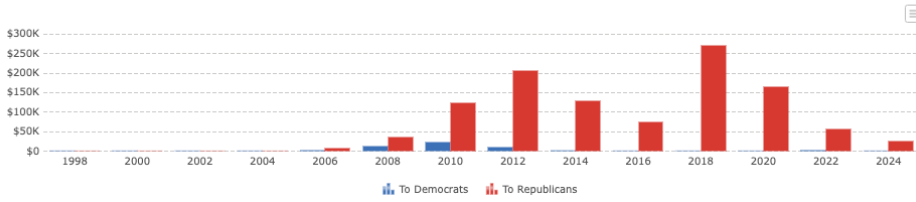
The League of Conservation Voters Financed an Ad Against Junge in 2020 Criticizing His Connections to “Washington Insiders Who Opposed” Efforts to Preserve Michigan’s Waterways and Clean Up Pollution and Chemicals. During his 2020 campaign for Michigan’s 8th congressional district, the League of Conservation Voters “Victory Fund and House Majority PAC launched a ... \$880,000 TV ad in opposition to Paul Junge’s campaign against Michigan Rep. Elissa Slotkin.” The League of Conservation Voters’ national campaigns director said about the race between Slotkin and Junge, “Paul Junge’s connection to Washington insiders who have opposed efforts to clean up toxic cancer-causing PFAS chemicals across Michigan puts the health and safety of our communities at risk. We need to keep Rep. Elissa Slotkin in Washington, fighting to clean up these dangerous forever chemicals and protect our communities – especially communities of color.” The executive director of the House Majority PAC similarly stated, “Clean water is as fundamental to the health of families and children as anything else, so it’s just unacceptable that Paul Junge has placed the special interests ahead of efforts to clean up cancer-causing chemicals in Michigan. Paul Junge keeps siding with the polluters who are blocking efforts to clean up Michigan’s water, while Elissa Slotkin has worked tirelessly to get this funding and make a difference for Michigan families.” [League of Conservation Voters, 9/23/20]

In 2022, Junge Vowed to Expand Oil and Gas Leasing on Public Lands and Resume Work on the Keystone Pipeline. During his 2022 congressional run, Junge said that if elected he would “work to reduce government spending, lower taxes, expand oil and gas leasing on public lands and resume construction of the Keystone Pipeline, which was canceled by the Biden administration.” [Detroit News, 10/18/22]

During His 2022 Campaign, Junge Supported “Clean Coal” and the Keystone Pipeline. When asked during his 2022 congressional campaign what policies he supported to meet U.S. energy needs while protecting the environment for future generations, Junge replied, “There is no reason for the United States to be facing an energy crisis. We have the energy to sustain ourselves and we should promote Ultra Clean Coal, nuclear energy, oil, and natural gas. Granting energy exploration permits on Federal land and approving the Keystone pipeline brings down the price of distribution, creates jobs in the US & lowers gas prices. In Congress, Trump needs trusted partners to put America first. Conservative Paul Junge, pro-Trump and proud of it. The state’s Republican gubernatorial, attorney general and secretary of state candidates also spoke at the rally alongside Trump. Junge Spoke at a 2020 Trump Rally in Lansing, Michigan. In October 2020, Trump hosted a campaign rally at an airport in Lansing, Michigan. Junge spoke at the rally and “led a ‘four more years’ chant and then said if he wins, he will tell House Speaker Nancy Pelosi to return to her San Francisco hair salon. Pelosi was criticized for getting her hair done when salons were supposed to be closed. Junge’s [speech] was followed by Republican National Committee Chairwoman Ronna Romney McDaniel.” At the rally, Trump called Junge a “really good” congressional candidate. Junge Worked in the Trump Administration and Defended Trump Against Criticisms

Junge Was a Political Appointee in the Trump Administration and Dismissed Questions About President Trump’s Actions on January 6th. The Midland Daily News reported in 2022, “During the Trump administration, Junge worked as a political appointee in the Department of Homeland Security. When asked about the former president’s actions on Jan. 6th

prior to the insurrection, he said ‘it almost never comes up as he campaigns in the 8th district. I really want to focus on policies while he was president, not the perceptions or the accusations on a particular day,’ he said. ‘To the extent that anyone on that was committing crimes – I’m opposed to that, and I think they have to get prosecuted.’” [Midland Daily News, 7/18/22]

During His 2020 Campaign, Junge Defended Trump Against Calls for Impeachment Over His Alleged Quid-Pro-Quo with the President of Ukraine. In an interview shortly after he declared his candidacy in 2020 for Michigan’s 8th congressional district, Junge “said he was a supporter of Trump’s and that he took Trump’s remarks to [Ukrainian President] Zelensky as part of a ‘broad discussion about looking into corruption.’ He added that different people might have different views on that, but said even if Trump did something ‘mildly inappropriate, it hardly rises to an impeachable offense.’” [Times Herald, 11/16/19]

Praised Trump’s Tax Bill Which Raised Taxes on Everyone But the Ultra-Wealthy

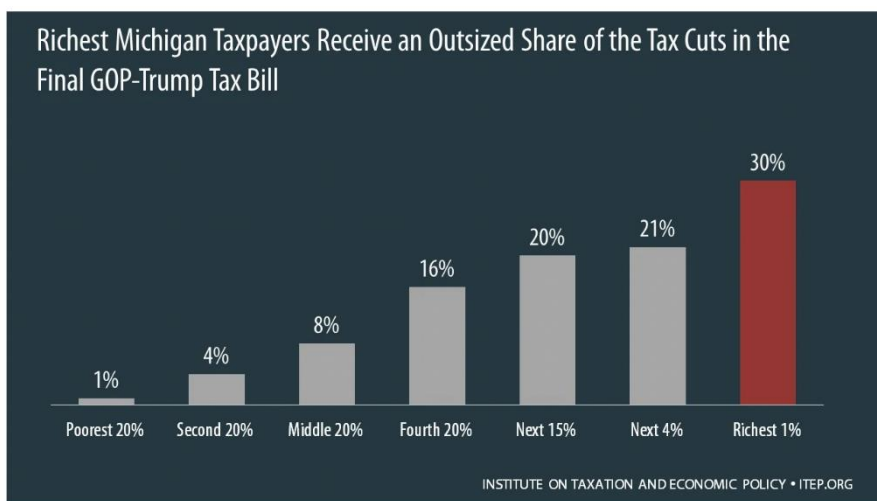
In 2020, Junge Called for Making Tax Cuts for Individuals Permanent and Supported Trump’s Economic Agenda. Junge’s 2020 campaign website stated in part, “President Trump’s economy produced low unemployment and higher incomes, particularly at the lower end of the wage scale, by encouraging hard work, entrepreneurship, investment, and job creation through low taxes and the elimination of burdensome regulations. Socialism, tax hikes, and crippling regulations would destroy any hope of a robust economic recovery, and we need a strong recovery to provide quality jobs, hope and opportunity for every American. I will support policies that simplify our tax code and make tax cuts for individuals permanent.” MLive similarly reported about Junge’s economic agenda in 2020, “Junge supports policies enacted by Trump to ‘build a booming economy,’ according to his campaign website. He also supports policies that simplify the tax code, and ensure trade agreements benefit American workers per the website. Junge supports incentives to encourage businesses to bring jobs back to the U.S. and reduces America’s reliance on Chinese goods.” [Pauljunge.com, accessed 8/8/20; MLive.com, 7/17/20]

In 2020, Junge Praised the Republican’s Tax Bill and Said He Would Support the Party’s Economic Agenda if Elected. During the 2020 Republican candidate forum among candidates for Michigan’s 8th district, Junge said on the subject of the economy and the Republican’s tax bill, “And of course, the tax reform that the Republican Congress passed in the previous Congress is contributing to that as well. Record low unemployment. Wages on the rise. That’s all President Trump’s leadership. - **The Congressional Budget Office Estimated the Republican’s Tax Bill Would Increase the National Debt By \$1.9 Trillion.** The Hill reported about the Republicans’ “Tax Cuts and Jobs Act” in April 2018, “The GOP’s signature tax law is projected to increase the national debt by \$1.9 trillion between 2018 and 2028, according to a new report by the Congressional Budget Office (CBO). According to the report, the tax law would cost the government \$2.3 trillion in revenues, but economic growth would offset that figure by about \$461 billion. ... Some Republicans argued vociferously during the tax debate that tax cuts in the bill would pay for themselves, with Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin going so far as to say that they would ultimately reduce the national debt and deficits. Others estimated that a dynamic score of the tax law – one that incorporated macroeconomic effects – would reduce the \$1.5 trillion cost of the tax cut down to \$1 trillion in added debt. ‘The CBO’s latest report exposes the scam behind the rosy rhetoric from Republicans that their tax bill would pay for itself,’ Senate Minority Leader Charles Schumer (D-N.Y.) said in a statement Monday.” [Hill, 4/9/18]
- **The Trump Administration’s Treasury Department Estimated the Tax Bill to Cost \$2.3 Trillion.** Politico reported in February 2018, “Between new cost estimates and the White House’s own budget numbers, the wheels are coming off Republican claims that President Donald Trump’s tax cuts will pay for themselves by generating increased growth and government revenues over the next decade. ‘Not only will this tax plan pay for itself but it will pay down debt,’ Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin famously boasted in September. But his own department’s analysts now peg the 10-year cost at \$2.3 trillion given the administration’s assumption that tax breaks for individuals and large estates will be extended past 2025. Politico’s own calculations, working entirely from data in the 2018 and 2019 budgets, indicate that the added revenues generated by the tax cuts themselves would fall substantially short of matching \$2.3 trillion.” [Politico.com, 2/28/18]

A Nobel Laureate in Economics Said the Tax Bill Would “Increase Taxes on Most Americans” Except for the Ultra-Wealthy. Mr. Joseph Stiglitz, a Nobel laureate in economics and professor at Columbia, wrote an opinion piece in the New York Times in October 2020 entitled, “Republicans, Not Biden, Are About to Raise Your Taxes.” The article read in part, “The Trump administration has a dirty little secret: It’s not just planning to increase taxes on most Americans. The increase has already been signed, sealed and delivered, buried in the pages of the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act. President Trump and his congressional allies hoodwinked us. The law they passed initially lowered taxes for most Americans, but it built in automatic, stepped tax increases every two years that begin in 2021 and that by 2027 would affect nearly everyone but people at the top of the economic hierarchy. All taxpayer income groups with incomes of \$75,000 and under – that’s about 65 percent of taxpayers – will face a higher tax rate in 2027 than in 2019. For most, in fact, it’s a delayed tax increase dressed up as a tax cut. ... Looking at the analyses of the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office and the Joint Committee on Taxation at the time the December 2017 tax bill was enacted, we see very clearly how different income groups are affected by the Trump tax plan. And it’s disturbing. The current poverty line for a family of four is \$26,200: People with incomes between \$10,000 and \$30,000 – nearly one-quarter of Americans – are among those scheduled to pay a higher average tax rate in 2021 than in years before the tax ‘cut’ was passed. The C.B.O. and Joint Committee estimated that those with an income of \$20,000 to \$30,000 would owe an extra \$365 next year – these are people who are struggling just to pay rent and put food on the table. ... By 2027, when the law’s provisions are set to be fully enacted, with the stealth tax increases complete, the country will be neatly divided into two groups: Those making over \$100,000 will on average get a tax cut. Those earning under \$100,000 – an income bracket encompassing three-quarters of taxpayers – will not. At the same time, Trump has given his peers, people with annual incomes in excess of \$1 million dollars, or the top 0.3 percent of the country, a huge gift: The Joint Committee on Taxation estimated the average tax rate in 2019 for this group to be 2.3 percentage points lower than before the tax cut, saving the average taxpayer in this group over \$64,000 – more than the average American family makes in a year.” [[New York Times](#), 10/31/20]

The Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy Estimated That the Richest One Percent of Michigan Residents Would Receive the Largest Benefit from Trump’s Tax Bill; The Bill Would Increase Taxes on Low and Middle-Income Michiganders. In a December 2017 analysis of the GOP tax bill, the Institute on Taxation and Economic Policy stated, “The final tax bill that Republicans in Congress are poised to approve would provide most of its benefits to high-income households and foreign investors while raising taxes on many low- and middle-income Americans. ... The graphs below show that the tax cuts in the bill are tilted dramatically in favor of the richest Michigan residents while the tax increases fall more heavily on lower-income Michigan families.” [[ITEP.org](#), 12/16/17]

Corporations Were Expected to See \$1 Trillion in Tax Cuts from Trump’s Tax Bill. The Washington Post reported about corporate benefits expected to come from Trump’s tax bill in December 2017, “A massive tax cut for corporations: Starting on Jan. 1, 2018, big businesses’ tax rate would fall from 35 percent to just 21 percent, the largest one-time rate cut in U.S. history for the nation’s largest companies. The House and Senate bills originally had the big-business tax rate

falling to 20 percent, but Republicans were not able to make the math work to keep the rate that low and start it right away in the new year, so they compromised by moving the rate to 21 percent. It still amounts to roughly a \$1 trillion tax cut for businesses over the next decade.” [[Washington Post](#), 12/15/17]

- Uihlein Is a “Ultra-Conservative” Republican Megadonor.** Forbes reported about Uihlein and his wife in 2018, “You may not have heard of Richard Uihlein, but he’s one of the most influential names in [the 2018 midterm elections]. The ultra-conservative Wisconsin businessman, alongside his wife, Elizabeth, has poured at least \$5 million into the [elections], making the couple the fifth largest spenders in the most expensive midterm elections on record. - In 2020, Hawley Was the First Senator to Announce Plans to Object to Certifying the Results of the Presidential Election.** The New York Times reported in December 2020, “Senator Josh Hawley, Republican of Missouri, announced on Wednesday that he would object to Congress’ certification of the Electoral College results on Jan. 6, a move that is unlikely to alter the outcome of the 2020 election but will create a divisive spectacle that could result in a short delay in affirming President-elect Joseph R. Biden Jr.’s victory. Mr. Hawley’s decision elevates President Trump’s repeated false claims of a stolen election tainted by pervasive voter fraud, and it answers Mr. Trump’s demand that Republican lawmakers move more aggressively to defend him. In a statement on Wednesday, Mr. Hawley, an ambitious freshman senator, said he would object to the certification of Pennsylvania’s electoral votes, though he did not specify whether he would include other states in the objection. ‘Millions of voters concerned about election integrity deserve to be heard,’ Mr. Hawley said. ‘I will object on Jan. 6 on their behalf.’” [[New York Times](https://www.nytimes.com), 12/30/20]
- The Guardian Reported that Hawley “Fanned the Flames for Diehard Trump Voters” After the 2020 Presidential Election.** The Guardian published an article in January 2021 following the Jan. 6th insurrection entitled “Josh Hawley fanned the flames for diehard Trump voters. Will his gambit pay off?” The article read in part, “Josh Hawley, a 41-year-old US senator from Missouri, has spent the last four years positioning himself as one of the political heirs to Donald Trump – a more polished successor who can unite rightwing nationalism with populist economic policies. ... Hawley was the first Republican senator – soon joined by Ted Cruz – to announce that he would challenge the certification of the election results in Congress last Wednesday. Democrats, as well as several of Hawley’s Republican colleagues in the Senate, lambasted Hawley’s decision as irresponsible, inflammatory and politically cynical. There is no credible evidence of fraud in the presidential election, which Hawley, a Yale-trained lawyer, presumably knows. He pressed on, however, defending his vote against certification as a symbolic gesture and noting that Democrats made similar challenges after Republican presidential wins in 2000, 2004, and 2016. On his way to the US Capitol on the day of the certification vote, he raised a fist in salute to pro-Trump protestors gathered nearby. ... Now, with five people dead, human excrement smeared on the walls of a building many Americans regard as close to sacred, and widespread calls for Trump to resign or face impeachment, Hawley may have succeeded in casting himself as a mini-Trump – and is facing an accordingly fierce backlash. Although he condemned the violence at the Capitol, Hawley doubled down on his decision to challenge the election. ‘I will never apologize for giving voice to the millions of Missourians and Americans who have concerns about the integrity of our elections,’ he said in a public statement after the riot. ‘That’s my job, and I will keep doing it.’” [[Guardian](https://www.theguardian.com), 1/12/21]

- While Serving as Missouri Attorney General, Hawley Led a Lawsuit Against the Affordable Care Act Which Would Have Gutted Health Care for 2.5 Million Missourians.** The St. Louis American reported in October 2018, “Missouri Attorney General Josh Hawley doubled down on his lawsuit to remove health-care protections for nearly 2.5 million Missourians, while failing to provide any alternatives beyond the expectation of Congress passing an additional bill to do what the ACA already accomplishes. Asked during a press call on Monday, October 1 whether he has regrets about supporting the lawsuit brought by 20 GOP-led states that would overturn ObamaCare, including its pre-existing condition protections, Hawley said ‘No,’ according to The Hill. ‘Listen, Republicans have pledged for years to repeal and replace Obamacare,’ The Hill reported Hawley saying. ... Hawley calls for eliminating the federal essential health benefits, which require insurers to cover a range of health services and help prevent insurers from simply excluding coverage for a pre-existing condition from someone’s insurance plan. ‘Hawley continues to dodge all questions about why he wants to remove protections from 2.5 million Missourians with pre-existing conditions,’ said Tom Bastian, spokesperson for Protect Our Care Missouri. ... Oral arguments were held on September 5, in *Texas v. Azar, et al.*, a lawsuit that Hawley is using taxpayer money to pursue that would strip all consumer protections provided by the Affordable Care Act. The lawsuit was prompted by last year’s tax bill, which included a provision to remove the health insurance mandate. In addition to preventing insurance companies from discriminating against people who suffer from a pre-existing condition, the Affordable Care Act prevents insurance companies from denying coverage to someone who has received treatment for alcohol or drug abuse, or if they had a mental illness. The following protections will be eliminated if Hawley’s lawsuit is successful:
 - Protections for 2,495,400 Missourians with pre-existing conditions, if they buy coverage on their own.
 - Improvements to Medicare, including reduced costs for prescription drugs.
 - Allowing kids to stay on their parents’ insurance until age 26.
 - Ban on annual and lifetime limits. Ban on insurance discrimination against women.
 - Limits on out-of-pocket costs.
 - Rules to hold insurance companies accountable.
 - Small business tax credits.

In response to the divorce filing, first reported by The Detroit News, the Michigan Democratic Party noted on social media that Bezotte voted against legislation that prevents domestic abusers from owning or purchasing guns. ‘Now his wife of 50 years is accusing him of physical and emotional abuse. Voters deserve answers – including whether he used his position as county Sheriff to prevent earlier reports?’ they questioned. ... Junge Supported Trump’s Economic Agenda, Which Threatened Medicare and Social Security

Junge Vowed to “Reduce and Cut Federal Spending” if Elected in 2024. At a meet and greet campaign event in July 2024, Junge said, “Over the last 30 years, we’ve been piling on the debt, we’re now at the point where the interest payments on that debt is going to be the single biggest expense in the federal government. That has to be a priority. ... We’ll have to look through dozens of agencies and look for cuts. The other thing we need to stop our deficits is to have a vigorously growing economy. When we have a growing economy, the need for outlays goes down, we have an honest and

decent tax system where revenues are going up. With Biden, we have Bidenflation, people working two or three jobs, it's a disaster in slow motion. In 2020, Junge Praised the Republican's Tax Bill and Said He Would Support the Party's Economic Agenda if Elected. The Republican Study Committee's 2022 Budget Proposal Recommended Raising the Retirement Age for Social Security. Mother Jones reported in July 2022, "A little-noticed budget document, the Blueprint to Save America, released in June by the Republican Study Committee, detailed the [Republican party's] priorities. Since nearly 75 percent of the Republican House lawmakers are RSC members, these priorities are shared by a majority of the GOP caucus. The 122-page manifesto, containing a laundry list of longstanding conservative desires, calls for significantly reducing the size of America's social safety net, drastically limiting abortion access nationwide, effectively throwing in the towel on combatting climate change, raising the age requirement to receive full Social Security benefits, cracking down on transgender rights, and making it easier for Americans to carry concealed weapons. ... The RSC Calls for raising the retirement age by three months per year through 2040, at that point the new age requirement to receive full Social Security benefits for people born after 1978 would be 70. After 2040, the group recommends linking the new retirement age to modern life expectancies, noting increasing life expectancies since monthly Social Security payments were first distributed in 1940." In 2021, Junge Said it Was “A False Choice” to Say the Affordable Care Act Was the Best Option for People with Preexisting Conditions. During the final debate in 2020 between Junge and Rep. Elissa Slotkin, Junge said when asked about the Affordable Care Act and ensuring health care coverage for people with preexisting conditions, “This is another partisan false choice offered by the Congresswoman [Elissa Slotkin].” Junge “said he [would] support parts of the Affordable Care Act if [it was] the best option to protect people with preexisting conditions, but he [said] the Affordable Care Act as the best option [was] a false choice.” [[Michigan Radio](#), 10/7/20]

During a 2020 radio interview, Junge was asked about his opposition to Medicare for all and if he was in favor of “disbanding or repealing the Affordable Care Act or Obamacare?” Junge responded, “Well, look, I guess what I would say is, is that’s ... that’s kind of a partisan fight of the last decade. And ... that’s not a partisan fight that I’m going to engage in, I want to try to find the best solution possible for the people of the district. And if the Affordable Care Act or some part of it needs to be a part of how we provide health insurance and health care for the people, the eighth district, and Americans broadly, then that’s what I would do. But if we look at the Affordable Care Act, and just see that it just has failed in its promises, and that really a different approach would be much better, to provide health insurance and health care for people, I would pursue that. I’m not hung up on the Affordable Care Act, I’m more focused on seeing that we get solutions for the people of the 8th district.” [[WHMI.com](#), 8/23/20]

In 2020, Rep. Elissa Slotkin Criticized Junge for His Vague Stance on Protecting the Affordable Care Act. During a debate between Rep. Elissa Slotkin and Junge during the 2020 race for Michigan’s 8th congressional district, the two candidates participated in a debate. On stage, “Slotkin fired at Junge over his stance on healthcare and a Trump administration-backed lawsuit to overturn the Affordable Care Act, saying that he has not been specific enough about where he stands. Junge said he [would] protect people with preexisting conditions but did not take a definitive stance on Trump’s lawsuit. ... ‘Mr. Junge doesn’t have the guts to actually be clear, and it’s people’s lives,’ Slotkin said, also urging him to clearly say whether he is against striking down the ACA. Junge said he supported parts of the ACA, but said it is a ‘fallacy’ to think it is the only way to protect people with preexisting conditions. ‘If the court strikes it down, we need to find a different way,’ he said, adding that he supports a series of proposals from House Republicans that he argued [would] protect people with preexisting conditions.” [[Livingston County Press](#), 10/11/20]

