AZ Fact Sheet: House Republicans' Cuts to Medicaid & SNAP Put Arizonans At Risk of Losing Access to Health Care and Food

<u>What's Happening</u>: Juan Ciscomani and House Republicans' budget proposal would take health care coverage and food assistance away from millions of working parents, kids, seniors, and people with disabilities by targeting two of Arizona's most critical federally-funded programs - Medicaid and SNAP.

How will House Republicans' cuts to these programs impact Arizonans?

MEDICAID PROVIDES HEALTH COVERAGE TO 1.5 MILLION ARIZONANS

<u>105,000 Medicaid beneficiaries</u> are at risk of losing health care coverage in AZ-06 alone.

Who relies on Medicaid for health coverage in Arizona?

- 36% of all children
- 46% of moms who just gave birth and their newborn babies
- 40% of working-age adults with disabilities
- 53% of people living in nursing homes
- 17% of Medicare beneficiaries
- 17% of adults aged 19-64

Arizonans who manage to keep their Medicaid could still lose health benefits such as:

- Home- and community-based services (HCBS) that allow the elderly and people with disabilities to receive services in their own homes or communities rather than institutional settings.
- Dental services
- Hospice services
- Physical therapy

CUTTING FEDERAL MEDICAID FUNDING WOULD DIRECTLY RAISE COSTS IN AZ

How could health care costs for Arizonans in AZ-06 go up as a result of these cuts?

• Under the Republican budget plan, the 35,000 people who receive coverage under the Affordable Care Act in Rep. Juan Ciscomani's district would see their average premium go up by \$640 per year — a 45% increase.

SNAP PROVIDES FOOD SECURITY FOR 294,000 ARIZONA HOUSEHOLDS

Nearly 30,000 households are at risk of losing SNAP benefits in AZ-06 alone.

How many children, seniors, and people with disabilities rely on SNAP for food and nutrition assistance in Arizona's 6th?

- 36% of AZ-06 households participating in SNAP have a child
- 46% of AZ-06 households participating in SNAP have an elderly person
- 53% of AZ-06 households participating in SNAP have a person with a disability
