



219 Republicans Voted For HR 26. In January 2023, 219 Republicans voted for: "Passage of the bill that would require health care practitioners to provide the same care to a child that is 'born alive' after an abortion or attempted abortion as they would for a child born at the same gestational age and to ensure the child is immediately transported and admitted to a hospital; require hospital and clinic practitioners and employees to report any knowledge of failures to provide such care; and impose criminal fines and penalties for failures to meet these requirements. It would state that a child born alive under these conditions is a legal person under U.S. law, entitled to the protections of U.S. law, and it would specifically make any act that kills or attempts to kill such a child punishable as murder or attempted murder. The bill would also prohibit the prosecution of the mother of a child born alive after an abortion or attempted abortion and permit such mothers to seek relief through civil action against any person who violates the bill's requirements, including monetary and punitive damages." 

# The Yukon Is Shut Down For Subsistence Fishing And Rural Communities Are Getting Less Than 1% Of The Total Yield

The Yukon River Was Shut Down To Subsistence Harvesters For A Full Seven-Year Life Cycle OF King Salmon. "The agreement contains a weighty request: that all Yukon River subsistence harvesters cease fishing for a full seven-year life cycle of king salmon, also called chinook." [Alaska Public Media, 3/19/24]

Chinook Salmon Returned To The Upper Yukon At A Rate Of .94. "We can use these data in sophisticated statistical models to estimate the number of Chinook salmon that would have returned to their natal rivers after accounting for marine mortality. This allows us to quantify the direct impact bycatch has on Chinook salmon runs. This impact rate is the number of Chinook salmon caught as bycatch that we calculate would have returned to spawn divided by the total run sizes to a given area. In 2020, the impact rate to the western Alaska stock group was estimated as 3.4 percent and the impact rate to the upper Yukon was estimated as 0.94 percent." [NOAA, 8/23/22]

The Upper Yukon Was A Largely Rural Area Settled By Over 70% Alaska Natives. "Located in Alaska's Interior, the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area stretches across more than 157,121 square miles from the Canadian border to the lower Yukon River. The Yukon River roughly bisects the area, flowing nearly 1,100 miles through it in a southwesterly direction. Only 8,478 people reside in the area, over 70% of them Alaska Natives." Alaska's Trawler Bycatch Included Hundreds Of Thousands Of Chum Salmon And Tens Of Thousands Of King Salmon Annually, Killing Fish. "Bycatch occurs in every fishery that targets a specific species, but while seeking pollock and cod in a billion-dollar industry, Alaska's trawlers inadvertently catch tens of thousands of king salmon and hundreds of thousands of chum salmon in their nets each year, according to observations by the National Marine Fisheries Service. By law, the salmon must be returned to the ocean, but fish die in the process. The amount of bycatch fluctuates from year to year and has fallen in the recent past, but the sheer numbers of fish caught by trawlers has aroused public ire. A Facebook group calling itself 'Stop Alaskan Trawler Bycatch' now boasts almost 20,000 members, and various groups have called on the North Pacific Fisheries Management Council — which regulates fisheries more than 3 miles off Alaskan shores — to more tightly cap bycatch." 2020: Alaska's Trawler Bycatch Was 26,000 King Salmon – One-Tenth Of The Year's Commercial Harvest. "Alaska's commercial fishermen have been speaking out against big trawlers for years, complaining that the large vessels in federal waters are scooping up mature and juvenile fish. The regional council that manages federal fisheries recently heard from hundreds concerned about the number of salmon and other species that end up as bycatch in trawl nets.[...]Federal fisheries data shows trawlers in the North Pacific took about a tenth of the chinook — or king salmon — caught by Alaska's commercial salmon fleet last year. And those numbers are tracking the same this year. But none of that catch happens on purpose. Preliminary ADF&G data shows about 263,000 kings were commercially harvested last year statewide. As of April 15, bycatch in the Bering Sea and Gulf of Alaska areas for 2021 was around 16,000 fish, over six percent of last year's statewide commercial harvest. Last year's trawler bycatch was 26,000 kings, or about a tenth of the 2020 commercial chinook harvest in-state."