In the Midst of the COVID Pandemic, the Trump Administration Asked the Supreme Court to Strike Down the Affordable Care Act, Including the Act’s Protections for Individuals with Pre-Existing Conditions. The New York Times reported in November 2020, “The Trump administration asked the Supreme Court late Thursday to overturn the Affordable Care Act – a move that, if successful, would bring a permanent end to the health insurance program popularly known as Obamacare and wipe out coverage for as many as 23 million Americans. In an 82-page brief submitted an hour before a midnight deadline, the administration joined Republican officials in Texas and 17 other states in arguing that in 2017, Congress, then controlled by Republicans, had rendered the law unconstitutional when it zeroed out the tax penalty for not buying insurance – the so-called individual mandate. ... In his brief, Solicitor General Noel J. Francisco argued that the health law’s two remaining central provisions are now invalid because Congress intended that all three work together. ... The Texas case is by far the most serious challenge to date for the 10-year-old health care law, President

Barack Obama's signature domestic achievement. ... 'President Trump and the Republicans' campaign to rip away the protections and benefits of the Affordable Care Act in the middle of the coronavirus crisis is an act of unfathomable cruelty,' Ms. Pelosi said in a statement late Thursday night, after the administration's brief was filed. 'If President Trump gets his way,' she added, '130 million Americans with pre-existing conditions will lose the A.C.A.'s lifesaving protections and 23 million Americans will lose their health coverage entirely. ... When the case was argued in the trial court, the Trump administration, though a defendant, did not defend the law, siding instead with the plaintiffs. But unlike Texas and the other states, the administration argued at the time that only the law's protections for people with pre-existing conditions should be struck down, but that the rest of the law, including its expansion of Medicaid, should survive. Last year, however, the administration expanded its opposition, telling a federal appeals court that the entire law should be invalidated.' [[New York Times](#), 6/26/20]

If Not for the ACA, Individuals with Pre-Existing Conditions, Including Those Who Had Recovered from COVID, Could Be Charged Thousands More for Coverage. The Center for American Progress reported on the potential impacts of Republican efforts to replace the ACA in 2017, "Repealing protections for people with pre-existing health conditions could be on Congress' agenda as early as next week. Facing pressure from the Trump administration, Congress may be ready once again to try to repeal the Affordable Care Act, or ACA. This time around, Congress is discussing including an amendment that would allow insurance companies in the individual market to charge higher rates to consumers based on health status. Under the deal that was leaked, states would be able to waive protections for pre-existing conditions for any reason, as long as they set up a high-risk pool or participated in a federal risk-sharing program. Before the ACA, all but seven states allowed insurance companies to charge higher premiums to people with pre-existing conditions. Without pre-existing condition protections, health care coverage could become prohibitively expensive for those who need it most. People with asthma, a relatively minor chronic condition, would face a markup of about \$4,000 for coverage, while those with severe illnesses such as heart trouble or cancer would face premiums tens of thousands of dollars above standard rates." In 2020, the Associated Press noted that "COVID-19 could have stamped a person 'uninsurable' if not for the Affordable Care Act" and reported that without the law, "people who recovered from COVID-19 and tried to purchase an individual health insurance policy could be turned down, charged higher premiums or have follow-up care excluded from coverage." The Center for American Progress Estimated that 720,000 Michiganders Would Lose Health Coverage if the Affordable Care Act Was Repealed; More Than 4 Million Michiganders with Preexisting Conditions Could Face Higher Premiums and Be Denied Coverage. The Center for American Progress estimated in March 2020 that if the Affordable Care Act was repealed, "720,000 people in Michigan would lose coverage, raising the state's uninsured rate among the nonelderly population from 7.7 percent to 16.6 percent." The Center also estimated that "4.1 million people in Michigan with preexisting conditions could face higher premiums, face benefit exclusions, or be denied coverage altogether ... if they ever need[ed] to turn to the individual market for coverage." If the Affordable Care Act was repealed, "the tax revenue that funds the ACA's expansion of health coverage would go back into the pockets of the wealthy, with millionaires receiving tax cuts averaging \$46,000 each." If the Affordable Care Act Was Repealed and Replaced with Republican Legislation, Brookings Estimated Seniors Could Pay Up to Five Times More for Their Health Care Than Younger Patients. Brookings reported about potential consequences for seniors if the Affordable Care Act was repealed and replaced with a Republican-led program, "Nearly every ACA replacement plan involves widening the age rating bands that currently restrict insurers from setting premiums for the oldest adults in the individual market (64 year olds) that are more than three times the premium they charge a 21-year old for the same coverage. Proposals suggest changing the current 3:1 ratio to 5:1 or 6:1 or eliminating it altogether. The Washington Post reported in 2016, “The number of people without health insurance could more than double under Republican plans to repeal President Obama’s Affordable Care Act, reaching nearly 59 million – or more than one in four Americans, according to a new analysis published Wednesday. ... About four in five of those who would become uninsured following repeal do not have a college degree, the report, from the Health Policy Center at the nonpartisan Urban Institute, projects. Two-thirds live in a household with at least one person working full time. The ACA, also known as Obamacare, provides subsidies to help subscribers afford the cost of individual policies. The law also required all Americans, with a few exceptions, to have insurance. Without the subsidies or the requirement that all Americans have coverage, experts say the healthiest customers would cease buying insurance if they do not have policies through their employers or through the government. As a result, insurers would be forced to increase premiums to cover the cost of treating those sicker patients who remain. Many would find they could no longer afford coverage. ... Of the 30 million who would become uninsured, 55 percent are poor or nearly poor, with incomes under twice the federal poverty threshold. ... Junge “Strongly Opposed” Inflation Reduction Act That Reduced Prescription Drug Prices

In 2022, Junge Said He “Strongly Opposed” the Inflation Reduction Act. In August 2022, Junge posted on his Twitter, “The Congressional Budget Office is estimating that the Inflation Reduction Act is going to lead to \$20 billion in new taxes on the middle class. - **The Inflation Reduction Act Was Expected to Lower Prescription Drugs for Millions of Americans and Allowed the Government to Negotiate Drug Prices.** NBC News reported in August 2022, “The Inflation Reduction Act, signed into law by President Joe Biden, is set to lower the cost of prescription drugs – including cancer medications, blood thinners and insulin – for millions of Americans, experts say. Exorbitant drug prices in the United States are a key reason many people in the U.S. are forced to skip or delay filling their needed prescriptions. A Kaiser Family Foundation poll published last month found that nearly 1 in 2 adults report difficulty affording their health care expenses, including their prescribed medications. Under the new law, the U.S. government is now able to negotiate prices on the costliest prescription drugs, cap costs at \$2,000 per year for people on Medicare, limit the monthly cost of insulin to \$35 for seniors, and extend subsidies for people buying their own health coverage through the Affordable Care Act, also known as Obamacare. According to records from the Federal Procurement Data System, All Star Maintenance, founded by Junge’s father, and its subsidiaries received \$316,440,865.60 in award obligations from federal contracts with the U.S. Department of Defense between 1991 and 2009, when Junge’s father sold the company. B) Healthcare insurance funded by the government should be available for all who want it, along with private healthcare options. C) Medicaid and Medicare should remain available, but no other taxpayer-funded programs are necessary. D) Taxpayer-funded health care should be abolished in all forms, and Medicare and Medicaid should be de-funded.” Junge selected statement C. Junge Is a California Millionaire Out of Touch with Michiganders

Raised in California & Only Returned to Michigan to Run for Office

Junge Lived in California as Recently as 2018. “[Junge’s] last stint living in California was when his father was ill in 2018, his campaign said. Following his father’s death in 2019, Junge returned to Michigan and challenged Democratic U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin of Holly for her seat in 2020 but lost. He moved [in 2022] to Grand Blanc Township after launching his campaign in Michigan’s new 8th District, which includes Flint and the Tri Cities.” [Detroit News, 8/25/22]

In 2024, Junge Was Accused of Being a “Trust Fund Millionaire from California.” At a July 2024 campaign rally, outgoing U.S. Rep. Dan Kildee endorsed state Sen. Kristen McDonald Rivet to succeed him in 2024. McDonald Rivet spoke to a crowd of union workers at the rally and called “one of her potential Republican opponents in November, Paul Junge of Grand Ledge Township, a ‘trust fund millionaire from California.’” Junge’s campaign spokesperson responded, “Liberal establishment politician Kristen McDonald Rivet will say anything to distract from the fact that Paul Junge is the only candidate in this race who will stand with President Trump to stop illegal immigration and fight for the people instead of left-wing special interests.” [Detroit News, 7/3/24]

Junge Moved to Grand Blanc in 2022 to Run for Congress. The Detroit Free Press reported during Junge’s 2022 campaign for Michigan’s 8th congressional district that “he moved to Grand Blanc [that] year, to run” for Congress. [Detroit Free Press, 10/25/22]

- **Junge Struggled to Explain Why He Was Running to Represent Michigan in Congress in 2022.** In October 2022, during his congressional campaign, Junge was a guest on a WSGW radio show. The host said that Junge had been accused in campaign ads of being a carpetbagger who returned to Michigan to run for office. When asked why he moved back to Michigan and decided to run for Michigan’s 8th district, Junge responded, “Well, I mean, I, I, ah, I, I, look, I live here in Michigan and it’s interesting to be accused of not being from Michigan. Just as an example, my uncle delivered babies in Midland and Bay Countries for four years, I have cousins that went to high school. You know, so I’ve been in Midland, I’ve been here in this district. These are tags that Dan ... because what voters care about is the cost of living issues and the concerns about crime and our open southern border, so when Dan Kildee is attacking me as not being sufficiently a Michigander, it’s because he doesn’t have answers to those questions.” [[WSGW](https://www.wsgw.com), 10/19/22, 53:07]
- **Kildee Painted Junge as an Extreme Anti-Abortion Republican and Highlighted His Decades Living Outside of Michigan.** The Flint Journal reported in November 2022 after the Associated Press called the race for Michigan’s 8th

congressional district for Democratic incumbent Dan Kildee, “Junge mounted an aggressive campaign against the incumbent but was out-spent by more than a 2-to-1 margin by Kildee, whose campaign reported having spent more than \$5 million as of Oct. 19 compared to \$2.4 million by Junge. ... Kildee’s campaign focused on his long ties to the community and his ability to break with his own party when necessary, his campaign portrayed Junge as extreme on the issue of abortion rights and highlighted his having spent decades living outside Michigan. Although Junge took a lead in the ballot counting Tuesday, the AP projected Kildee had accumulated a safe margin of victory as the counting resumed and continued Wednesday morning.” [Flint Journal, 11/10/22; Detroit News, 11/9/22]

