RE: DCCC Polling Memo: Analytics Poll Confirms Tight Race in NJ-07

In a DCCC Analytics poll of 386 likely 2024 general election voters in New Jersey's 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional District, **Democrat Sue Altman is closing the gap between first-term Republican Congressman Tom Kean, Jr., 48% to 50%.** 

## **TOPLINES**

- The DCCC's survey corroborates the campaign's <u>internal findings</u> from earlier this week. That poll also found the race at -2 in their late September survey.
- Altman's name ID and net favorability have skyrocketed as Kean remains stagnant. Altman is
  now known to 65% of voters with +8 net favorability, an impressive feat for a first-time
  candidate in one of the country's most expensive media markets. She now overperforms a
  generic Democrat by 2 points. While Kean's name ID is as high as one would expect from an
  incumbent, voters view him neutrally on net (40% favorable/38% unfavorable). The
  corruption-busting Democrat's profile has grown despite millions spent in attacks against her.
- The environment is friendly to Democrats in NJ-07. In a Biden 2020 +3.8 district, Vice President Kamala Harris leads Donald Trump by 1 on the presidential ballot (49%/48%) and Congressman Andy Kim leads Curtis Bashaw by 4 in the Senate race (50%/46%). Momentum will continue to favor Altman as atmospherics improve and voters continue to learn about her record fighting for New Jerseyans.

**Methodology**: These results are based on a survey of 386 likely NJ-07 general election voters, conducted from October 8-9, 2024 via live calls to landlines and cells, and text-to-web. The margin of error is +/-5.0% at a 95% confidence interval, with larger margins of error for demographic subgroups.
