Significant Findings

Days After Staffing Oberacker's 2026 Campaign Launch, Oberacker's Hand-Picked Campaign Manager And Another Oberacker Associate Were Exposed For Sending Racist, Antisemitic, And Hate-Filled Messages In A Young Republicans Group Chat

- ✓ October 14, 2025: Politico exposed Bobby Walker and Peter Giunta for sending extreme, racist, and antisemitic messages in a Young Republicans group chat.
- ✓ October 6, 2025: Close Oberacker associates Bobby Walker and Peter Giunta staffed Oberacker's congressional campaign launch days before Politico revealed their participation in the Young Republicans group chat.
- ✓ Bobby Walker was one of two main participants in the Young Republicans group chat, in which he called rape "epic," freely used homophobic slurs, made Nazi references, disparaged veterans, and wrote "if we ever had a leak of this chat we would be cooked."
- ✓ Oberacker employed Bobby Walker as his 2020 State Senate Campaign Communications Director, and had a long history of praising Walker by name.
- ✓ Oberacker had offered Walker the role of campaign manager on his 2026 congressional race, but said Walker was no longer being brought on due to his participation in the Young Republicans group chat.
- ✓ Giunta created the Young Republicans group chat and was reportedly the most prominent voice in it, in which he wrote "I Love Hitler," called Black people "watermelon people," called an opponent a "fat stinky Jew," and used other extreme and odious language.
- ✓ Oberacker appeared to delete a tweet thanking Giunta and Walker for a NYSYR award, gave Giunta his "wholehearted endorsement" for a board seat on the Young Republican National Federation, and had a long history of praising Giunta by name.
- ✓ August 2025: Oberacker spoke at an NYSYR Dinner which seemingly occurred at the same time Giunta and Walker were reportedly active in the Young Republicans group chat.
- ✓ Walker and Giunta seemed to dodge responsibility for the Young Republican group chat leaks, claiming that messages may have been manipulated.

Oberacker Supported Trump's One Big Beautiful Bill, Which Would Take Away Health Insurance From More Than 36,000 People In NY-19 And Threaten SNAP For More Than 40,000 Households In The District To Fund Tax Cuts For Millionaires Like Himself

- ✓ 2026: Oberacker accepted Trump's endorsement in the race for NY-19.
- ✓ 2025: Oberacker said voting against the One Big Beautiful Bill was a vote "against the American worker" and that Trump had his "unwavering support."
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill enacted the largest cuts to Medicaid in history and would kick more than 36,000 people in NY-19 off their health insurance.

- ✓ 2025: Oberacker supported letting ACA tax credits expire, which could raise monthly premiums on some NY-19 residents on marketplace plans by as much as 181%.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill was projected to slash more than \$33.5 million in revenue to NY-19 area hospitals, and one NY-19 hospital terminated outpatient diabetes services due to federal cuts.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill enacted the largest cut to SNAP in history, threatening food assistance for more than 40,000 households in NY-19.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill gave billions in tax breaks to ultra-wealthy individuals like Oberacker at the expense of working families.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill would increase energy costs for New Yorkers \$170 per year on average.

As A County Representative, Oberacker Supported Budgets That Cut Millions Of Dollars In Funding For County Employees' Health Insurance, The County Medicaid Management System, And Special Education While Approving Less Funding Than Requested For Law Enforcement And Emergency Services

- ✓ Oberacker helped pass the 2018 Otsego County Budget, which cut more than \$1.1 million for county employees' health insurance, cut more than \$10,000 for the county Medicaid management system, and provided less funding than requested for both programs.
- ✓ Oberacker helped pass the 2017 Otsego County Budget, which cut nearly \$150,000 for the county Medicaid management system, cut \$15,000 for social services medical assistance, and provided \$200,000 less than requested for county employee health insurance.
- ✓ 2017-2018: Oberacker helped pass budgets that provided the Otsego County Sheriff's Department \$210,523 less than what was requested.
- ✓ 2017-2018: Oberacker helped pass budgets that cut more than \$14,000 for Otsego County local and emergency planning and approved nearly \$25,000 less than requested.
- ✓ 2017: Oberacker helped pass a budget that cut \$95,000 for children's special needs education and approved funding that was \$100,000 less than requested.
- ✓ 2016-2017: Oberacker joined a unanimous Otsego County Board of Representatives in approving the 2017 and 2018 budgets, including 10 Republicans and 4 Democrats.

Oberacker Was A Threat To Reproductive Freedom, Running On A Party Platform That Supported Banning Abortion With No Exceptions For Rape Or Incest

- ✓ Oberacker Ran on the Conservative party line, which supported repealing New York's law protecting abortion access and reinstating an abortion ban from the 1800s with no exceptions for rape or incest.
- ✓ 2024-2025: Oberacker received near-perfect ratings from the Conservative Party of New York, which awarded higher rankings to legislators who voted against abortion rights.
- ✓ 2021-2022: Oberacker's campaign contributed more than six hundred dollars to the Conservative Party of New York.
- ✓ 2022-2025: Oberacker repeatedly voted against measures to protect reproductive health care providers from criminal charges and against protecting their personal identities on prescriptions for abortion medication.