Junge spent at least 23 years in California on an off and has also lived around the country, holding about a dozen jobs since graduating from the University of California, Berkeley, and the University of San Diego Law School. He was born in Ann Arbor and grew up primarily in California. He moved to Grand Blanc Township” in early 2022 to run for Michigan’s 8th congressional district against Rep. Kildee. - **Kildee Pointed Out in 2022 That Junge Had Never Lived in the 8th District and Used His Personal Fortune to Finance His Campaign.** Kildee’s 2022 congressional campaign “sought to portray Junge as a millionaire who grew up out-of-state and has shopped around for a district to run in. Junge donated \$1 million of his personal fortune to his campaign and loaned it another \$1.1 million, according to recent financial disclosures. ‘It’s a choice between me, somebody who was born and raised, lived here my whole life, and knows this community,’ Kildee [said at a campaign rally]. ‘And someone who literally believes that being a trust fund millionaire from somewhere else qualifies you to just parachute into any congressional district in the country.’ Junge was born in Ann Arbor, but grew up in California and has never lived in the 8th Congressional District. ... Junge, who once worked as a TV anchor in Lansing, has brushed off Kildee’s attack about the longevity of his Michigan residency, calling himself a ‘fifth-generation Michigander.’ ‘I don’t think that’s terribly relevant to voters,’ Junge ... said. ‘They care about what’s going on in their lives and that’s what I’m going to talk about.’” [Detroit News, 11/7/22]

- **In 2022, Rep. Kildee Released an Ad Which Painted Junge as an “Outsider Interested in Tax Cuts for Millionaires Like Himself.”** During his 2022 congressional campaign, Junge was criticized by his Democratic opponent Rep. Dan Kildee, who released an ad painting Junge as “a Michigan outsider interested in tax cuts for millionaires like himself.” [Hotline, 9/8/22]

Junge Was Criticized in 2020 By His Republican Primary Opponents for Touting His Fundraising Totals Despite Receiving the Majority from Himself and His Family; His Opponents Also Pointed Out His Sporadic History of

Living in Michigan. During a February 2020 forum between the five Republican candidates running to take on Rep. Elissa Slotkin to represent Michigan’s 8th congressional district, Junge said that he was “the only candidate up on this dais with the financial resources to answer the attacks to help us win this seat back.” The Lansing City Pulse reported about the candidate forum, “[Junge’s] proclamation during yesterday’s nearly two-hour forum put a target on his back. Real estate agent Mike Detmer called out Junge for being a sporadic resident of the 8th congressional district. He also said whoever wins the primary will have money coming in from local, state and national Republican interests. ‘But to say, ‘I’m the best candidate for the job because I raised \$275,000 when \$150,000 of that is his own money and the rest was frontloaded from family, friends and business associates in California?’ Detmer said. ‘You don’t own a home. You don’t have a business. You don’t work here. You don’t live here. You don’t live here. It’s absurd.’ The line got the loudest applause of the night from the decidedly pro-Detmer crowd. Attorney Kristina Lyke got the final jab of the night when she said, ‘I didn’t move here to run for this race. I am your neighbor. I built my business here and I’m dedicated to this district.’” [Lansing City Pulse, 2/21/20]

Junge’s Campaigns Have Been Largely Financed by Himself and His Family

As of July 2024, 62 Percent of Junge’s Campaign Contributions and Loans Came From Himself and His Family. According to federal campaign finance records as of July 2024, Junge’s campaign had received \$2,133,222.97 in donations and loans. Junge Invested His Millions in Out-of-State and Foreign Businesses, Including Chinese Interests

Junge’s Primary Opponent Painted Him as a Trust Fund Millionaire Who Invested in China Instead of Michigan. In 2024, one of Junge’s primary opponents, Mary Draves, released a campaign ad which stated, “Narrator: Paul Junge promises. Junge: to bring back American jobs. ... But the Longest Job Junge Held Was for His Father's Company, Which Paid \$100,000 to Settle Racial Discrimination Lawsuit

Junge Worked for His Family's Company Maintaining Military Housing from 1995 Until 2000. According to his LinkedIn, from June 1995 until June 2000, Junge worked for his family's business, All Star Maintenance, Inc. Junge served as a business development and division manager for the company, which maintained military housing around the country. [Paul J., [LinkedIn](#), accessed 7/18/24]

In 2002, Junge's Family Business Agreed to Pay \$100,000 to Settle a Lawsuit in Which Three Former Employees of the Company Alleged They Were Fired After Complaining About Being Called Racial Slurs. The Lansing City Pulse reported in September 2020, "The old family maintenance business of 8th Congressional candidate Paul Junge paid out \$100,000 to three former workers who claimed they were insulted with numerous racial slurs at the workplace and were fired when they complained about it, according to court records. The revelation comes as Junge has made one of his calling cards during the campaign how his family business created 'hundreds of jobs.' Junge was the business development and division manager at All Star Maintenance in San Diego, Calif., his father's business from 1995-2000, and is not mentioned directly in the suit involving three former employees, Warren McCowan, Johnny Luna and Steve Guerrero. The suit in U.S. District Court in New Mexico was concluded in 2002 after Junge had left the business to pursue a career in TV journalism. However, back in 1998, All Star Maintenance was hired to pain residences at White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico. McCowan, Luna and Guerrero, all of Hispanic heritage but who lived in New Mexico, claimed they were fired for complaining about the discrimination they endured while working in the hostile environment. They claimed they were 'repeatedly' referred to by one All Star Maintenance carpenter as 'sp*cs,' 'stupid fucking Mexicans,' 'burrito eating mother fuckers,' and 'south-of-the-border friends.' Another All Star employee on the job site referred to an African American colleague as a 'stupid (n-word).' Others testified that they, too, heard the offensive language. Although the All Star employee handbook from 1996 calls for a racial harassment-free workplace, the field manager conceded in court that he didn't do enough to spot the offensive comments. Instead, when McCowan, Luna and Guerrero complained, he fired them, according to court records. As a result, the court in 2002 ordered that all three be paid \$15,000 for enduring the hostile work environment and \$20,000 each for being fired for complaining. All Star later paid out another \$100,000 to cover the former employees' attorney fees." [[Lansing City Pulse](#), 9/3/20]

- **The Plaintiffs Said They "Felt Enough Racism to Last a Lifetime" While Working for All Star Maintenance, Including from One Coworker Who "Sported an Aryan Nation Tattoo."** Records from the plaintiff's case against All Star Maintenance stated that Joe Hernandez "kept a log of the comments and incidents which Plaintiffs included in the record." One All Star Maintenance employee, who "sporting an Aryan Nation tattoo," "acknowledged he called an African American employee, David Stukes, a 'ni**er.'" The plaintiffs "uniformly stated everyone knew of the verbal abuse, noting that while some of the language was generic cursing, much had ethnic and racial overtones." One of the plaintiffs stated that on one occasion he heard two coworkers "making racially derogatory comments," including "stupid fucking Mexican" and "burrito-eating motherfucker." The plaintiff "stated that although he loved working with his hands, he dreaded the day's racism ahead of him, [saying,] 'Even though this job lasted only three weeks, I felt enough racism to last me a lifetime.'" - **The Employee with the Aryan Nation Tattoo Told Plaintiffs He Got the Tattoo After "Killing a Black Man" and Stabbing a Latino Man in Prison.** Court records from the case against All Star Maintenance stated in part, "During plaintiffs' employment, they were subjected to numerous instances of racial harassment by Defendant's Anglo supervisors, particularly Steve Switzer and Tracy Gorman, such as: ... Steve Switzer told people he had an

Aryan Nation tattoo. ... Steve Switzer told Joe Hernandez that he had gotten his Aryan Nation tattoo after killing a black man and knifing a 'sp*c' in prison. Steve Switzer's statements regarding his Aryan Nation association made Joe Hernandez believe that Steve Switzer was a dangerous person to Mexican-Americans." [McCowan, et al v. All Star Maintenance, et al., United States District Court for the District of New Mexico, NO. 1:1998cv00581, Filed 5/15/98]

- **The Judge Ruled That the Plaintiff's Allegations of Being Wrongfully Terminated After Complaining About Racial Discrimination Were "Indisputable;" All Star Maintenance Was Held Liable for Failing to Remedy its Hostile Work Environment and Wrongful Termination of Plaintiffs.** The judge's judgement in the case against All Star Maintenance read in part, "That the work [on White Sands Missile Range in New Mexico] was performed by subcontractors and not employees of All Star is immaterial for purposes of Plaintiffs' prima facie burden. Accordingly it is undisputable that Plaintiffs satisfied their prima facie burden as to their wrongful termination claims." Court records further read, "Defendants were found liable to Plaintiffs Warren N. McCowan, Johnny P. Luna and Steve Guerrero for Defendants' failure to address the hostile work environment at All Star's project at White Sands Missile Range and for the retaliatory discharge of Plaintiffs." [McCowan, et al v. All Star Maintenance, et al., United States District Court for the District of New Mexico, NO. 1:1998cv00581, Filed 5/15/98]

The Case Against All Star Maintenance Was Appealed Twice; Both Times the Appellees Filed to Dismiss the Case. Federal court records show that the discrimination and wrongful termination suit against All Star Maintenance was appealed twice, once in 2000 and again in 2002. Both times, the appellees filed to dismiss the case and the appeals were "procedurally terminated without judicial action." [McCowan, et al v. All Star Maintenance, et al, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, No. 0:2000cv02040, Filed 2/11/00; McCowan, et al v. All Star Maintenance, et al, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit, No. 0:2002cv02166, Filed 6/26/02]

Junge's Campaign Said He Had "No Knowledge of the Court Case Until the Reporter Brought it to His Attention." In response to questions about the Lansing City Pulse's reporting on the lawsuit, Junge's campaign spokesperson said, "Paul had no knowledge of this incident, or even the court case until a reporter brought it to his [attention]. Paul opposes racial discrimination of any kind, and believes we must come together as a nation to confront not only bigotry and hate, but also the violent riots that have perverted the cause of equality." The Lansing City Pulse noted, "however, it [was] Junge who brought up his family's prolific job-creating record in [a] debate. In fact, Junge's first TV advertisement [led] with [his family business]. 'I'm Paul Junge. I served as a prosecutor and helping build my family's business, creating jobs,' [were] the first words Junge says in the ad." [[Lansing City Pulse](#), 9/3/20]

As a Prosecutor, Junge Mishandled a Domestic Violence Case, Resulting in a Mistrial

Junge Worked as a Deputy District Attorney in California For One Year. Junge "has a background working as a deputy district attorney in California." [Detroit Free Press, 11/18/23]

- **The Judge in the Case Called Junge's Actions "Highly Inappropriate;" Junge Was Removed from the Case By the Deputy District Attorney.** The Los Angeles Times reported about the case in November 1994, "A prosecutor who barged into a defense attorney's office to subpoena a witness did not behave so badly that criminal charges should be dismissed against the defendant, a Municipal Court judge ruled Tuesday. Although he found that the actions of Deputy Dist. Atty. Paul Junge were 'highly inappropriate,' Judge Edward F. Brodie ruled that the defense was not harmed by the prosecutor's conduct. 'I cannot conclude that this is outrageous conduct,' Brodie said. The judge's ruling means that Mitchell Blair, 38, of Oxnard, must stand trial on a misdemeanor spousal battery charge. The case is scheduled to return to court today for assignment to trial. Blair's case was in trial last month when Junge saw Blair's wife, the alleged victim in the case, enter a conference room in the public defender's office, according to court records. Moments later, he and a district attorney's investigator entered the room without knocking and gave the woman a subpoena, Brodie said. The judge declared a mistrial when he learned what happened, and Assistant Dist. Atty. Kevin J. McGee apologized to the public defender's office. ... Deputy Dist. Atty. Kevin J. De Noce, who said Junge has been removed from the case, argued against dismissal of the charge. He said Junge's actions were improper, but dismissal was too severe a sanction." Additional Key Issues

