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O'Donnell Owned A Home In Summerland, CA Valued Between \$1 And \$5 Million. “Democrats say O'Donnell — a composer known for his work on video games such as ‘Halo’ — spends too much time at a second home in California to be considered a bona fide Nevadan. He calls that an exaggeration, saying he’s spent about three weeks there over the two years he’s owned the property, mostly long weekends with his family and grandchildren. According to O'Donnell’s personal financial disclosure, the property — located in Summerland, Calif. — is valued between \$1 million and \$5 million. This isn’t O'Donnell’s first bid for office — he lost the 2024 Republican primary for the 3rd Congressional District. This time, he won the primary in June, buoyed by an endorsement from President Donald Trump and backing from the National Republican Congressional Committee. 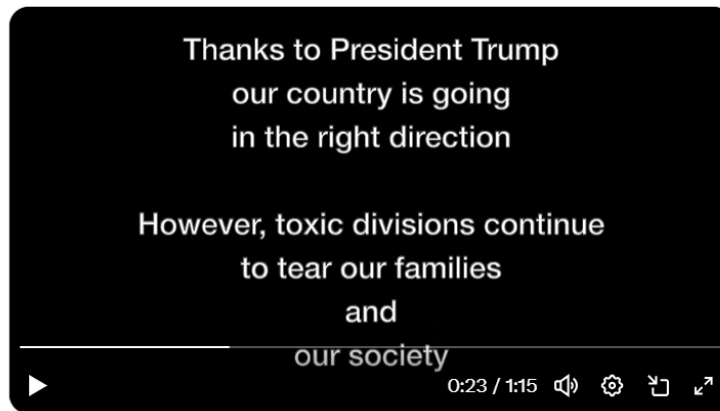

O'Donnell Said He "Fully Support[s]" Trump's Trade Policy. "Marty O'Donnell — the GOP front-runner to face Lee, who has the backing of Trump and the NRCC — was once skeptical of tariffs, but now says he 'fully support(s)' the president's trade policy. 'I'm now a convert, because what I see Donald Trump doing with tariffs is not something I ever anticipated,' O'Donnell said in an interview. 'He uses it as a negotiating tool in a way that I never anticipated, and I actually love what he's doing.' O'Donnell said tariffs aren't at the top of voters' list of concerns. 'I don't hear anybody complaining about tariffs,' he said. 'I just don't think it's an issue. I think there are way, way more important issues.'"

2026: The Joint Economic Committee Estimated That Tariffs Would Cost American Families More Than \$2,500 On Average

Joint Economic Committee Minority: “American Families Will Pay More Than \$2,500 Each In Tariff Costs In 2026.” “Even though the Supreme Court ruled that the bulk of President Trump’s tariff agenda was illegal, the administration moved immediately to enact new tariffs that Treasury Secretary Bessent claims will result in ‘virtually unchanged tariff revenue in 2026’. If Bessent’s estimates hold true, the Joint Economic Committee – Minority estimates that American families will pay more than \$2,500 each in tariff costs in 2026. Building on its previous tariff cost estimates, the Committee combined official data from the U.S. Treasury Department on the amount of tariff revenue collected since the start of 2025 with independent estimates from the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office of the percent of each tariff dollar that is ultimately paid by American consumers. The Committee found that if tariff revenue stays at the level recorded in January 2026 for the rest of the year, American families would in total pay more than \$330 billion in tariff costs in 2026, an average of more than \$2,500 per household in tariff costs this year. This is substantially higher than the more than \$1,700 in average tariff costs that the JEC – Minority previously estimated that families paid during the first year of Trump’s second term.” [Joint Economic Committee Minority, Fact Sheet, [March 2026](#)]

Trump’s Tariffs Contributed To Prices Rising For Groceries. “President Donald Trump pledged to bring down grocery costs. But his administration’s policies are contributing to an acceleration in prices, food economists and companies say. Grocery prices last month rose at their fastest pace in three years, stoked by Trump’s tariffs, a crackdown on immigration, and extreme weather hurting food production.

Prices jumped 0.6% in August from the month prior, according to the latest reading from the Bureau of Labor Statistics, and they are up 2.7% from a year ago. Food prices are deeply personal to consumers, and weekly grocery bills shape their overall perceptions of the economy. More than half of Americans count grocery costs as a major stress in their lives. Low-income and middle-income Americans, hit the hardest by rising grocery costs, are changing where they shop and what they buy. Companies are also taking extreme measures to appeal to shoppers strained by higher prices, such as bringing back paper coupons.” [CNN, [9/20/25](#)]