- ✓ 2023 and 2025: Oberacker voted against funding services to increase access to abortion for New Yorkers across the state.
- ✓ 2023-2024: Oberacker repeatedly voted against providing New Yorkers access to over-the-counter birth control methods.
- ✓ 2023: Oberacker voted against ensuring impacts to reproductive and maternal health care were considered before approval of hospital closures or reductions.
- ✓ April 2023: Oberacker voted against permitting SUNY and CUNY students access to medication abortion prescription drugs.
- ✓ June 2021: Oberacker voted against requiring pregnant inmates to be informed of their right to abortion services.
- ✓ June 2021: Oberacker voted against allowing inmates giving birth to have a support person of their choosing in the delivery room.

One Of New York State Legislature’s “Top Private Earners,” Oberacker Funded His Campaigns Via Six-Figure Personal Loans And Contributions From His Own Business, And Voted To Protect His Outside Income After Voting To Lay Off County Workers

- ✓ 2025: Oberacker had an estimated net worth of up to nearly \$1.5 million.
- ✓ 2023: New York State Focus identified Oberacker as one of the “top private earners” in the New York Legislature and Oberacker reported earning a salary of up to \$250,000 from Formtech Solutions Inc.
- ✓ As of July 2026, Oberacker had personally loaned his Congressional campaign \$130,000.
- ✓ 2020-2025: Oberacker personally loaned his State Senate Campaigns more than half a million dollars.
- ✓ 2020-2023: Oberacker’s business, Formtech Solutions, contributed \$20,000 to his State Senate campaigns.
- ✓ 2020: Oberacker voted to lay off dozens of Otsego County Workers and called it the “right thing,” then a month later voted against a slight reduction in spending on the county’s marketing company, which would have saved at least one layoff’s worth of funds.
- ✓ 2022: Oberacker voted against a bill capping outside income for state legislators that would impact the legislature’s top private earners, including Oberacker.

Oberacker Lied About Being Born In Upstate New York And Appeared To Make Inconsistent Comments About His Business, Which May Have Operated In Texas Even After Oberacker Said He Moved It To New York

- ✓ Oberacker claimed he was “born and raised” in Upstate New York, but he was born on Long Island, Which his campaign did not deny, but refused to acknowledge as a discrepancy.
- ✓ Oberacker appeared to give inconsistent descriptions of his business background, saying he built a multi-million dollar business operating on a global scale, then later claiming to be a “small business owner.”
- ✓ Oberacker repeatedly congratulated himself for moving his company’s headquarters from Texas to New York and argued companies should be rewarded for staying in New York.

- ✓ Formtech Solutions imported chemicals from China using a business address in Texas a year after Oberacker said he moved his business to New York.

Oberacker Supported Trump's One Big Beautiful Bill, Which Expanded Tax Benefits And Contained Significant Tax Reductions With Retroactive Refunds And Handouts For The Beverage Industry That Would Benefit Oberacker As A Winery Owner

- ✓ 2025: Oberacker said voting against the One Big Beautiful Bill was a vote “against the American worker” and said Trump had his “unwavering support.”
- ✓ Oberacker was the founder and co-owner of a winery property in Schenectady, New York.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill extended and made permanent a tax benefit to allow business owners to deduct 20% of their business income on their personal tax returns, including the bulk of the beverage industry.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill increased the estate tax exemption threshold and made it permanent, allowing higher-priced estates, including wineries and vineyards, to avoid taxes on transfer of ownership.
- ✓ The One Big Beautiful Bill allowed businesses, even retroactively, to depreciate Research and Experimentation (R&E) expenditures over one fiscal year rather than five, a benefit to wineries who paid more under the previous rule.

They referred to Black people as monkeys and ‘the watermelon people’ and joked about putting their political opponents in gas chambers. They talked about raping their enemies and driving them to suicide and lauded Republicans who they believed support slavery. Reached by e-mail Thursday night for comment about Walker and Giunta's attendance and involvement, an Oberacker campaign spokesperson told AllOtsego, without sharing their name, that the campaign 'cut ties with Mr. Walker once the horrific and disgusting text messages came to our attention.' The spokesperson wrote Walker 'was never on this campaign's payroll and was only a volunteer' and called for 'all those involved in the group chat' to 'immediately resign any positions held in the GOP. We must all condemn hateful and racist rhetoric in any form.' This appears to be the campaign's first reported call for those involved to resign. 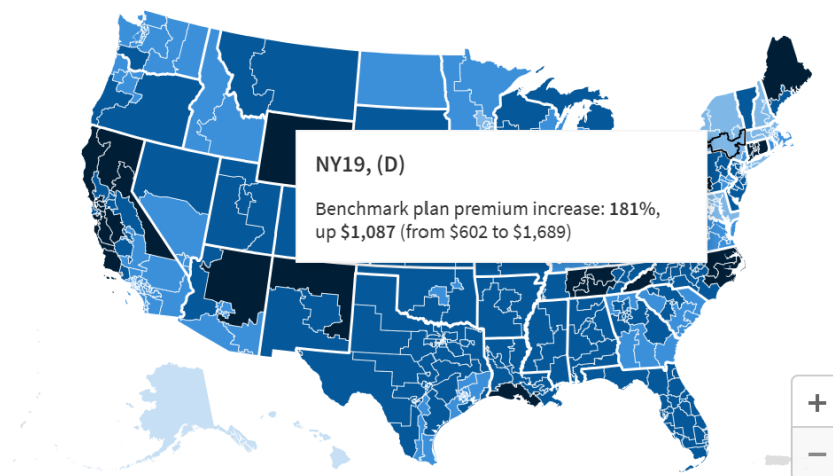