Civil Rights

In 2020, Junge Called the Black Lives Matter Movement “A Marxist Organization.” In a 2020 debate with Rep. Elissa Slotkin during his campaign for Michigan’s 8th congressional district, the debate moderator “asked Junge what he [thought] about the Black Lives Matter movement and whether he [viewed] it as an extremist movement. Junge said the life of every Black person matter[ed], but he [saw] BLM as a Marxist organization specifically focused on issues concerning law enforcement. He said he supports police reforms and a police reform bill proposed by Sen. Tim Scott, a South Carolina Republican, which Senate Democrats batted down.” [Lansing State Journal, 10/9/20]

Economy

In 2021, Junge Said He Opposed Trump’s Proposal to Eliminate the Payroll Tax. During a January 2021 debate against Rep. Elissa Slotkin, Junge said, “I was asked earlier tonight would there be instances where I would disagree with President Trump and to the extent that the characterization of, of the looking at the payroll tax is that the president suggested abolishing it that would be a place I would disagree with the president. As Congresswoman Slotkin said, this is an earned benefit, this is something they’ve come, they’ve been paying into the system. They’ve earned it, they deserve it, they’re relying on it. We absolutely have to preserve and strengthen both social security and Medicare and one of the central ways we do that is through the payroll tax. Whether suspending it briefly in a difficult economic time or not, you know, we could be open to that because we could talk about could the general revenue fill into that hole, but as a permanent solution, unless I saw a program that was going to provide that revenue, it seems like a non-starter to me.” [WNL 6 News, 1/5/21, 36:24]

In 2021, Junge Said He Supported “Increasing Tax Revenue.” During a January 2021 debate against Democratic Rep. Elissa Slotkin, Junge was asked about his ideas to address the increasing national debt. Junge said the national debt had ballooned during the Obama and Trump administrations and in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, saying that although financial support to residents during the national emergency was appropriate, “we will still have to find ways that, to limit the growth cause at, there is some point where it just gets too much. Interest rates will rise again if our debt continues to grow. It will drown out our ability to have any programs if we don’t keep that in check. It will require looking at growing the economy so we can increase tax revenue. It will require that we look for spending cuts when we can find them.” [WNL 6 News, 1/5/21, 32:20]

Education

In 2024, Junge Said He Would Eliminate NPR and Scale Back Department of Education Funding to Reduce the National Debt. When asked by an attendee at a Bay City meet and greet event in July 2024 what he would do to reduce the national debt if elected, Junge said in part, “Over the last 30 years, we’ve been piling on the debt, we’re now at the point where the interest payments on that debt is going to be the single biggest expense in the federal government. That has to be a priority. There are undoubtedly things we should eliminate – NPR, pair back the defense or rather the department of education spending. Spending for schools comes from the school districts and the state. All the federal bureaucracy is doing is laying on regulation and paying people in DC.” [Paul Junge, Bay City Meet & Greet, 7/11/24] (VIDEO)

Election & Government Reform

In 2022, Junge Supported Strong Voter ID Requirements. When asked during his 2022 congressional campaign what federal policies he supported regarding elections, campaign funding and voting rights, Junge said, “A photo ID should be required to vote, there needs to be strong signature verification for absentee ballots, and partisan balance among election observers is important. Voting is a fundamental right and the election process should be fair, secure, and efficient. The federal government should not be able to ban states from requiring a photo ID to vote or prevent other common sense security efforts.” [Flint Journal, 10/20/22]

Foreign Policy

In 2022, Junge Said America’s European Allies Needed to Increase Their Financial and Military Support for Ukraine Instead of Relying on the U.S. During a 2022 debate between Junge and Democratic U.S. Rep Dan Kildee, “Both men expressed their support for Ukraine, but said their support stops short of putting U.S. military boots on the ground. Noting 75% of support for Ukraine comes from the United States while the second-largest support from the United Kingdom represents only 5%, Junge commented: ‘We need to continue to encourage our European allies to do what they can and not totally rely on American largesse and American power, but to be part of that battle to stand up for freedom.’” [Newstex Blogs, 10/18/22]

In 2022, Junge Blamed the Biden Administration’s “Withdrawal in Europe and Unnecessary Approval of the Nord Stream 2 Pipeline” for Encouraging Putin’s Invasion of Ukraine. During his 2022 congressional campaign, Junge was asked about the U.S.’s response to the invasion of Ukraine. Junge responded, “Vladimir Putin’s regime started this war and created the worst destruction in Europe since World War II. Biden’s disastrous withdrawal in Europe and unnecessary approval of the Nord Stream 2 pipeline were two signals that no doubt encouraged Putin to take the aggressive action he took. The United States does not want to become involved militarily but we can and should support Ukraine and encourage our European allies to do the same. ... Approval of the Nord Stream 2 pipeline by the Biden Administration was a mistake. Sanctions against Russia in response to the invasion of Ukraine are appropriate and we should continue to use diplomatic efforts to end the conflict.” [Midland Daily News, 10/12/22]

Junge Named “Standing Up to China” and Bringing Critical Supply Chains Back to the U.S. a Top Priority in 2020. During his 2020 congressional campaign, Junge listed “standing up to China” as one of his campaign’s three top messages. Junge wrote, “Stand up to China by removing critical supply chains, particularly for pharmaceuticals, and bringing those jobs back to Michigan.” [Ballotpedia.org, accessed 7/18/24]

Junge Said in 2020 That China Was the U.S.’s Greatest Threat Over the Next Decade. On a 2020 candidate questionnaire, Junge was asked what he perceived “to be the United States’ greatest challenge as a nation over the next decade.” He responded, “China is the greatest threat to the United States, as both an economic and national security adversary. China’s goal is to be the most influential nation in all aspects of life, and the international order. We must stop China from stealing U.S. intellectual property and reduce our dependence on supply chains in their country.” [Ballotpedia.org, accessed 7/18/24]

Health Care

In 2020, Junge Said That a Government-Run Health Care System Would Lead to “Rationing and Delayed Care.” On Ballotpedia’s 2020 candidate questionnaire, Junge was asked how the U.S. should address its health care issue. He responded in part, “A government-run approach will lead to rationing and delayed care. The key to healthcare is a patient-centered approach that focuses on the doctor-patient relationship.” [Ballotpedia.org, accessed 7/18/24]

Immigration

Junge Criticized Biden’s Handling of Immigration and Border Security Issues and Vowed to Support Trump’s Immigration Agenda if Elected, Including Mass Deportations. At a July 2024 meet and greet event in Bay City, Michigan, Junge discussed his work in the Trump administration and the issue of immigration, saying, “I’m proud to have served in the Trump administration, in the Department of Homeland Security on border and immigration issues. ... The main thing you need to secure the border is a president dedicated to that job. Joe Biden is a liar. He told you for 3 years there’s no problem at the border. Then he spent 4 months, I guess between 10 AM and 4 PM, he came up and said actually it is a problem, and it’s all the Republicans fault. I need a bunch of money and legislation. Not true either. Finally a few weeks ago, Biden said I think I can do some things. His solution is completely incompetent and not going to solve the problem. When we elect Trump, we’ll have a leader determined to secure the border. If you send me to DC, I’ll be part of a Republican majority that’ll do whatever he needs. We’ll deport the over 12 million people here illegally, prioritize the criminals, gangsters, and violent offenders.” [Paul Junge, Bay City Meet & Greet , 7/11/24] (VIDEO)

In 2024, Junge Said Asylum Seekers Should Remain in Mexico While Awaiting a Hearing. The Detroit Free Press reported in June 2024, “[Junge] has familiarity with issues at the southern border and believes requiring asylum seekers to remain in Mexico while awaiting hearings would ease many of the problems that come with mass migration into the U.S. ‘A lot of what becomes illegal immigration is people who seek asylum,’ Junge told the Free Press Editorial Board. ‘But once people get an asylum hearing ... the problem is if the hearing isn’t set up for two years or five years later, if they’ve come into the country, they frequently don’t show up for their hearing, or they get established and it becomes a feeling of ‘Well, this is where I live now.’” Junge’s stance on immigration elides its complexity, the danger asylum seekers face in their home countries, and the value of new residents to a state with declining population.” [Detroit Free Press, 6/23/24]

In 2024, Junge Said Democrats Were “Out of Control” and Criticized the Party’s Handling of Immigration and Border Security Issues for Allowing “Terrorists” into the U.S. While speaking at a local community meeting in Bay City, Michigan in February 2024, Junge said, “Joe Biden and the Democrats’ complete abandoning of our national security, of our border. [Others] talked about people jumping over a fence, or just cross a line that doesn’t have a fence. We’ve seen the video. Out of control. The Democrats don’t care. It’s treason. [With] Homeland Security, I was helping with Trump’s policy of remain in Mexico, and reform of asylum system, which with Biden now, is like a magnet bringing people not just from South and Central America, but China, the Middle East, people who are on the terrorist watch list. Democrats are out of control. Whatever the Democrat who gets nominated on the other side, he or she is gonna pretend they care about these things, that they’re regular folks like us. They’re not. They’re radicalized when they go to DC. Who saw the Ilhan Omar comments? Oh my god. Oh my god. These are folks that should be defending our country, but they’re making it clear ‘no, we’re defending someone else. Our priority is somewhere else in the world, not here with working Americans.’” [Paul Junge, Bay County Republican Party Meeting, 2/1/24] (AUDIO)

In 2020, Junge Said He Wanted to Defend “Our Sovereignty by Banning Sanctuary Cities.” On a candidate questionnaire during his 2020 congressional campaign, Junge was asked to name three key messages of his campaign. In addition to building a strong economy by lowering taxes and reducing regulations and “standing up to China,” Junge listed immigration. He wrote, “Defend our citizens and sovereignty by banning sanctuary cities and securing our border to stop illegal immigration.” [[Ballotpedia.org](https://ballotpedia.org), accessed 7/18/24]

Infrastructure

In 2022, Junge Said He Would Make Infrastructure a Priority and Favored “Free and Open Competition” to Improve Infrastructure. During a Republican candidate forum in July 2022, Junge was asked “Why would you say it takes so long and costs so much to build new infrastructure? What would you do once in office to make construction and maintenance of infrastructure less expensive and both the time?” Junge said, “That’s a very good question about what takes so long to do infrastructure. You’ve been in office for nine and a half years, and infrastructure is in the condition that it’s in, you might think gosh we need somebody who can get things done a little bit better time frame. So we absolutely need someone who won’t just talk about getting things done, but will actually be part of getting things done. When it comes to infrastructure, we absolutely need to speed up permitting. We need to improve the regulatory process. Things I would note that Congressman Moolenaar talked about, and I would forward when elected on November 8, to be part of a Republican majority and working with Congressman Moolenaar to make sure we get some of those reforms put in place so that we can start to see an improvement in infrastructure across this country. We need to have free and open competition for projects, whatever the infrastructure project is, we need to get government that’s so often in the way, we can get them out of the way.” [Paul Junge, Debate, 7/20/22] (VIDEO 9:23)

Israel & Palestine

The Free Press Argued Junge, an “Unconditional” Israel Supporter, Should Work Harder to Understand the “Concerns of Muslims and Arab Americans in the 8th District.” In its June 2024 endorsement announcement of Junge, the Detroit Free Press reported, “Junge, a largely unconditional supporter of Israel, must work harder to understand the concerns of Muslim and Arab Americans in the 8th District, particularly the mounting death toll and ongoing humanitarian crises in Gaza.” [Detroit Free Press, 6/23/24]

Junge Said in 2020 That the U.S. Should Continue “Absolute and Unequivocal” Aid to Israel. Junge was asked by

Jewish Insider in 2020 if the U.S. should continue to send foreign aid to Israel and other countries in the Middle East and what benefits the U.S. drew from maintaining its relationship with Israel. Junge responded, “The U.S. should maintain existing foreign aid to Israel and other Middle East countries. Aid to Israel should be absolute and unequivocal, however, I would support conditioning aid to other countries in eradicating terrorist networks. As a free nation surrounded by authoritarian regimes, Israel is a stabilizing force in the Middle East and one of our most important allies.” [[Jewish Insider](#), 2020]

In 2020, Junge Accused “Some Elements of the Democratic Party” of Embracing Antisemitism and Making Support for Israel a “More Partisan Issue.” On a 2020 candidate questionnaire from Jewish Insider, Junge was asked “Do you believe there is a concerning rise of antisemitism on the [Right or Left], including in your own party? How do you propose to address this issue?” Junge responded, “Unfortunately, some elements of the Democratic party have embraced antisemitism and that party has not done enough to stand against it. One negative effect of this seems to be to make support of the U.S.-Israel relationship a more partisan issue. While there is an increase in white nationalists groups embracing antisemitism, these groups have no basis in conservative ideology or the Republican party. To address the problem of antisemitism it is important to call it out and stand against it. As it affects U.S.-Israel relations it is also important to emphasize Israel’s capacity to bring stability to the Middle East, such as through the recent UAE-Israel peace agreement.” [[Jewish Insider](#), 2020]

Junge Supported a Two-State Solution for Israel and Palestine During His 2020 Campaign. When asked on a candidate questionnaire from Jewish Insider during his 2020 congressional campaign if he thought “a two-state solution [would] facilitate peace between Israel and Palestinians,” Junge answered, “Peace in the region is ultimately dependent on a two-state solution. While the United States can support this effort by ensuring Israel’s right to self-defense and encouraging Arab allies to be supportive, success depends on Israel and Palestine taking direct responsibility for the terms of an agreement. Further, for a two-state solution to work, the Palestinians must make clear that Israel has a right to exist. I strongly agree with the Trump Administration’s plan to map out the borders of a Palestinian state and maintain the status quo regarding control of Jerusalem.” [[Jewish Insider](#), 2020]

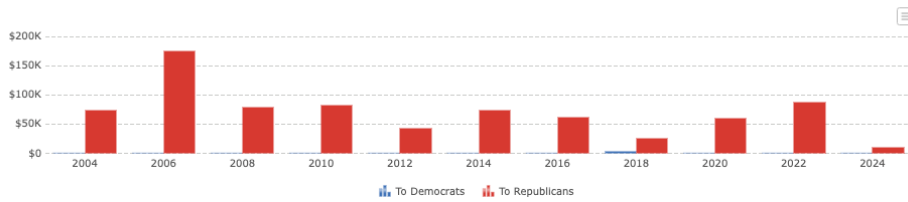
Junge Said He Supported the United States’ Staying Out of the JCPOA. When asked during his 2020 congressional campaign if he would support re-entering the JCPOA if elected and how the U.S. should deal with the Iranian government, Junge said, “I support staying out of the JCPOA. The JCPOA provided too much front-loaded benefits for Iran, with too short a time frame to assure compliance. Further, it failed to provide adequate inspections and did not require Iran to provide a complete declaration of past nuclear activity. I support continuing the Trump Administration’s policy of ‘maximum pressure’ on Iran to deprive the current regime of revenue to use on their military, missile development, nuclear program, and support of terrorist groups and proxies. I further believe U.S. military presence in the Middle East provides a deterrent to hostile regimes in the region.” [[Jewish Insider](#), 2020]

Redistricting

Junge Accused Jocelyn Benson of Violating the Constitution and “Disenfranchising African Americans” Through Redistricting and Called for Her to Resign. In February 2024, Junge spoke at a Bay City, Michigan community meeting and said, “You’ve seen with the federal court by a 3-0 decision said to Jocelyn Benson and the redistricting commission, that you violated the constitution rights of the people of Detroit. You need to draw district. Part of what motivated them no doubt was hey, if we disenfranchise African American voters, we can send more Democrats to Lansing and give us narrow majorities. Now a federal court is insisting they follow the constitution. We may get a better chance getting a few more Republicans in seats. Isn’t this interesting, Benson, she goes right to the U.S. Supreme Court and says, don’t make them do this, it’s too complicated and too hard. For the first time she lifts a finger, even though the constitutional rights of people are being violated, she doesn’t want to be bothered running free and fair elections. Benson should resign. Junge Worked for His Family’s Company Maintaining Military Housing from 1995 Until 2000. According to his LinkedIn, from June 1995 until June 2000, Junge worked for his family’s business, All Star Maintenance, Inc. Junge served as a business development and division manager for the company, which maintained military housing around the country. [Paul J., [LinkedIn](#), accessed 7/18/24]

- **Junge’s Father Sold the Family Company for \$60 Million in 2009; At the Time the Company Reported Annual Revenue of \$127 Million and 1,200 Employees.** Proactive Investors reported in November 2009 that the international security firm G4S had announced the acquisition of All Star International from “John P. Junge and his investment vehicle the Junge Revocable Trust” for \$59.9 million. At the time of the acquisition, All Star International provided “facilities management and base operations support to the US Government agencies including the US Department of Defense, Department of Energy and the General Services Administration. All Star Maintenance Legal Issues

All Star Maintenance Was the Subject of an Accounting Civil Suit in California in 1992. According to San Diego County, California court records, All Star Maintenance, Inc., John P. Junge, and Allen Sweet were the defendants in a 1992 accounting-related civil suit. The suit was filed by Harold S. Taxel in his official trustee capacity. In 1993, All Star Maintenance Was Sued for Breach of Contract in California. San Diego County, California court records show that in May 1993, Dan Homan filed a civil suit against All Star Maintenance, Patriot Maintenance and Stephen Tate alleging breach of contract. In 2003, All Star Maintenance Was the Subject of a Lawsuit Alleging a Breach of Contract, Breach of Fiduciary Duty, Civil Conspiracy and Gross Negligence. In December 2003, Kira, Inc. filed a civil suit against All Star Maintenance, Inc. and Sundt Actus Bland Company (SAB). Kira alleged that in 1998 it had partnered with All Star Maintenance and SAB to form All Star Management, LLC in Nevada "to provide maintenance services for privatized military housing at Ford Hood, Texas and other locations." All Star Maintenance and SAB each had a 45 percent interest in the company while Kira held a 10 percent interest. Kira's lawsuit alleged that in 2001, All Star Maintenance and SAB organized All Star Management-Delaware, which used "the All Star Management name and provide[d] the same services as the company in the same interstate channels of trade." Kira alleged that "as of September 30, 2003, Maintenance and SAB had improperly taken \$1,250,000 in management fees from the company and had used the company's assets to benefit and further their own interests, instead of benefitting and furthering the interests of the company and all of its members. Kira assert[ed] that it never agreed that [All Star] Maintenance and SAB could use the name and the mark 'All Star Management' for purposes unrelated to the company's business. Kira also [asserted] that the company's good will [had] been damaged by Management-Delaware using its name and mark." After confronting All Star Maintenance about its formation of All Star Management Delaware, Kira alleged that All Star Maintenance would not provide it with all relevant information, "did not admit that it had used the company's assets for an improper use, refused to provide Kira with accurate information about the company's capital assets, and would not take any action regarding its allegedly wrongful use of the company's assets." Kira's complaint against SAB and All Star Maintenance alleged "breach of contract, breach of the implied covenant of good faith and fair dealing, breach of fiduciary duty, civil conspiracy, and derivative claims for breach of fiduciary duty, gross negligence, mismanagement, waste of company assets," and additional breaches. In 2006, a U.S. district court judge in Texas granted in part and denied in part the defendant's motion to dismiss the majority of Kira's allegations. The judge recommended dismissal of claims relating to SAB and All Star Maintenance's alleged breaching of the original operating agreement between the three companies but recommended denying the motion to dismiss all other allegations. All Star Maintenance Was Sued for Breach of Contract by American Home Assurance Company in 2003.

According to San Diego County, California court records, All Star Maintenance was the primary defendant in a civil case filed by American Home Assurance Company in May 2003. American Home Assurance Company alleged breach of contract/warranty against All Star Maintenance and six other defendants. The outcome of the case was not immediately available online. All Star Maintenance Was Named in Two Federal Cases. Junge Has Been Rapidly Changing Jobs Over the last 14 Years

From 2011 Until 2014, Junge Served as the Public Policy Director for the Oakland Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce. Junge reported on his LinkedIn serving as the public policy director for the Oakland Metropolitan Chamber of Commerce from February 2011 until January 2014. - While Serving as Policy Director for the Oakland Chamber of Commerce in 2011, Junge Spoke About the Negative Effects of Protest Encampments on the City’s Businesses and Economy.** UPI reported in November 2011, “Owners of some small Oakland, Calif., businesses are urging Occupy protestors [protesting against Wall Street] to pack up and go home, saying the encampments are killing businesses. ‘The impact of the urban encampment has been very negative,’ said Paul Junge, public policy director for the Oakland Chamber of Commerce. ‘We are aware of dozens of small businesses in and around Frank Ogawa Plaza where the tents are, reporting 40 percent to 50 percent losses in the past three or four weeks, including clothing stores, coffee shops, and conference spaces.’ Junge said people are avoiding demonstrators in Oakland, where protestors shut down the port and clashed with police downtown, resulting in more than 100 arrests. Store windows were broken and buildings were spray-painted with graffiti.” Junge said that Oakland was not “the home of big finance,” but it was a liberal city, which made “the situation harder for city leaders.” Junge remarked, “In their anxiousness to show some sympathy to the cause and not be the bad guys, it ends up being a magnet for lots of folks who aren’t from Oakland in creating problems for lots of regular folks just trying to go about their day to day business who really weren’t part of the problem in the first place.” [UPI, 11/10/11; NPR, 11/9/11]
- In 2011, While Working in California, Junge Supported an Oakland Ordinance to Authorize City Officials to Use “Whatever Lawful Tools” They Had to Avoid Protestors Shutting Down the City’s Port.** The San Jose Mercury News reported in December 2011, “Councilman Ignacio De La Fuente said Wednesday he will reintroduce a resolution aimed at averting another protestor-driven port shutdown, one day after his council colleagues chose not to vote on it. ... The resolution directing city leaders ‘to use whatever lawful tools we have’ to keep protestors from shutting down the port had been adopted 4-0 last week in a committee. But the other four members of the eight-member council – chose not to rush ahead with the resolution, which, as an urgency measure, needed six votes just to be considered. ... Police didn’t confront protestors at last week’s demonstration that disrupted the Port of Oakland, resulting in at least \$4 million in lost economic activity, according to estimates from port officials. The council members all said they wanted to prevent further disruptions to the port, but it was unclear how far they would go to block protestors. ... Port of Oakland Executive Director Omar Benjamin and the chamber of commerce’s Paul Junge backed the resolution, warning that repeated protests could hurt the port’s ability to measure up with competitors along the West Coast. ‘You, of course, are the legitimate authority for the people of Oakland,’ Junge told the council. ‘It is absolutely appropriate that you should direct your police chief and city administrator to uphold the laws of Oakland.’” [San Jose Mercury News, 12/22/11]
- As Vice President of the Oakland Chamber of Commerce, Junge Worked to Enhance Public Safety and Organized Candidate Debates During the 2012 Election Cycle.** The Oakland Chamber of Commerce issued a press release in November 2013 which read in part, “Our Vice President and Public Policy Director Paul Junge has submitted his resignation, indicating that he has accepted the position of Vice President with the California Chamber of Commerce. ... In his role [Junge] has been actively overseeing our membership efforts, been our spokesperson on issues affecting business, and convened numerous groups to engage our members. Public Safety has been a priority of the Chamber and Paul has contributed in a major way by hosting meetings with government officials from the U.S. Attorney, District Attorney, Chief of the Oakland Police, our Mayor, and members of the City Council and County

Board of Supervisors. Paul organized and moderated candidate debates during the 2012 election cycle and initiated to Chamber’s annual public opinion poll.” [[Oakland Chamber of Commerce](#), 11/26/13]

In 2014, Junge Served as Vice President of the California Chamber of Commerce. The Oakland Chamber of Commerce announced in November 2013 that Junge had resigned as vice president and public policy director of the organization, “indicating that he [had] accepted the position of Vice President with the California Chamber of Commerce.” As of March 2014, Junge continued to serve as vice president of the California Chamber of Commerce. - **The California Chamber of Commerce Opposed the State’s Creation of its Affordable Care Act Exchange.** Junge worked for the California Chamber of Commerce, which “opposed the bill creating California’s Affordable Care Act exchange.” California was the first state in the U.S. to establish an ACA exchange after the ACA was signed into law by then-President Barack Obama in 2010. In October of 2010, then-California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed two bills into law which established the ACA exchange. The day before Schwarzenegger signed the two bills, the “Chamber of Commerce ran a full-page ad in the Los Angeles Times, urging [him] not to sign the law. ‘The devil’s in the details,’ the ad said. ‘We respectfully ask you to veto AB 1602 and SB 900.’ The ad, also signed by California Taxpayer’s Association and the National Federation of Independent Business, said the bills would levy fees on the cost of the health care exchange that would be passed to patients. - **The California Chamber of Commerce Continued to Oppose a Proposed State-Run Affordable Health Care System in 2024.** In April 2024, the California Chamber of Commerce issued a press release announcing that it was leading a coalition against AB 2200, regarding a state-run public healthcare system. The chamber of commerce argued in its press release that the legislation would increase “taxes [by] at least \$250 billion a year on workers, income, jobs, goods and services.” In a letter it sent to state legislators, “CalChamber explained that AB 2200 [was] woefully incomplete as it [did] not include any funding mechanism to account for the costs needed to implement a state-run health care system (CalCare).” The letter noted that the state’s “general fund [could not] come anywhere close to covering CalCare’s cost, even in surplus years, [and thus that] taxpaying Californians would be required to make up the shortfall.” The chamber’s letter also argued that the legislation could have negative impacts on physicians, writing, “AB 2200 would create a governing board that would set reimbursement rates for providers. If physicians took issue with those government-imposed rates, or if CalCare paid providers below the market average in other states, doctors may be left with little choice but to practice elsewhere. ... Additionally, the CalCare model would negatively impact the physician-patient experience.” [[California Chamber of Commerce](#), 4/18/24]
- **In 2014, as Vice President of the California Chamber of Commerce, Junge Discussed Numerous State Bills the Organization Was Opposing, Calling Them “Job-Killers.”** The Daily Independent reported about the California Chamber of Commerce’s opposition to several state bills. At the time, Junge was vice president of the California Chamber of Commerce. The Daily Independent reported, “Junge said Cal Chamber’s message for certain bills is ‘This bill is bad for the economy in the state of California.’ Junge updated Chamber members and business owners on a few laws the Cal Chamber is engaged in advocating for or against. ‘There are many job-killers that we are working on (against),’ Junge said. He said most of the laws designated as job-killers that might slip onto the governor’s desk appear to be vetoed. ‘The governor tends to veto most of them, and I think that means something,’ Junge said. One of the bills to keep an eye on, he said, is Senate Bill 626, which reintroduces complexities into a workman’s compensation that occurred a few years ago. Another proposed piece of legislation, pitched by San Francisco Assemblyman Ton Ammiano, would seek to instill a ‘split’ property tax bill, which would put commercial real estate under constant reassessment. ... ‘The fear and concern is that it’s too easy to demonize businesses, and suggest that they have the money, so why not drive up the costs of doing business,’ Junge said. On the flip side, there are ‘job-creators’ that Cal Chamber endorses, such as AB 777. The bill, introduced by Torrance Assemblyman Al Muratsuchi, would introduce tax breaks for private space exploration companies like Space X or Virgin Galactic, that are building aircrafts capable of space travel. ... Junge added that the Cal Chamber keeps its eye on every piece of legislation and ballot measure that passes through the pipeline in Sacramento.” [Daily Independent, 3/12/14]

2020

Junge Lost His 2020 Congressional Race Against U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin. After advancing out of the Republican primary, Junge unsuccessfully challenged U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin in the 2020 general election, losing 51 to 47 percent. [Detroit Free Press, 7/15/24]

Junge Ran for Congress in 2020 on a Platform of Lowering Taxes, Easing Regulations, and Improving Public Safety. During his 2020 campaign for Michigan's 8th congressional district, Junge outlined his policy priorities and relevant experience, saying, "This year has been difficult for people across the country, but especially in Michigan. I will use my experience in business to help rebuild our economy and my experience as a prosecutor to support public safety and protect the vulnerable. Liberal efforts to raise taxes, impose job-destroying regulations, and coddle rioters are the wrong approach. I will work hard to rebuild our economy by supporting freedom and opportunity, and I will fight to direct coronavirus relief dollars to nursing homes and struggling families and small businesses, I will protect Social Security and Medicare, support health coverage for those with pre-existing conditions, and defend our Constitution and American values. Together, we will build a better future." [Tri-County Times, 10/9/20]

2022

In 2022, Junge Ran on a Platform of Reducing Illegal Immigration, Inflation, Crime and the Cost of Living. During his 2022 congressional campaign, Junge said about the race, "The top issues are inflation, the cost of living and economic uncertainty, the border, crime, and then abortion maybe comes in third or fourth. And on all of those issues ... the American people, and that includes people in Michigan's 8th district, think that it is a Republican who will do a better job fighting for them than a Democrat. So given the year and the issues, given the new makeup of the district ... I think (those factors) give me an excellent chance." Junge argued "that Democratic spending [had] led to high inflation." [Livingston County Press, 10/26/22]

In 2022, Junge Authored an Op-Ed Naming the Economy, Border Security, Public Safety and Quality Education His Top Priorities. The Midland Daily News published an op-ed authored by Junge in October 2022 which read in part, "Our country is moving in the wrong direction. The high price of goods, a weak economy, a crisis at the border, rising crime and students falling behind are all hurting Michigan families. We deserve so much better than entrenched politicians who say anything to keep power but fail our families, small businesses, and community. I'm running for Congress to move Michigan forward. We need to help family budgets and strengthen our economy immediately. We can stop the rising price of goods by restoring fiscal responsibility to Washington, D.C. We can lower gas and utility prices by increasing American exploration of oil and natural gas, supporting cost-effective renewables and expanding safe pipelines for efficient distribution. We can put more money in families' pockets and encourage job creation by reducing the tax burden. Second, we need to secure the border. Illegal immigration, drugs and criminals are pouring across our southern border. ... Driver's licenses for illegal immigrants and COVID relief checks for illegal immigrants are dangerous and irresponsible. Third, public safety must be a top priority. Law enforcement keeps us safe, so we need to fund and support the police. ... Fourth, political correctness should be kicked out of our classrooms. ... Unfortunately, liberal ideologues are focused on pushing parents aside and advancing radical schemes that ruin high school sports. I will stand with families and teachers dedicated to preparing the next generation. Michigan is a tremendous place with good, hardworking people. Unfortunately, too many politicians love to keep power, money and control in Washington, D.C. rather than empowering families, small businesses, and local communities. I look forward to using my experience in business, as a criminal prosecutor, and at Homeland Security to help hardworking taxpayers, improve our economy and protect law-abiding citizens. Though times are tough, I believe better days are ahead. We must continue to follow the proven policies and principles of expanding freedom, encouraging personal responsibility, and empowering citizens while limiting the reach of Washington, D.C. politicians and bureaucrats." In 2022, a Member of the Genesee County Republican Party Executive Committee Challenged Junge's Nominating Petitions, Alleging a Member of His Campaign Attempted to Buy Signatures from an Opponent's Petition Circulator. In 2022, the Michigan Bureau of Elections reviewed a challenge against Junge's nominating petitions and

ultimately recommended that he be permitted to appear on the primary ballot. “A signature gatherer and member of the Genesee County Republican Party Executive Committee had filed the challenge against Junge in late April, alleging he did not collect enough valid voter signatures to qualify for the ballot and that a contractor for his campaign tried to buy signatures from a petition circulator for a GOP opponent. Junge told The Detroit News at the time that the challenge was ‘frivolous’ and the allegations ‘totally false.’” [Detroit News, 5/24/22]

2024

Junge Announced His 2024 Congressional Run in November 2023. The Detroit Free Press reported in November 2023, “Paul Junge, who last year ran unsuccessfully as a Republican against U.S. Rep. Dan Kildee, D-Flint Township, said Friday he is back in the race again in Michigan’s 8th congressional district following Kildee’s announcement he won’t run for a seventh term. ... Junge, who lives in Grand Blanc, lost to Kildee 53%-43% in last year’s election, but the district is considered a tossup without Kildee, whose family has represented the Flint area in Congress since 1977. Junge ran unsuccessfully against U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin, D-Lansing, in a neighboring district in 2020. ... ‘I’m running for Congress to take on the big-spending and job-destroying Washington D.C. establishment, secure the border and aggressively increase American energy production,’ Junge said. ‘While liberal politicians are focused on hoarding more power in Washington D.C. and imposing political correctness, my focus will be on empowering the American people to support their family and community.’” [Detroit Free Press, 11/18/23]

- **Junge Was Endorsed by Detroit News in the 2024 Republican Primary.** Detroit News reported in July 2024, “Paul Junge of Grand Blanc is making his second bid for this congressional seat; he lost to Dan Kildee by 10 percentage points in 2022. He has a varied resume that includes working in the Trump administration on immigration affairs, running a family business providing housing for military personnel and serving as a television news anchor. He is a practical conservative who supports aid to Israel and finding solutions to the Social Security and Medicare crises. Paul Junge gets our endorsement in the Republican primary.” [Detroit News, 7/9/24]

Junge is hoping to give right-leaning swaths of the district conservative representation for the first time in years. His beliefs are in line with the mainstream Republicans of his district. ... He has familiarity with issues at the southern border and believes requiring asylum seekers to remain in Mexico while awaiting hearings would ease many of the problems that come with mass migration into the U.S. ... Junge also advocates curbing government spending as a means of easing inflation. ‘With \$34 trillion in federal debt, the interest payments on that are going to begin to crowd out everything else in the federal budget,’ he said. ‘We’re going to have to control federal spending. We’re going to have to do things to encourage a free-market system to adjust its price levels, continue, hopefully on a pretty strong employment grounding and get the price levels back in place so we don’t have continued inflationary pressures.’ He does not dispute the results of the 2020 presidential election, and says he would defend voters in any instance where there was an effort to undermine an election, a marked departure from the president in whose administration he served.” [Detroit Free Press, 6/23/24]

In 2024, Junge Said He Was Running to Promote Fair Trade, Lower Taxes, Achieve a Secure Border and Support Israel. During his 2024 congressional campaign, Junge said he was “running to promote ‘fair trade, fewer regulations, lower taxes’ and to stop the flow of illegal drugs and immigrants across the southern border. He [was] also a strong supporter of Israel, saying the U.S. must stand with ‘freedom-loving allies.’” [Detroit Free Press, 7/15/24]

In 2024, Junge Vowed to Reduce Costs, Improve the Economy, Secure the Border and Protect Social Security and Medicare if Elected. “‘Stopping the rising cost of goods and improving the economy for working families is a top priority to my campaign,’ Junge said. ‘Equally as important, I will fight to stop the flow of illegal immigrants and poisonous synthetic opioids across our southern border, which are devastating forgotten communities across our state and across our country. I will also protect Social Security and Medicare and give seniors the support they deserve. Our communities need a strong voice that stands up against liberal Washington elites and puts the interests of Michigan families first.’” [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

In 2024, Junge Said He Would Create More Job Opportunities and Support Small Businesses by Reducing Regulations. Junge was asked in a 2024 Midland Daily News candidate questionnaire how, if elected, he would create more job opportunities and support small businesses in Michigan's 8th congressional district. Junge said, "I will fight to cut outdated red-tape regulations which provide nothing but barriers to entry. A small business shouldn't require a lawyer. We need a simplified tax code, particularly for small businesses, and this will incentivize job creation across the 8th district and the state of Michigan. By fostering a business-friendly environment, we can spur innovation and revive communities like Flint, Saginaw, and Bay City." [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

If Elected in 2024, Junge Said He Would Work to Increase Federal Funding for Transportation Infrastructure Projects in Mid-Michigan. When asked on a 2024 candidate questionnaire how he would address infrastructure needs including roads, public transportation and intercounty transportation if elected, Junge said, "Although I believe in reducing spending, when it comes to our infrastructure in Mid-Michigan, I will fight to bring federal funds into our communities that have been abandoned by Washington liberal elites. Our roads and bridges are the arteries of our Mid-Michigan economy; we need to ensure they are safe, efficient, and capable of supporting future growth from the Great Lakes Bay to the Genesee valley." Junge Voiced His Support for Nuclear Energy in 2024. Junge was asked on a 2024 candidate questionnaire how he planned to "address the environmental impacts of climate change on the Great Lakes and local water bodies" if elected. Junge answered, "I will support the resumption of nuclear power, which will reduce the price of manufacturing, distribution, and create new job opportunities. If the Democrats were actually concerned about CO2 emissions, they would be strongly supporting nuclear energy. Nuclear energy provides a reliable and clean source of power. I'm also supportive of the technology behind UCC clean coal and carbon capture. Additionally, I will advocate for policies that protect our Great Lakes and local water bodies from PFAS." If Elected in 2024, Junge Said He Would Address the Opioid and Mental Health Crises By Securing the Border and Improving Mid-Michigan's Economy. When asked on a 2024 candidate questionnaire how he would "tackle the opioid crises and enhance mental health services" if elected, Junge responded, "We must secure our borders to stop the flow of illegal drugs, crack down on drug trafficking networks, and ensure that those suffering from addiction have access to treatment and mental health services. The opioid and mental health crises are intertwined (and) directly correlated with the direction of the local economy. By supporting policies that will stimulate economic growth in Mid-Michigan, we can provide opportunities and hope for the rust belt." [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

In 2024, Junge Said He Supported the "Remain in Mexico" and "Remain in Canada" Policies. When asked during his 2024 campaign about his views on immigration, "particularly illegal immigration at the northern border," Junge said, "We need to enforce our immigration laws, secure our borders, and ensure that those who enter our country do so legally. This includes strengthening border security at both the southern and northern borders. Illegal immigration undermines our legal system and puts a strain on our courts. I support remain in Mexico, but also support remain in Canada." [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

- **Junge Said That the U.S.'s Guest Worker Program Would Provide a Sufficient Workforce for the Agricultural Sector if Immigration Laws Were Strengthened.** On the same candidate questionnaire, Junge was asked how he would "address the challenges of labor shortages in agriculture, particularly in light of immigration policy, to ensure a stable workforce for farms in the district." Junge replied, "By securing the border and reinstating the Remain in Mexico policy to prevent courts from being flooded with asylum claims, we will have a more efficient legal immigration system. This includes guest worker programs that meet the needs of our agricultural sector. Farmers rely on a stable and reliable workforce to produce the food that fuels our nation. By balancing the needs of the agricultural industry with border security, we can create a system that works for all Americans." [Midland Daily News, 7/3/24]

In Order to Increase Affordable, Accessible Healthcare in Michigan's 8th District, Junge Said He Would Work to Reduce "Government Interference" and Increase Competition. The Midland Daily News in 2024 asked Junge what he would do if elected to address healthcare disparities in Genesee County and increase access to affordable healthcare. Junge replied, "We need to increase competition among healthcare providers, reduce bureaucratic red tape, and promote patient-centered solutions to reduce prices for working families. Junge Said He Supported Lowering Taxes for Middle-Class Families and Small Businesses in 2024. This will put more money in the pockets of hardworking Michiganders and help our local economy thrive. I’m a former criminal prosecutor, helped maintain military housing, and worked on Capitol Hill in Trump’s administration. I ran before and found that interacting with voters and potentially representing them is something I had a passion for.” When asked during the same event what set him apart from other candidates, Junge said, “The background I bring. I’m a former prosecutor, I worked in my family business, worked on Capitol Hill in the Trump administration, so I have the knowledge of how things work in DC that distinguishes me from the Republicans and certainly the Democrats in this race. ... I’ve also been in the race the longest, so I’ve had the most contact with voters. I just had a poll that in the primary shows me winning 56 to 9. Campaign Finances

As of July 2024, Junge Had Received Over \$2 Million in Loans and Approximately \$111,000 in Contributions to His Campaign Committee for Congress. As of June 30, 2024, Junge had raised a total of \$2,133,222.97 in contributions at the federal level to his committee for Congress in Michigan’s 8th District. He received \$107,100 in itemized individual contributions and just over \$4,000 in unitemized individual contributions, according to the Federal Election Commission. Aside from the \$1.3 million in loans Junge provided to his own committee, he also received \$700,000 in additional loans. Junge incurred a total of \$1,226,617 in operating expenditures, leaving him with \$984,004.98 cash on hand as of June 30, 2024. - **As of January 2024, Junge Led All Candidates for Michigan’s 8th Congressional District in Cash on Hand.** Saginaw News reported in April 2024 on the race for Michigan’s 8th congressional district about the five Democrats and three Republicans who had filed statements of candidacy for the district with the FEC. Saginaw News reported that “Junge led the field of candidates in cash reserves as of Jan. 1, reporting \$786,190 in cash on hand.” [Saginaw News, 4/7/24]

In the 2022 Election Cycle, Junge Received Over \$3 Million in Federal Contributions and Loans; More than \$2 Million Came from the Candidate Himself. Between January 2021 and December 2022, Junge received a total of \$3,018,702.52 in contributions at the federal level to his campaign committee for Congress in Michigan’s 8th District. He received \$617,015 in itemized individual contributions, \$39,456 in unitemized individual contributions, \$5,000 from party committees and \$135,365 from “other” committees. Junge also gave and loaned over \$2 million to his own committee. He incurred \$2,928,696.81 in total operating expenditures and had \$92,281.22 of ending cash on hand. - Significant Portions of Junge’s Fundraising in 2022 Came From Republican Organizations and Activists.** The Detroit News reported in November 2022 about Junge’s congressional campaign, “Around two-thirds of Junge’s funding came from Grand Blanc Township Republican’s own coffers – he gave about \$1 million to his campaign and loaned it another \$1.1 million, according to federal disclosures. His top donors included retirees, conservative groups and individuals working for finance firms, real estate companies and law firms, according to an OpenSecrets analysis. That included donations connected to the brokerage firm Taglich Brothers, the DeVos family’s investment firm RDV Corp., AT&T and [Steve] Scalise’s PAC.” [Detroit News, 11/4/22]

In the 2020 Election Cycle, Junge Received Over \$2.1 Million in Federal Contributions and Loans. Junge received \$2,112,467.47 in total contributions to his campaign committee for Congress in Michigan’s 8th District during the 2020 political cycle. He received \$699,135.50 in itemized individual contributions,

\$389,024.26 in unitemized individual contributions and \$299,470 in “other” committee contributions. Junge gave \$23,200 in candidate contributions and \$666,000 in personal loans to his own committee. He incurred a total of \$1,874,010.94 in operational expenditures, leaving him with \$10,477.39 in ending cash on hand. Personal Background

Junge Was Born in Michigan But Raised in California. After he announced his 2024 congressional campaign in November 2023, the Detroit Free Press reported that Junge was born in Ann Arbor and lived there until he was in third grade. “His father moved the family to San Diego in 1974 for a job with Rohr Industries, according to his obituary. He later acquired and operated his own company, All Star Maintenance, that Junge has described as repairing, painting and cleaning military housing.” [Detroit Free Press, 11/18/23]

During His Childhood, Junge Moved to California, Kansas, and Virginia; He Graduated High School in California in 1984. Junge’s 2022 congressional campaign said that after moving to California in the third grade for his father’s work, his family “next moved to Virginia, where Junge attended sixth through ninth grades, and then to Kansas where Junge went to high school through 11th grade. Junge Lived in California in 2018 When His Father Was Ill and Moved Back to Michigan in 2019. “[Junge’s] last stint living in California was when his father was ill in 2018, his campaign said. Following his father’s death in 2019, Junge returned to Michigan and challenged Democratic U.S. Rep. Elissa Slotkin of Holly for her seat in 2020 but lost. A John Paul Junge Was Found Guilty of Driving Under the Influence in Hawaii in 1996; He Was Ordered to Attend Driver’s Ed and His License Was Suspended. According to Hawaii state court records, a John Paul Junge was charged with driving under the influence in Honolulu, Hawaii in February 1996. Junge was arrested and posted \$250 bail. In March 1996, he entered a plea in the case and the same month was found guilty in a bench verdict. Junge was ordered to pay a fine and undergo a driver education assessment and was referred to driver’s ed. Junge’s license was also suspended. In 2007, a John Junge II Was Cited for Speeding in Kansas. DIRECTV alleged that Junge, listed as living in Lake Villa, Illinois, purchased numerous devices in October and November 2000 “designed to intercept and decrypt DIRECTV’s protected satellite

communications, ultimately allowing for the free viewing of television programming.” DIRECTV argued in its complaint that “federal communication and state laws prohibit[ed] the assembly, possession and use of the devices and equipment in question.” DIRECTV sought “damages and injunctive relief against the defendants for the assembly, distribution, possession and use of illegitimate devices primarily designed to gain unauthorized access to its satellite communication signals.” In April 2004, DIRECTV filed a motion to dismiss Junge as a defendant due to a settlement.
